### What's the mobile contribution project?

Per the annual plan, the Reading Web team is currently working on <u>advanced mobile</u> <u>contributions</u>. We aim to make it easier for people to contribute productively to Wikimedia projects on a mobile device by exposing previously unavailable pages in the mobile skin (Minerva). Our goal is to see an increase in edits from the Minerva skin, as well as a stable rate of retention for the feature set itself.

# Wikimania Research

### Goals

We used Wikimania as an opportunity to discuss our plan with contributors and do a bit of research.

#### Research goals:

- 1) Build good faith with contributor community & sign people up for continued engagement
- Collect basic information about current mobile editing practices
- 3) Identify/prioritize key pages/tools for mobile contributing
- 4) Better understand how we might organize the navigation for advanced mobile contributors

# Wikimania Research

#### **Process**

- Participants were a combination of people who sought us out, and individuals we identified/recruited through casual conversations
- The interviews were conducted in a semi-formal manner (somewhere in between casual conversations about editing and a formal user interview).
- We followed an <u>interview script</u>, although the casual nature of the conversations meant that the interviews tended to vary a bit
  - This included a card ranking activity (pages/tools) and a card sorting activity (nav)
- For the two days before the conference we conducted interviews at our table in the hackathon room
- For the three days of the conference we conducted interviews at our table in the community village

Build good faith with contributor community & sign people up for continued engagement

- People were generally excited about us working on mobile contributions (and working with us on mobile contributions)
  - There were several editors who have been editing for a long time on desktop, have never edited on mobile, and seemed unlikely to start. These folks were definitely the minority
- People willingly started watching our project page and were enthusiastic about continuing to engage after Wikimania
- We collected contact information from 30
   editors with the understanding that we will
   reach out to them for continued collaboration

Collect basic information about current mobile editing practices

- Most of the people we talked to do some editing on mobile
  - o For some it's a regular thing
- They (almost always) use the desktop version of the site to edit on mobile
- For some editors the blockers to editing on mobile have less to do with our product, and more to do with general constraints e.g. difficulty typing on a smartphone
- Editors noted that using the desktop version on their phone is noticeably slower than the m.wiki site
- People generally don't check to see how their edits look when rendered on mobile (despite knowing the majority of reading happens on mobile)

Identify/prioritize key pages/tools for advanced mobile contributing

Out of the many pages and tools editors/contributors use, which ones are most critical to them being able to edit on mobile?

In order to investigate this we did a card ranking activity with participants. Each card was a page or tool that is part of the editing workflows. We allowed people to add other pages/tools if they weren't included.


















### Results


Our sample size was small (30 people, so this is by no means statistically significant) however here are the following pages/tools that consistently were mentioned as being critical to mobile contributing:

- History
- Diffs
- Watchlist
- Talk
- Contributions
- Recent changes

## Example workflow/pattern of use

### 2. Investigate/gather context



This 3 part workflow, centered around a diff, was described by one of the participants while they were explaining their rankings. They start off by discovering relevant changes (diffs), investigate/gather additional context, then finally take action.



As a secondary method to learn more about how we might design the navigation for advanced mode we showed people two prototypes. This was less of a pointed review where we were trying to answer specific questions, and more of a conversational prompt/stimulus.

Overall, users reacted positively to the idea of the expanded navigation while having comments and feedback on specific elements of the prototypes themselves.










