NOTE 1: In the event air transport cannot be utilized due to weather conditions, at time scheduled for departure from Tokyo and/or Kyoto, special train will be available to party. Special train will also be available for departure from Tokyo on Wednesday night, 21 June 1950, if required. Running time between Tokyo and Kyoto is approximately 10 hours; i.e. depart Tokyo 0800 (2300), arrive Kyoto 1800 (0900); depart Kyoto 1200, arrive Tokyo 2200.

- a. Camp Fisher: 90th Field Artillery Battalion present on post.

- D. Camp Otsu: 2nd Battalion, 35th Infantry, present on post.

 Remainder of regiment undergoing amphibious training at Camp

 McGill, near Yokosuka. Camp is approximately 9 miles from Kyoto

 and can be reached in about 20 minutes by car.
- c. Osaka: Headquarters 25th Infantry Division and Division troops are located in Osaka. The 27th Infantry Regiment, regularly stationed at Camp Sakai on the outskirts of Osaka, is at present undergoing training in the Fuji Maneuver Area near Gotemba. Osaka is approximately 30 miles from Kyoto and can be reached in about 1 hour and 15 minutes by car.







- 2. It is further desired that the format of the mimeographed papers and the copies of accompanying charts conform to the specifications indicated on Appendix 1 attached hereto.
