REPATRIATION OF ALLIED AND NEUTRAL NATIONALS

- l. Guarantees satisfactory to the State Department have been received covering alien evacuees from JAPAN and the ASTATIC mainland for the following nationalities: Australians, Belgians, Canadians, Cubans, Danes, French (designated by authorized French officials in JAPAN and CHINA), Irish, Italians (specifically listed by the Italian government), New Zealanders, Norwegians, Fortuguese (diplomats from JAPAN only), Spaniards (specifically named by the Spanish Government), Swedes, Swiss, Turks (diplomats from JAPAN only).
- 2. Provisions of paragraph 1 above do not apply to the repatriation of Chinese, Formosans and Acrean nationals who embark at ports designated in directives by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Japanese Government.
- 3. An individual desiring repatriation will be directed first to secure identification and/or verification of citizenship status from the official representative of his government in JAPAN.
- country is not present in JAPAN, the national will be directed to the nearest city having an official representative of the power protecting the interests of that national's country, which will ordinarily be the nearest representative of the Swiss or Swedish Governments.
- b. Persons desiring repatriation who claim to be United States citizens will be directed to report to or communicate with the Yokohama Branch of the Office of the United States Political Advisor, American Consulate Building, No. 6 Yomashita-cho.
- c. All French citizens desiring repatriation will be directed to communicate with the French Government representative in TOKYO.

4. Transportation

- a. Commercial transportation is not available at this time.
- b. After obtaining written authorization for repatriation, repatriate will report to the Troop Movement Section, 2nd Major Port, YOKOHAMA, for transportation arrangements for repatriation.
- quired to execute a promissory note to cover cost of transportation, subsistence, etc., and copies of AFPAC AGO Form No. 112, 10 August 1945, upon completion of which a date on which the repatriate must report for embarkation will be designated.

- d. After reporting on the date designated by the Troop Movement Section to await embarkation, repatriate will be supplied with subsistence and temporary shelter by the Section.
- e. Repatriate will be required to make his own transportation arrangements from his home to YOKOHAMA. Government transportation is not authorized for this purpose.
- YOKOHAMA, commanders of units will communicate directly with the Troop Movement Section before advising repatriates to proceed to YOKOHAMA.
- exchange indigenous currency into other currencies. This restriction is further applicable outside of JAPAN. Such personnel should, therefore, be discouraged from taking indigenous currency out of JAPAN. Amounts of non-Japanese durrencies that may be carried out of JAPAN by repatriates will be subsequently announced.
