fair to use our doings. - I am sorry to have no  
direction from you as regards the Bells, & have at  
last, come to the conclusion to send you by the  
way of Home directed to the care of Greene 12 of  
our best Bells. With these you can deal with  
The Duke & the Earl & Lady Bryson & Thomas  
Sturge - I shall send them nothing - I shall send  
a Bell to H. Martineau & two others for Miss  
Almond & Miss Sleithen as I thought it would be  
wonderful & explain to you to do this, & as they are  
all contributors, there need be of course, no par-  
ticular compliment about it. I shall merely write  
H. M. a line or two enough to say "Here is the  
thing." I am sorry Foin is such a looking wretch.  
I suppose it is all Garrison's fault after what you  
say. I shall use my best judgment in sending  
Bells, & shall write in most of them, thinking it  
will be best. After the box is off, I hope the taste  
of the Fair will be one of my regrets. I have
