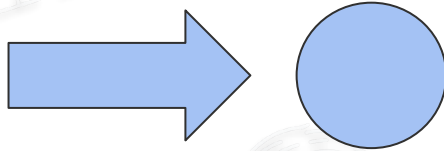

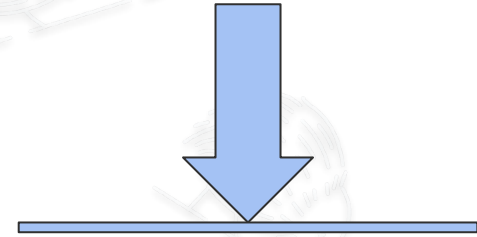

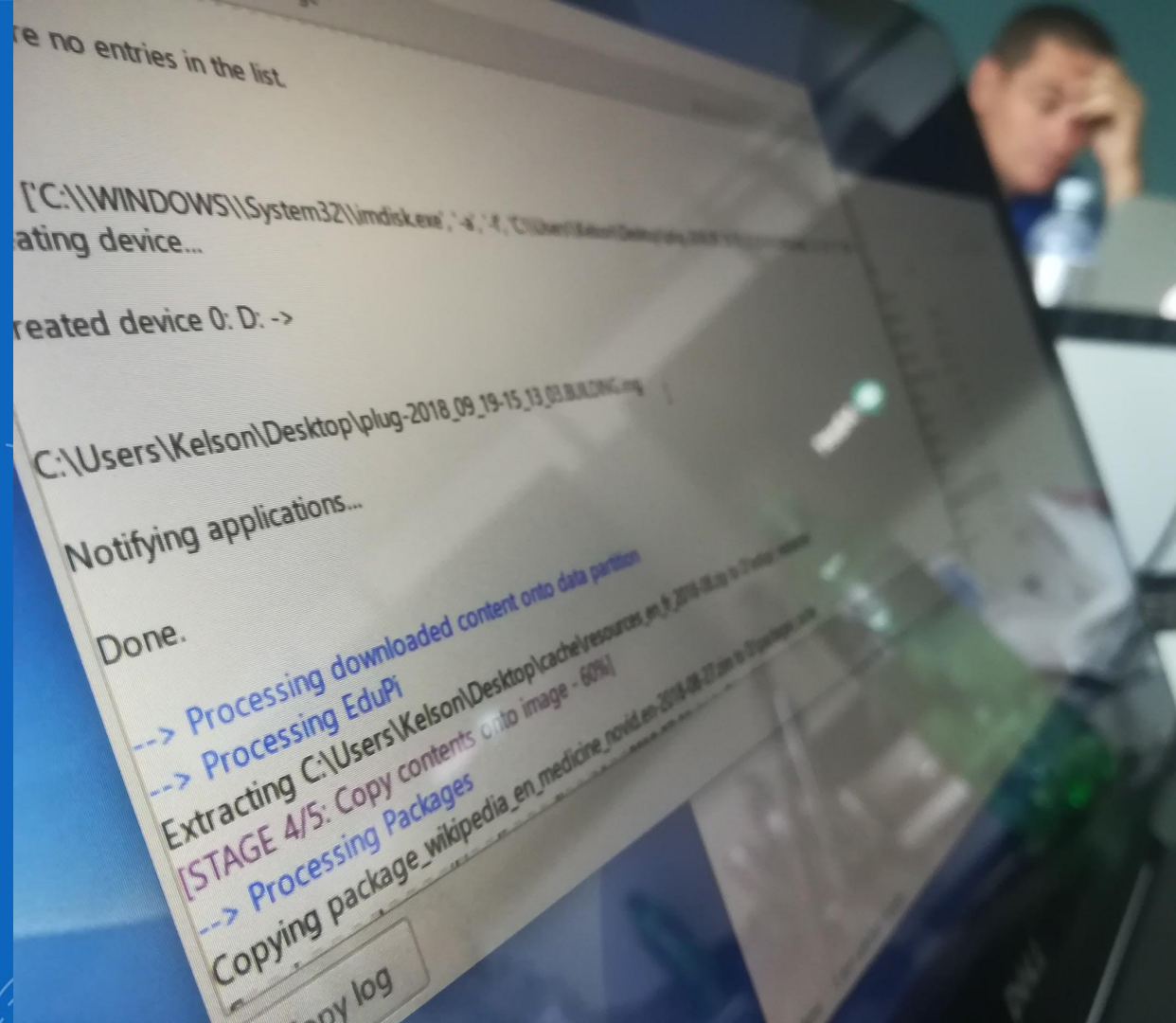

## What we learned:

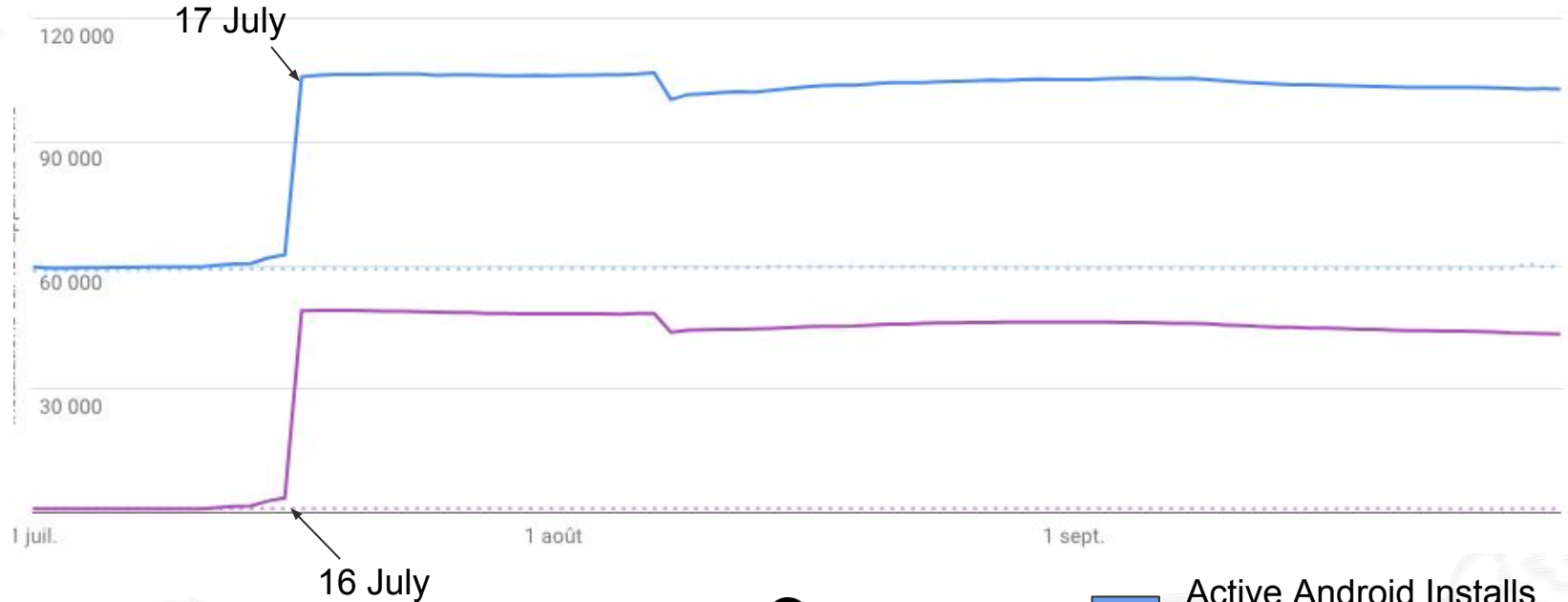
Did you struggle with anything?
