Dear Mr. Secretary:

Reference is made to the letter from your Department dated May 3, 1946 recommending that a special flight by the Danish Airlines to Greenland via Iceland be permitted to land at Narsarsuak Field, Greenland. The War Department gives favorable consideration to the Danish request and the Air Transport Command is being instructed to make available the Army air base facilities at Meeks Field, Iceland and Narsarsuak, Greenland to facilitate this flight and to render proper courtesies and amenities to the Danish officials and business men while they are at these places.

In the event the special flight of Danish officials and business men desire to use the facilities at Meeks Field, Iceland, it is requested that the Department of State obtain the necessary clearances with the Icelandic Government.

Representatives of the Danish Airlines should contact Headquarters, Air Transport Command, Washington, D. C. to execute the customary contract and to complete other necessary arrangements prior to the flight.

My dear Mr. Secretary:

A request has been received through the American Legation at Copenhagen that the Danish Airlines (DNL) be permitted to land at Harsarsuaq Field, Greenland, on a special flight sometime in June for the purpose of transporting Danish officials and business men from Denmark to Greenland via Iceland. The Department favors the granting of this request, provided such use would not conflict with military considerations.

In view of the limited time remaining prior to the date contemplated for the flight, a prompt reply would be appreciated in order that the Legation may be advised of the War Department's decision in this matter.
