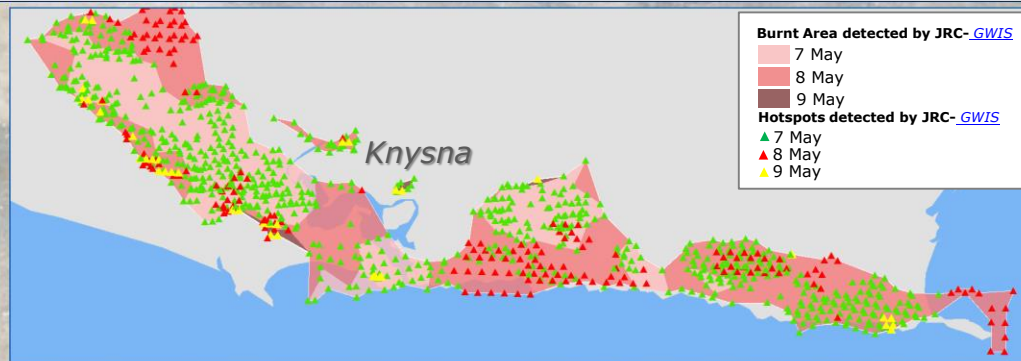




**Weather Forecast**

Over the Western, Northern and North-Western Cape Provinces of South Africa partly cloudy to cloudy conditions are forecast with local rain mainly during the warm hours of Saturday (10/6) and Sunday (11/6) over Western and Northern Provinces. Maximum temperatures will be reaching 15 to 17°C (coastal) and 22 to 24°C (inland). Strong winds 25 to 35 km/h mostly from north/northwest directions will prevail with gusts during the warm hours of Saturday (10/6) over-topping locally 75 km/h. Such critical weather parameters are directly linked to extreme (high) fire danger forecast during the next 2 days with emphasis over the Northern and Western Cape Provinces.

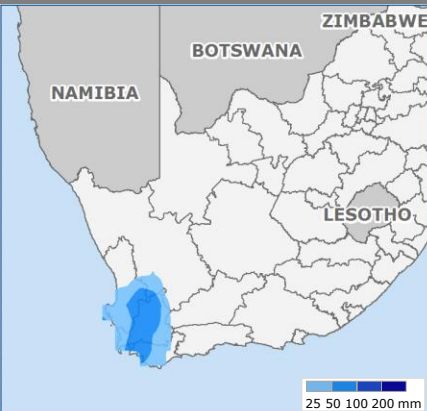


**SITUATION**

- Wildfires and severe weather have been affecting the Western Cape province over the last few days causing damage and casualties.
- According to national authorities five people died, 2 000 evacuated and 827 houses damaged in Cape Town Municipality.
- According to Eden District Municipality, as of 09 June at 16.00 UTC, wildfires broke out in the town of Knysna, causing five deaths and 300 houses damaged; local media, reported also that 10 000 people were displaced.
- The fires, according to Eden District Municipality, are all contained as of 9 June at 16.00 UTC.
