Lieut. G. H. CONOVER in a PB4Y-1P took off from Agana Field, Guam, M. I. on 1 May 1945 at 0920 King to photograph enemy air installations at Truk Atoll. He arrived over the target at 1317 King and took vertical and oblique photographs of Rten Airfield from 20,000 ft., of both airfields on Moen from 19,500 ft., of Faran Airfield from 19,000 ft. Oblique photographs were made of Tel and Dublin Islands from 19,000 ft. Light bursts of heavy accurate antiaircraft fire were encountered coming from Dublin Island.

Narrow streaks on the water in the harbor were observed, probably the wake of a twin float seaplane.

Lieut. CONOVER then returned to Agana landing at 1650 King.
