III. 3. $L(1)$

It is natural to consider also the probability of the open loop to remain intact, i.e., to carry traffic, and to compare it with the probability of the single loop of capacity C failing to carry traffic.

Let us consider the two equations H_1 and H_2 for $L(1)$:

$$H_1 = \frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2} \exp(-\lambda_1 t),$$

$$H_2 = \frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2} \exp(-\lambda_2 t).$$

The second equation ($\lambda_2 > \lambda_1$) describes the probability of the single loop failing to carry traffic, while the first one describes the probability of the two loops failing to carry traffic.

Thus, the difference between the probabilities of the two loops failing to carry traffic is given by the expression

$(\lambda_2 - \lambda_1) t / 2$. This expression is positive if $t > 0$, negative if $t < 0$, and zero if $t = 0$.








