





Daniel Ehrenberg wrote:

>Maybe we should create another sister-project to the wikipedia about current events. I was just thinking about it and there are major problems with usenet news groups and kuro5hin.org, so they are not reliable as a news source. The monopoly-owned mass-media that we depend on are often biased and incomplete, but a wikipedia one would present each point of view as an oppinion, not a FACT. We wouldn't leave out facts like they normally do to create a stronger bias. Wikiwiki would work very well for independant media. > What do you think?

I think we should go further still and shoot for the ultimate goal of creating "Wikimedia." That's media with an "m." It would use Wiki-style rules to enable public participation in the creation and editing of all kinds of media: encyclopedias and other reference works, current news, books, fiction, music, video etc. Like current broadcast media, it would have differentiated "channels" and "programs," each with self-selecting audiences. Unlike current media, however, the audience would also be actively involved in creating its own programming, instead of merely passively watching it.

Community feedback to 2018 brand strategy

Theme	Summary of theme	
Reduce confusion	Movement names are closely related and cause confusion. Will changes resolve confusion or make things worse?	
Protect reputation	Wikipedia has a range of reputations worldwide. Will change "hijack" good reputation? Will bad reputation limit trust in sister projects?	
Support the sister projects	Current branding indicates a system of projects. How, explicitly, will using Wikipedia improve understanding/use of sister projects?	
Legal risks	Current branding distinguishes movement from projects, protecting affiliates from potential legal risk for Wikipedia content.	
Support movement growth	Branding should directly aid movement understanding, participation, and growth worldwide.	
Process of change	Is it "too late" for change to Movement branding? Or is "now the time" to invite new volunteers with branding change?	








Different species of trees (CC0 Public Domain)





Leaf morphology terms (CC BY-SA 4.0)

Collaboration is the process of two or more people or organizations working together to complete a task or achieve a goal. [1] Collaboration is similar to cooperation. Most collaboration requires leadership, although the form of leadership can be social within a decentralized and egalitarian group. [2] Teams that work collaboratively of access greater resources, recognition and rewards when facing competition for finite resources.

Structured methods of collaboration encourage introspection of behavior and communication. [2] Such methods aim to increase the success of teams as they engage in collaborative problem-solving.

Collaboration is present in opposing goals exhibiting the notion of acvertarial collaboration, though this is not a common true of the term.
