
Global Hubs discussions (June 24-26)


Movement Charter Drafting

To provide balanced and objective information in order to assist understanding the problem, alternatives, opportunities, and/or solutions

To obtain feedback on analysis, alternatives, and/or decisions.

To work directly with the groups to ensure that concerns and aspirations are consistently understood and considered

To partner with the groups in each aspect of the decision, including the development of alternatives and the identification of the preferred solutions.

Key Content Agreements

- **→ Conciseness:** Keep the Movement Charter as a concise, high level document.
- ➤ **Appendices**: Keep the detailed information in appendices to keep the outline and content lean.
- ➤ Definition/preamble: The first content of the Movement Charter (preamble) should be the definition of the Charter itself.
- ➤ Enforcing: The Charter should include clear mechanisms of enforcing its content.





- 9-11 September, Berlin and hybrid

- ~150 participants onsite, ~350 online
- Affiliates, WMF, Committees, groups

Together in Europe - Outline and Timeline

Purpose and rationale

Sharing work and creating synergies benefits the Wikimedia Movement

Purpose

- Restructuring and more capacities in the current advocacy work in EU (Free Knowledge Advocacy Group EU)
- More impact and better visibility in priority topics: access to knowledge and information, liability for content, AI, public data
- Increased capacity to do proactive work
- Capacity building to European Affiliates Fundraising to fund joint projects and initiatives more money for Europe
- More support to non-EU Affiliates based in Europe

WMEU - a structure fit for purpose

- An association of legal entities seated in a European country and formally recognised as Affiliates within the Wikimedia Movement
- Based in Brussels, Belgium, where most of the activities take place
- Democratically governed: 1 member = 1 vote
- Financial contributions are <u>not</u> a condition for membership
- Branding related directly to Wikimedia Movement
- Coordinating with other Movement structures (hubs, etc.) to share experience, pool resources and not duplicate work

Context

- FKAGEU: non-formalized arrangement between European chapters since 2013
- Admin support provided by WMNL, then by WMDE
- 2 people working in Brussels and supporting participating chapters in advocacy efforts team at capacity
- Lack of movement-related branding confusing to the key stakeholders
- Chapters' contributions = main sources of support (no other core funding)

Timeline

As immediate next steps,
Affiliates need to confirm the
membership in WMEU and
decide if to endorse
candidates to the Initial Board.

The Process to Establish WMEU

Step	Timing
Drafting notarial deed for the establishment of the INGO	In progress
Execution of notarial deed by the notary	After membership is confirmed at a satisfactory level (mid-July)
Application for legal recognition at the Belgian Federal Justice Department	Three business days as of date of notarial deed
Royal Decree granting legal personality to the INGO	Expected within three months as of the date of application
Publication of the establishment of the INGO	One month as of the granting of the date of the Royal Decree

Cluster H includes the following initiatives:

- Identify the impact of Wikimedia projects & content
- Misinformation
- Identifying impactful topics
- List of high-impact topics
- Bridging content gaps
- Content initiatives in underrepresented communities

Wikimedia UK worked with a consultant to:

- Assess the work and process to date
- Recommend next steps to get to implementation
- Create an outline plan for this work

- 2. Reflections on 'immediate steps' identified in 2021
- 3. What is Impact?
- 4. Focus on Topics

Recommendation: Create a 'how to' toolkit

- Through a participatory process, the objective would be to create a practical toolkit to be used by Wikimedia affiliates and communities around the world to implement Cluster H initiatives
- We anticipate that the process will involve three workshops to co-create the toolkit, followed by piloting, evaluation and wider implementation
- Planning a grant application to WMF to support this process in particular the inclusion of different language speakers and those who would need a stipend to participate






CEE Hub Update

- Grant application was approved by the Movement Strategy Team at the end of June (without any official explanation as to what had changed since Quim's statement on the strategy forum)
- Fiscal sponsor is Wikimedia Polska (WMPL)
- Hiring process for the CEE Hub Coordinator has started
 - Deadline for applications is July 31st

- Governance model for the CEE Hub
 - Design will be started in August
 - Discussions with the CEE affiliates in September (after the Wikimedia Summit)
 - Finalisation at the CEE Meeting in mid-October
