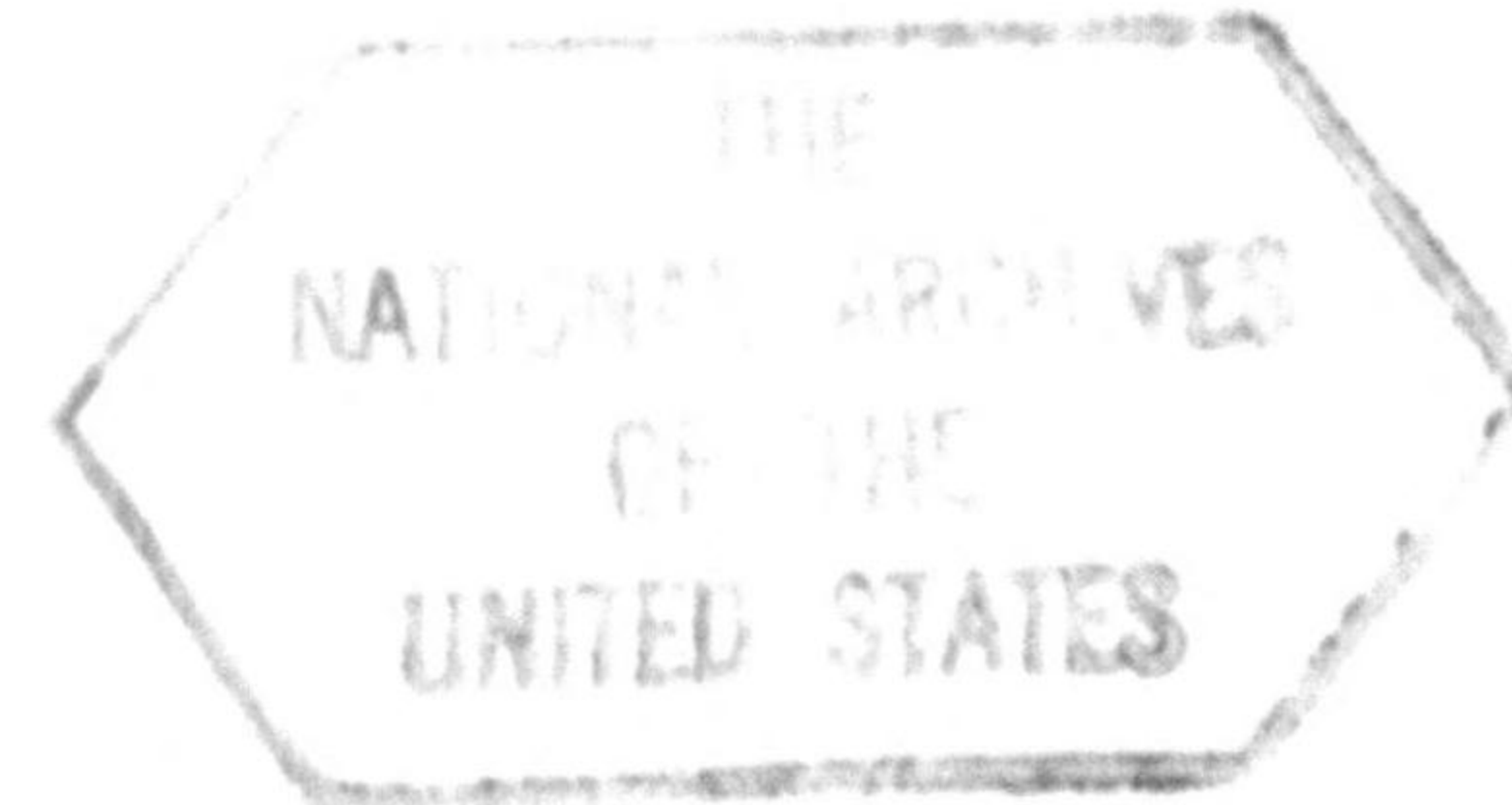

 1. The attached report, Incl 1, pertains to inspections of reparations plants in Hyogo Prefecture, made by a CPC inspector during the period 22 May through 3 June 1950.
 2. It is requested that necessary corrective action be taken as follows:
 - a. Consolidate equipment within plant and eliminate excess guards, plant #13-44 (ref Par 2c(1), Incl 1).
 - b. List and make available for reparations the electrical equipment at plants #13-37, #13-45, #13-66, #13-81, and #13-92b (ref Par 2a(2), 2d(3), 2h(1), 2o, and 2r(1), Incl 1).
 3. CPC will take necessary action to follow up scrap recommendations in attached report.
 4. Upon completion of necessary corrective action, request that a report of action taken be included in the monthly CAS activities report.

 1. During February 1948, a series of conferences were held concerning procedures in connection with the inventory and evaluation of primary war facilities to be made by Japanese Government Evaluating Committees. Attending these conferences were General Harrison, Deputy Chief of Staff and Chief, Reparations Section, GHQ, SCAP, members of the Reparations Section, and representatives of Military Government Section, Headquarters, Eighth Army.
 2. As a result of these conferences, the following procedures were established as being in accordance with existing policy:
 - a. Equipment and facilities dispersed from arsenals, aircraft factories, privately owned munitions plants and laboratories to other industrial installations

2. Cont'd prior to the date the former installations were taken under custody and control, were directed to be released unless the installation at which it was located had been independently listed for reparations.

b. Equipment and facilities used in war production which were converted to peacetime use and released to industry prior to designation for reparations were exempted from reparations control and custody as a corollary of (a) above.

c. Specific exemption was made of electrical equipment or facilities such as sub-station equipment and of water supply installation which, in addition to serving installations designated for reparations, provided power for non-reparations facilities, nearby communities or the like. Electric generating stations, wholly contained within and totally serving reparations facilities, were not so exempted.

3. In view of apparent conflict between corrective action requested in paragraph 2b, Note No. 1 and the approved procedures outlined in paragraph 2 above, review is requested prior to action by this section.

MEMORANDUM FOR: Director, Reparations Property Division

SUBJECT: Inspection of Reparations Plants in Hyogo Prefecture
22 May thru 3 June 1950

1. As scheduled, on 22 May 50, the undersigned departed for Osaka for the purpose of checking maintenance, custody, authorized use and exempt status of reparations equipment located in Hyogo Prefecture.

2. Upon arrival the undersigned checked in with Kinki Civil Affairs Region and discussed the purpose of the visit. Necessary accommodations were furnished. Mr. Nishio and Mr. Mitsunabu, technical interpreters accompanied the undersigned at the following plants

a. Nikkoku Kogyo KK, #13-37, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #1) 29 May 50

- (1) This plant was recently allocated ¥ 135,607 yen for maintenance purposes. 309 machine tools, all first and second class, were cleaned and regreased. It is believed by the undersigned that no further maintenance will be necessary for 6 to 12 months.
- (2) All sub-station equipment including transformers, switch panels, oil circuit breakers etc, were not inventoried or regarded as reparations property by the plant custodian. This electrical equipment was owned by Kansai Haiden, installed and used during the war in this reparations plant and should be included as reparations property. Plant custodian is of the opinion that it should not be inventoried.
- (3) There are 80 items said to be in "EX" status. These items consist of vises, chain blocks fractional horsepower motors, and other similar equipment found in all plants. It is possible that these items were omitted from the original inventory and later marked with an "EX". Plant custodian does not have any records whatsoever regarding the "EX" status of this equipment.
- (4) There are 14 items, inclosure 2, that are recommended to be scrapped.
- (5) Maintenance and custody were good.

b. Showa Seki Kogyo, #13-40, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #3) 26 May 50

(1) This plant is manufacturing small engines and cutting tools. Four permits for operation were available and are included as inclosure 1 to inclosure 3.

(2) Maintenance and custody were good.

c. Fuso Kinzoku Kogyo, #13-44, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #4) 29 May 50

(1) There are 28 guards for the custody of 7 buildings which are housing reparations equipment as shown on plant layout inclosure 1 to inclosure 4. One of the buildings has only one transformer and another large building has 2 large transformers plus some non-removable equipment. It is recommended that the three transformers be moved to one of the other buildings and the number of guards be reduced to a maximum of 14.

(2) Custodian has requested that the following boilers, compressors and their supporting equipment be released as scrap:

This equipment is in excellent condition and should not be scrapped.

(3) There were 1029 reparations items that were moved to plant #13-11. Details are outlined in Capt. Mandel's report dated 26 Jan 1949.

(4) Maintenance and custody were good.

d. Teikoku Seimitsu Kogyo, #13-45, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #5)

(1) This plant should be included with "reparations trip number 23" for future inspections.

(2) In accordance with question 7 of reparations inspection check sheet, inclosure 6 is herewith submitted.

(3) Three 50 KVA transformers that were not inventoried and formerly belonged to Kansai Helden had been removed from the plant. Custodian was of the impression that these transformers were "EX".

(4) Maintenance and custody were good.

e. Tokushu Sangyo KK, #13-46, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #7) 1 Jan 50

(1) There are some idle authorized use machines here at the present time; however this plant has plans to utilize these idle machines in the near future.

(2) Inclosure 6 is a list of items that are recommended to be scrapped.

(3) Maintenance and custody were good.

f. Chuo Kogyo, Itami Kojo, #13-57, Mun, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #9)

(1) At present this plant is idle. Plant ownership has been changed and the new owner, Yamaoka Kaimeiki Kabushiki Kaisha, intends to manufacture diesel engines here.

(2) Maintenance and custody were good.

g. Dai Nichi Kinzoku KK, #13-58, Mun, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #10)

(1) This plant is manufacturing a Universal machine which is composed of a lathe, drill press, shaper and milling machine, all combined into one. Authorization for production was granted 8 Sep 1949.

(2) Maintenance and custody were good.

h. Towa Kikai Kogyo, #13-66, Mun, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #11) 29 May 50

- (1) The electrical equipment which includes three 30 KVA and one 15 KVA transformers was not inventoried. This equipment formerly belonged to the Kansai Kaisha.
- (2) Maintenance and custody were good.

i. Nagasaki Dock KK, #13-69, Shipyard, (25 May 1950)

- (1) This shipyard was released and called back into custody. Details are located in the plant folder #13-69, in the reparations files.
- (2) There is absolutely no reparations equipment here. This shipyard should be released.

j. Nakayama Seiko, #13-74, Iron and Steel (Rep Insp, C/S, Incl #12)
25 May 1950

- (1) A 1500 horse power motor, code number 13-74-IV A 22, was brought into the plant for consolidation purposes.
- (2) Maintenance and custody were good.

k. Otani Jukogyo, #13-75, Iron and Steel, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #13)
26 May 1950

- (1) At the present time, labor is on strike at this plant and there is no indication of a settlement in the near future.
- (2) Maintenance of the reparations equipment is poor since this equipment has not been in operation since 29 March 1950.
- (3) There are 5 pumps code numbers 13-75-VB2-7 thru VB2-11, and 5 engines code numbers 13-75-VA3-1 thru VA3-5, that are "EX" but were erroneously inventoried as reparations. Reparations records should be corrected accordingly.
- (4) Part of this plant was taken under custody as Iron and Steel and the remaining part was taken as Machine Tool. The Machine tool portion has since been released.
- (5) Custody of reparations equipment was fair.
- (6) Enclosure 14 is a list of reparations items given to the undersigned and submitted for the record.

25 May 50 1. Osaka Seiko KK, #13-77, Iron and Steel, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #15)

- (1) Inclosure 16 is a list of 5 items for the record, that were not worthy of being inventoried at the time of the inventory. These items were repaired by the plant and are now in operation.
- (2) Maintenance and custody were good.

a. Kanegafuchi Bosai KK, #13-79, Sulphuric Acid, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #17) 25 May 50

- (1) Plant custodian stated that a request was submitted to move all of this equipment to a better location because during high tide some of the items are under water. It is worthy to mention that several other plants are in the same predicament and such movement is not favorably recommended at this time.
- (2) Maintenance and custody were fair ^{to} good.

n. Kansai Ryusan KK, #13-80, Sulphuric Acid, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #18) 25 May 50

- (1) This plant has obtained permission from ESS to move all the reparations equipment to Saganoseki in Oita prefecture. At the time of the inspection the dismantling was in progress. It was estimated that the dismantling would be completed in two months and re-erecting would be completed in six months.
- (2) Inclosure 19 is a list of inventoried items that are recommended to be scrapped.
- (3) Inclosure 20 is a list of non-inventoried items that are also recommended to be scrapped.
- (4) Maintenance and custody were good.

o. Nihon Jukagaku Kogyo, #13-81, Sulphuric Acid, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl 21) 27 May 50

Electrical equipment which formerly belonged to Kansai Haiden was omitted during the inventory.

p. Kubota Tekkosho KK, #13-84, M/T, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #22) 23 May 50

- (1) A scrap list was submitted by the custodian but when the undersigned visited this plant, the custodian stated that he would like to cancel the scrap request.

(2) In accordance with question 7 of reparations inspection check sheet, inclosure 23 is submitted.

(3) Maintenance was good except for the precision tools (micrometers, height gages, block gages, etc) custody was good.

q. Nippon Hassoden Amagasaki Kojo, #13-87, Power (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #24) 1 Jan 50

(1) This is the largest thermal power plant in the Orient, having six 53,000 KW capacity generators or a maximum output of 316,000 KW. This is one of the Power plants under custody where the reparations equipment is not inventoried.

(2) Maintenance and custody were good.

r. Yajima Value KK #13-92b, A/C, (Rep Insp C/S, Incl #25) 26 May 50

(1) Electrical equipment which formerly belonged to Kansai Haiden was omitted during the inventory.

(2) Maintenance and custody were good.

3. Findings were reported to Mr. R. Susseman of Kinki CAR, who assured immediate corrective action.

1. Reference is SCAPIN 2103, 23 June 1950, subject: "Revision of Scope of Activities in Former Japanese Naval Shipyards".
2. The inclosed two copies of application from Amagasaki Iron and Steel Manufacturing Company, 6 July 1950, subject: "Petition for the Continuance of Production Activities", is forwarded for information and assistance in expediting action.
3. This company has been melting scrap in the Kure Naval Arsenal since April 1946 and these are enough scrap within the arsenal area for twenty (20) months operation at the present rate. The scrap in nearby areas would justify melting operation for approximately 2 years more.
4. The application is being processed through normal Japanese Government channels. Approval is recommended.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Mr. Loomis, CI&S Section called this afternoon regarding the new action which had been taken regarding the Kurihama Fishery School of Tokyo University and also to report that the area in which the Fishery and Animal Husbandry School of Hiroshima University located at Fukiyama City had been inspected and that the school authorities were under the impression that they would be required to evacuate.
2. In conversation with Mr. Kiesel, Chugoku CAR, I inquired regarding the Fishery School at Fukiyama City and he stated that Mr. Stradley had inspected this area which was formerly occupied by BCOF and subsequently occupied by 27th Infantry Regiment that it was a very fine area and had been recommended to this headquarters for the special project. However, he stated that no statement had been made that this area was to be taken immediately nor that the school must prepare to evacuate. He further stated, however, that provided the special project of CAS does not take over the area that BCOF is interested in reacquiring it. This area was released to the Japanese Government. The school contains an enrollment of about 180 night students and 70 day students and there are about 50 Japanese families quartered in the area.
3. Col Albergotti has not been contacted on this subject.

1. Col. Albergotti said that they did not intend to use the Fukuyama City Camp. They are presently negotiating for the use of the Mizushima Camp, which was requested by several of the mayors and the Governor of Okuyama Prefecture.
2. Mr. Stradley said that he had inspected several areas for Col. Albergotti and that the Fukuyama City area was located in Hiroshima Prefecture. The Mizushima Camp is located in Okuyama Prefecture near Surajima. The fisheries school is in the Fukuyama City Camp which was known as the Otsuno Camp formerly occupied by the British. BCOF

is interested in relocating in that area. Mr. Stradley said that the Procurement Demand will be necessary if they do take it over.

3. The above information was given to Mr. Link who notified Mr. Loomis.

Miss Dambroskie CPC/AD requested information in regard to the status of tracking located in Reparation Plant Code No. 19-26. This tracking is needed by ordnance.

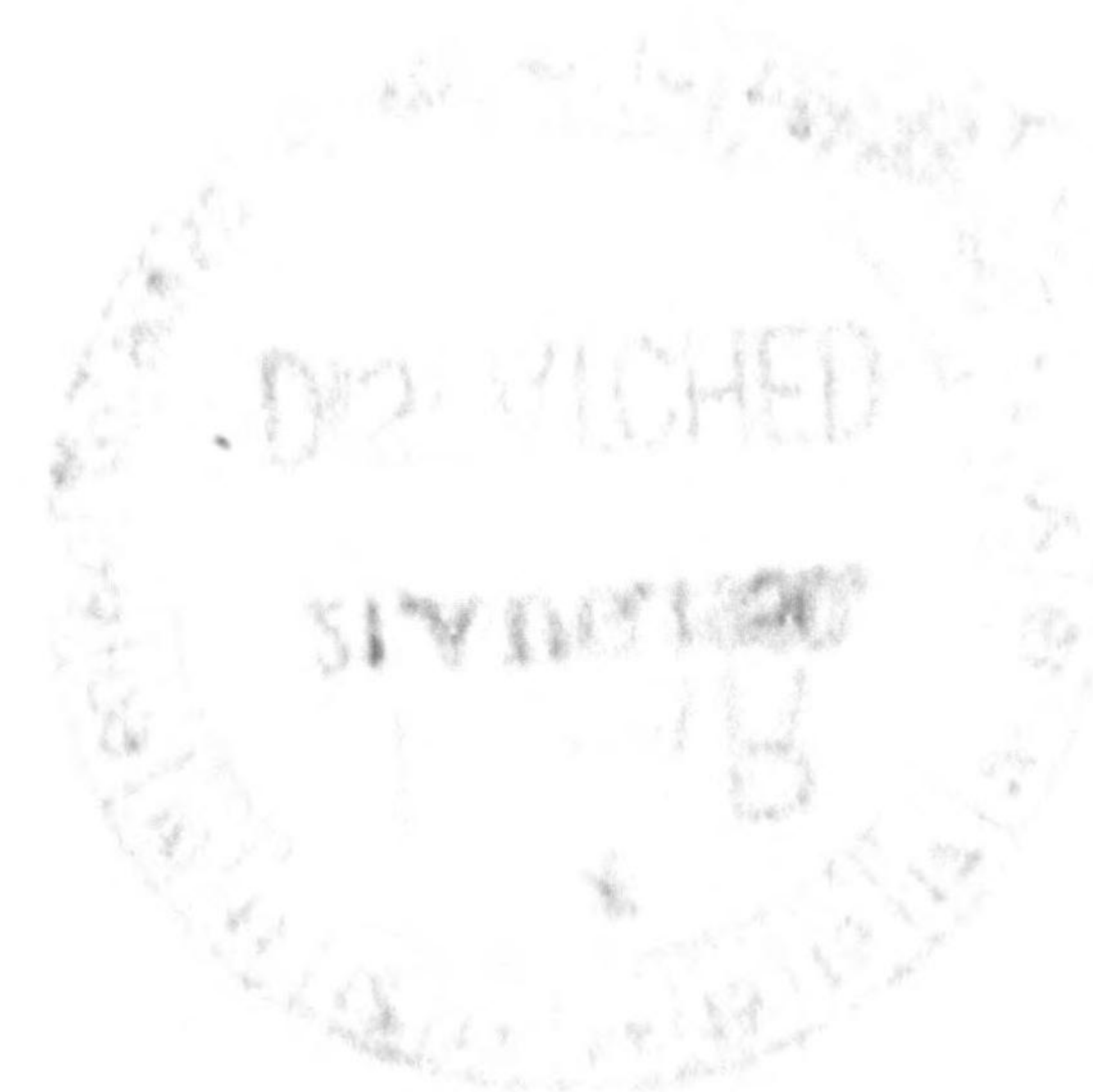
