MISSION LOG REPORT

REPORT NO. 39

27 May 1945.

MISSION: Strafing of GUADALUPE, MINDANAO.

FLIGHT COMPOSITION: Buchser, DuWall, W.H. Foster, Gleason,  
Williamson, V.C. Olsen, Lawson.

TIME: TTO:0040. ATA:1315.

WEATHER: Visibility unlimited.

COMMENTS: This strafing hop set two fires; one along the creek  
through GUADALUPE, possibly a boat; and another 160 yards north  
of the town. Pilots chewed up the entire town and vicinity  
on six strafing passes by one division and four by the other.  
They expended on an average of 2100 rounds of ammunition per  
plane. Fighter director said that "it was an excellent job"  
and that he would make a fuller report. He said further that  
Japanese were concentrated throughout the entire target area.  
He also said that there were boats at this point, and that  
there was one explosion near a boat.
