

DELIVERY OF SEEDS

All vegetable and flower seeds in this price list except Peas, Beans, Sweet, Corn and Spinach will be sent prepaid by parcel post, express or freight at our option.

Peas, Beans, Sweet Corn and Spinach will not be sent prepaid unless they are included in any one order to the value of \$20.00 or more.

The above offer to pay transportation does not apply to Field and Grass seed, Potatoes, Onion Sets, Fertilizers, etc. Articles other than seeds listed in this catalogue are sent at purchaser's expense except where they are quoted "Transportation paid."

Seeds ordered sent by *express* will be so sent at the purchaser's expense.

About Ordering, Shipping, Etc.

Orders may be sent at any time and goods will be shipped at the time specified on the order. Freight shipments are now handled by the railroads much more promptly than formerly and we advise having all heavy shipments (100 lbs. or more) sent in that way.

When ordering seeds shipped by freight or express please be sure to give the name of your nearest freight railroad station or express office if it is different from your postoffice address.

25% of the value of the order must accompany all orders for goods shipped C.O.D.

Quick Service

You can be assured when you send us an order that you will not have to wait and wait for your seeds. During the busy season orders are sent out the day after they arrive, and the fast mail, express and freight service we have now will get them to you quickly and in good order.

Terms and Discounts

Our regular terms are cash with order. When cash is sent with order we allow a discount of 5% which may be deducted from the total amount of the order.

To gardeners of established credit and those who furnish us with satisfactory references we allow the following time payments except on potatoes, field and grass seed, which are strictly cash with order.

Bills for seeds, plants, etc., shipped after January 1st are due and payable *net* August 1st. Bills for goods shipped after August 1st are due *net* December 1st.

Conditions of Sale

We assume responsibility of the seeds, plants and bulbs we sell reaching the purchaser in good condition and should any seeds fail to grow under favorable circumstances, we will refund the money paid for them or replace them without charge if notified at once. However, in common with all responsible seedsmen, all our seeds, plants and bulbs are sold on the distinct understanding and with the agreement by the purchaser that we will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue by reason of the failure of the seeds, plants or bulbs to grow or to be of the variety or quality offered. We will not accept or fill orders under any other conditions.

Northern Grown Seeds

"It is of greatest importance to gardeners living in the Northern states to have crops that mature quickly, so as to escape injury from frost before the whole crop is developed. It is well known that plants quickly adapt themselves to climatic conditions. Corn raised in the North and taken to the South will in a few years become later, and if brought back to the North, will not mature in the short growing season we have.

The same is true of other crops, such as tomatoes, peppers, melons, etc. We find that peppers, tomatoes and melons grown from seed raised in the North not only mature earlier but also produce larger crops than plants from southern

grown seed."

We have raised our special varieties here on Moreton Farm for many years. Our careful breeding work together with the fact that only the earliest and most vigorous kinds will mature and produce seed here in the North, make Harris' Northern Grown seed much superior to the same varieties produced in the South and West.

Crops on Moreton Farm

In spite of the fact that we have had an exceptionally dry summer, most of our seed crops on Moreton Farm have proved in the whole to be very satisfactory. Our crops of tomatoes were entirely free from blight, the vines staying green right up to frost. Our peppers particularly "King of the North" and Harris' Early Giant, yielded large crops of fine fruit and the seed is the best we have had in years. Among our other crops such as Blue Hubbard Squash, Model Parsnip, Bender's Surprise, Delicious and Sugar Rock Melons and Harris' Ballhead Cabbage, the dry weather affected the yield somewhat, but the seed is particularly fine and of high germination. Our increased acreage in most things has assured us ample seed to fill our normal demands.

Although our Sweet Corn crops suffered some from the draught, we harvested sufficient good seed to cover our normal requirements, with the exception of Buttercup, which will be short. We advise growers who depend on this variety to place their orders early.

Not only tested, but the *results* of the *test* are shown on a label which is attached to every package or lot of seed sold. This is information that is not given by other dealers. It has been found of great help to those who use Harris' Seeds. By consulting the label you can tell just how thick to sow the seed so as to get an even stand of plants without using an unnecessary quantity of seed which often causes a great deal of time and labor by thinning.










Photo shows Harris' Model Parsnips exactly as dug.




