## INTRODUCTION

## 1. FURPOSE AND SCOPE

This manual lists the products shown on all 1954 Census of Manufactures product schedules arranged in the numeric order of the industries covered in the Standard Industrial Classification, as revised. The list of products for each industry represents the principal primary products of that industry arranged in numeric sequence.

This manual will be used inverifying product classifications written-in by the respondent as well as assigning code classifications, as necessary. The columnar format and lettering serve as an editing guide in reviewing the product inquiry.

This manual may also be used in the preparation of tables, as well as showing the conversion between products, product classes, and industries.

## II. DERIVATION OF THE PRODUCT CODING SYSTEM

A product code of seven digits is assigned to and uniquely identifies each individual rooduct. The first four digits describe the industry classification in which the item is considered primary. The fifth digit describes the product class and the final two digits indicate the sequence of products within the industry. These final two digits are assigned in numeric order. Gaps have been left in the numbering system in the final two digits to provide flexibility in the addition of new product items.

Since only one seven digit product code can be assigned to an individual product, products primary in more than one industry require somewhat different handling. These products are shown in the listings for each of the industries in which they are primary, and a cross reference is made to the related primary industries. This cross reference is made at the product class level if all of the products in the product class are primary in the several industries. Information relating to the classification of products primary to more than one industry is presented by footnote. For example, code 2011511, "Lard," is primary to, and listed with. Industries 2011 and 2013. The footnotes for this product state that the establishment which produces this product is classified in Industry 2011 if it slaughters animals, and in Industry 2013 if it does not slaughter animals. Special instructions will be made available to expiain where to obtain the required information for determining the primary industry of the establishment.

The selection of the four digit industry base code in those cases in which the product is primary to more than one industry was determined mainly as follows:
a) If the industries differed in degree of integration, the code assigned was that of the less integrated;
b) If integration was not a factor, the code corresponding to the industry which accounted for the larger portion of the output was assigned.

Product classes are shown in numeric sequence and are identified by a five digit code followed by "--." The individual seven digitproductsincluded in the product class are listed immediately after the product class.

## III. COLUMNAR FORMAT AND LETTERING OF PRODUCT INQUIRY

Following is a description of the standard columnar structure and lettering of the product section of the 1954 Census report forms. It will serve as a guide in reviewing product inquiries. Column ( $J$ ) is reserved for the seven digit product code.

Columns (F)-(I) are used for a variety of measures, usually of a special nature.
Any of the measures shown in Columns A-E not required for specific products or industries, are omitted from this list.
IV. SPECIAL CODES

Two or More Codes Assigned to a Single Product - In some instances it is necessary to assign more than one seven digit product code to a single product. The product listing for which the requested information is to be tabulated as part of the product class total has a product class number ( $0-9$ ) in the fifth digit. This listing always has value as part of the requested information. The product listing for which the requested information is not to be tabulated as part of the product class total has an " $X$ '" assigned for the fifth digit. These " X " items generally request information relating only to quantity, though there are some " $X$ " items which request data for value.

Products Reported on Form MC-D2 - All products reported on Form MC-D2 will be assigned a five digit product class code in column (J). The product class reference list will be used as the basis for determining the appropriate code, with the numerical list of manufactured products as a supplementary aid. The five digit code assigned on Form MC-D2 automatically becomes a seven digit code, since the last two digits, " 99, " are preprinted for each line in item 12 of this form.

Receipts for Contract and Commission Work and Other Manufacturing Services There are a number of items which cover receipts for various services which involve manufacturing operations done for others on their own materials. These items are listed numerically in Appendix A, Part 1 and have as their first two digits "93". (except for the " 90 " code on Form MC-D2).

Nonmanufacturing Products and Receipts - A number of items included on the product schedules are products of nonmanufacturing industries or receipts for nonmanufacturing services. These items are listed numerically in Appendix A, Parts 2 and 3. Appendix $A_{0}$ Part 2, lists numerically the minerals (mining) products which are preprinted on Census of Manufactures forms. The minerals code for clay, 145---, will be completed by reference to the numerical list of mineral products. For Appendix A, Part 3, scrap and salable refuse items have "941" for their first three digits; "951" for nonmanufactured products (other than mining); and, "970" for storage and services incidental to storage.

All Other Products of a Product Class - Written-in products which are not covered by any of the specifically listed products of a product class will be classified by a seven-digit code consisting of the five digit product class followed by "98."

## V. CHANGES IN CODES ON PRODUCT SCHEDULES

Changes and corrections of codes which already appear on the printed product schedules will be found in Appendix C.
