The first cost of seed is but a small item compared to the cost of land, labor, time and all other attentions a crop needs before maturity. If the crop is not as good as it should be and the seed is at fault, you can readily see that the small difference in the first cost of the seed is only a very small part of the loss sustained.

The most important factor to a gardener or florist is that the seed he has planted should GROW and it certainly would be a big aid to him to know just what PERCENTAGE grows. We test EVERY ITEM in our stock for germination before our orders are filled and we have the actual tests to show for reference at any time.

Many new varieties and improvements and selections on old strains are listed this year which every gardener ought to try and which may prove real money makers because of their earliness or other good qualities. These new varieties with only a few exceptions were tried out in field tests a year before offering them to the trade as better stocks.
