4. Role of Allied Council. It is to be noted that the occupation authority is now vested in 3 agencies: The Far Eastern Commission for the formulation of policies; the Supreme Commander for execution; and the Allied Council for advice and consultation with certain limited powers to cause executive action to be temporarily withheld in specified instances. There is no direct relationship between the Far Eastern Commission and the Allied Council, the latter being a separate body whose inherent value depends upon its independent operation under the control of the 4 participating powers.

5. Information regarding the progress of occupation required by the Commission. It is the intent of the U.S. Government to keep the Commission at all times adequately informed of the progress of the occupation, to the end that the Commission's policy decisions may be made in the full light of all necessary facts. When the Commission is of the opinion that its information on a subject within its jurisdiction is inadequate for its purposes, it should make the fact known to the U.S. Government, which will make every effort to meet the Commission's requirements. In addition, the Commission may arrange through its chairman for direct consultation with the Supreme Commander. Such consultation may, in the event of clear desirability, include visits to Japan by the Commission or one or more of its representatives. Such visits should be held to a minimum to avoid unnecessarily involving the Commission in the recognized chain of command from the U.S. Government to the Supreme Commander, or in the functions of the Allied Council. The Far Eastern Commission, is authorized to meet in other places than Washington as occasion requires, including Tokyo, if and when it deems it desirable to do so; but it is not a function of the Commission to maintain continuous inspection in Japan of the Supreme Commander's action in implementation of directives received by him."

Records and other sources also believed to provide valuable info concerning German scientists currently proposed for permanent immigration to US.

Request G 2 be directed:

1. To place under its control all available records, including chapter records.
2. If Berlin records unavailable, to take all steps possible to obtain copies records and liquidation report.
3. To identify available members and offs and investigate thoroughly present activity and future plans for continuity.

USPOLAD has State communications containing much additional info this subject.

Concur that present movement and unexpected exodus of Jewish refugees from Poland has created critical situation in Austria. State has addressed notes to Polish and Czechoslovak Govts requesting agreement with you on prior clearances for train movements of refugees. Notes repeated to AUSPOLAD, Vienna, for your info.

State opened discussions on diplomatic level with British Govt and Italian Govt concerning your recommendation for transfer of 20,000 refugees to DP camps Milan and Bari within next 60 days.

In view British concurrence to absorb 1500 refugees and importance of problem for all Austria, request you bring matter to attention Allied Council at next meeting and propose agreement for equitable absorption of Jewish refugees in all zones of occupation. State considers that agreement can be reached for equitable sharing burden of maintenance refugees while in Austria and should be borne by all occupying powers.

To MacArthur from the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

The following, received from the State, War and Navy Departments as a statement of the position of the U.S. Government in the matter, is forwarded for your information. Departments have requested State Department to forward it to the US member of the Far Eastern Commission for the Commission's consideration:

Statement begins.

"1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (SCAP) shall be authorized to restore to Nationals of any of the United Nations at war with Japan identifiable property, tangible or intangible, owned by them and located in Japan prior to December 7, 1941, and seized, confiscated, or sequestered, formally or otherwise, during the recent war by the Japanese government, members of its Armed Forces, or by official or private Japanese or other enemy individuals or groups, regardless of the present ownership of such property, except that gold, other precious metals, foreign exchange and large-scale commercial and industrial enterprises shall not be restored at this time, and provided further that:

a. Restoration subject to SCAP's discretion, shall be made only to:

(I) Natural persons in Japan.

(II) Small-sized business, commercial and service corporations where the stockholders of a controlling interest

are United Nations Nationals now resident in Japan.

(III) Charitable and religious institutions financed primarily by non-Japanese funds, where a duly authorized agent or properly qualified person is resident in Japan to receive title.

b. SCAP is satisfied as to the identification of such property.

2. For the purpose of determining whether property was in fact confiscated it shall be assumed that all property taken by the Japanese or other enemy government, Armed Forces, or Nationals during the recent war from Nationals of any of the United Nations at war with Japan was confiscated whether or not payment was made at the time of acquisition unless it can be definitely shown that no duress or fraud was involved.

3. If payment to restorer was made at the time of confiscation, SCAP shall require persons repossessing the property to agree to remit such amounts to the Japanese Government as a prerequisite to restoration. However, actual payment of such amounts shall be made only after settlement of claims as specified in paragraph 4 below.

4. The restoration of property shall be made without prejudicing the claim of the original owners against the Japanese or other enemy government and/or their Nationals for damages to property, rent, depreciation, and other ascertainable losses.

5. If funds received in payment for confiscated property were blocked by the Japanese government, such funds shall be unblocked and the owner permitted to draw upon them on the same basis as depositors in general draw upon their bank funds, except that in the event that the confiscated property is returned such funds shall be transferred to the Japanese Government in accordance with paragraph 3 above.

6. The right to restoration of confiscated property provided in the foregoing paragraphs and even the completion of restoration shall in no manner preclude properties from being assigned to reparations as a prior claim, in which case

the original owners of such property shall receive only a general claim against the Japanese or other enemy government and their Nationals.

7. The right to restoration provided in the foregoing paragraphs and even the completion of restoration shall not be considered as the basis for permission to operate certain properties where SCAP considers the operations of such property injurious to the occupying forces or to the purposes of the occupation. Similarly, the operation of properties considered by SCAP to be beneficial to the occupying Forces and/or the accomplishment of the purposes of the occupation shall not await restoration of title or the transfer of possession of such properties.

8. Japanese Nationals injured by the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs shall look to the Japanese Government for relief.

9. Although the foregoing applies only to property owned by persons presently in Japan, the provisions contained herein should not operate to discriminate against other United Nations Nationals who may own property located in Japan. It is recognized that the office of the Civil Property custodian on SCAP's staff is concerned with investigating and listing other allied property for which direct restoration or claims against the Japanese or other enemy government may be made at a later date. SCAP's recommendations on this matter should be solicited. Specifically, SCAP should be requested to advise whether he is prepared administratively to restore 1 or more of the following types of property to United Nations Nationals outside of Japan: Tangible, intangible, personal, commercial; and whether shipping is available to permit such restoration."

State Dept proposes, if you concur, to approach Soviet Govt along fol lines on subj repatriation Japanese from Soviet controlled areas:

US Govt particularly desirous terms of Potsdam Declaration providing for return their homes of disarmed Japanese Mil Forces be carried out, and willing cooperate with Soviet Govt to end that such forces are repatriated from Soviet controlled areas.

It is understood that Soviet representatives Tokyo unable under present instructions to discuss repatriation mil pers in add to civilian pers and have confined discussion to certain areas. Furthermore it has thus far been impossible to reach agreement on provision of fuel and sups for repatriation ships.

US Govt is of opinion that discussion repatriation of Japanese from Soviet controlled areas must take into consideration both mil and civilian pers with priorities given mil pers accordance with Potsdam Declaration. Furthermore it is felt discussion must include all areas where Japanese pers may be found. Regard provision of fuel and other sups, US Govt of opinion that govts in adm control of areas from which Japanese being repatriated must bear cost supplying necessary fuel and provisions for evacuation vessels in first instance. Costs such sups may later be included in reparations claims against Japan.

Food, transportation, business and business prospects, present mechanics of Govt British-American Zones, business relations 2 zones with Russia, it seems to me would be most interesting topics."

Bratter has wed 28 Aug booking American Air Lines, which he is anxious to maintain. Will appreciate prompt advice.

External restitution is sub.

1. Reurad State advises liberated ships agreement appears to be with UK only so far as US concerned. It does not appear US signed agreement with Belgians, Dutch or any govt other than UK. This being investigated further. Also being investigated is question whether language of agreement in any way commits US VIS-A-VIS govts other than UK. Pending further advice, you should act on assumption US agreement is with UK only. This permits you to follow normal restitution practices.

2. Further State submits fol gen restitution questions prompted in part by urad. Urad June CC 7581 appreciated. However, you do not indicate whether you are fol amendments to WARX 85965 or whether you follow ACC agreement on these points. Amendment WARX 82436 of Mar 28 related to barges and WARX 86853 of May 4 related to seagoing vessels. You follow amendment WARX 82436 rather than ACC agreement on Danubian barges. Urad July CC 9779 however indicates you follow ACC agreement on seagoing vessels rather than WARX 86853. Under ACC agreement what disposition would be made of property looted from Latvia, Lithuania, and Estonia? This treated in May WARX 86428. Please advise soonest.

State Dept requests your comments soonest for situation:

Kinetic CMLS, Inc, US corp owned 51% DuPont, 49% GM, on 5 Oct 38 licensed IG Farben manufacture and sell freon gas Germany and Austria. Royalties payable Kinetic on all freon produced. Between 11 June and 9 July 1940, IG was auth export freon to specified countries continental Europe, Kinetic reserving right to cancel upon notice. Possible question length of notice either 60 days or 6 mos.

Kinetic informed by its former Danish distributor Holger Andreasen that Danes receiving freon. (also called frigen) from Hoechst, presumably via OMGUS, are paying dollars therefor.

Kinetic will soon seek Treas license notify IG cancellation auth export.

Kinetic asserts legal right to terminate license. Having valid patent in importing countries Kinetic intends to prevent importation from Germany and to acquire market for US exports.

GEPC in POLAD rad 1397 May 31 from Berlin to Wash sent Madrid 59, raised number of questions re nature powers of atty requested by American Embassy Madrid. Madrids 1123 July 3 to Wash, sent Berlin 232, answered GEPCS inquiries.

Re rads raised important point nature powers of atty which needs clarification. State requests American Representative GEPC be instructed to expedite all requests Embassy Madrid for powers of atty which necessary for obtaining control important German firms in Spain such as Siemens, Banco Aleman Transatlantico, Continental, etc. Such powers of atty should contain clause authorizing holder of power to dispose corporate shares. It is recognized that Articles VI and VII of Law 5 restrict disposal. Understand Heseltine apmt to Civil Property Custodian Office originally requested by SCAP. British have been inquiring State Department on status of his apmt and also on apmts of one petroleum expert, one agricultural expert and one fisheries expert believed to have been wanted by SCAP and who are prepared to accept such positions. However, if unusual delay occurs these individuals may reverse their decisions. Pursuant to request Asst Secy State fol msg dispatched:

"I spent 1 1/2 hours today with Paul Appleby of the Bureau of the Budget. In view of the fact that Oliver Echols is in Japan and will not be back for several weeks, I thought it best to undertake this mission alone. Mr Appleby would not give me a final answer. He will think it over and I will see him about it again in a day or two. My judgement is that there is about a 50/50 chance that he will accept. There are 2 important stumbling blocks in the way of his acceptance. One is that Mr Webb, the new Dir of the Budget has only been in that seat a week and in addition to shortness of his time in Budget he has had very little experience in Federal Govt. For these reasons Appleby does not how know when he can in conscious lv his present asgmt. He is a little afraid that Mr Webb will want him to remain for a minimum of 3 or 4 months. Prior to my visit to him this morning, Mr Appleby had already decided to lv the Bureau within the next year in order to re-enter private business. He is in his middle 50s and he tells me he has no nest egg. He therefore has been giving thought in recent months to acquiring a competence for his old age. I rather think that this rather than the advent of a new dir will be my principal stumbling block. I will keep after him, however, and will keep you informed of developments. Have you any alternates to suggest in the event that I fail to sign Appleby up?"

(Austrians have not yet reached decision concerning acceptance invitations membership ECO).

2. Pmt for coal must be made directly to British element Germany as Germany is operated in zonal compartments.

3. All German elements insist on dollar pmts. Austria has no dollars. UNRRA funds this purpose. Price for Ruhr coal quoted US by British element appears excessive compared world prices. Believe price adjustments should be established multilaterally at high level.

Question has arisen: Should coal losses through Germany be borne by Austria or at shippers risk? Believe Austrian responsibility should begin Austro-German border only.

Believe in interest of US objectives Europe clarification this coal policy and connected problems essential and that implementing instructions should be sent from Wash to US element Germany earliest."

2. Further to July WARX 95225, fol add recommendations are made:

A. Price of German coal is of interest to all importing countries, therefore Austrian position should be made clear to ACA, Berlin, which presumably will consider matter on complaint by Austrians and other importing nations. State does not wish to take position of prices for German coal without benefit of consideration by ACA, Berlin.

B. Re question of coal lost in transit through Germany. It is believed agreement should be reached between Austrian and German auths concerned, however, State feels German auths should accept responsibility for losses in Germany.

C. When Austrian coal reqmts are handled through ECO it is expected that UNRRA will claim an inadequate amount due to limitation of their funds, however Austrian Govt would probably claim supplemental amounts presenting strong

D. In ECO US strongly and apparently successfully opposed Polish proposal to ignore in framing ECO allocation Polish coal delivered under bilateral trade agreements.

E. State estimates it is likely that principle will be accepted by ECO that sp supplemental allocations will be made to countries then this would enable them to produce exports which would increase coal production and trans.

F. If ECO will adopt par E above, Austria could ask for supplemental allocation in proportion to extent to which power sent from Austria to Germany increases German coal exports.

US Gov cannot accept figures given in your letter re number of Sov citizens in Am Zone. Statement attributed to Lt Col McFeely was apparently written into Sov minutes of conference which took place in Vienna Apr 15. This statement was not accepted by Lt Col McFeely when Sov minutes were circulated later and was specifically denied by him in letter of May 8 addressed to Col Starov.

Dissemination of propaganda among DPs in Am Zone subject to careful surveillance of US Military Authorities. If articles appear which carry anti-Soviet propoganda, proceedings against offenders are instituted in courts of US Military Gov. Posters displayed in all camps warn against any act or publication in nature of anti-Soviet propoganda and specify consequences of violations of rules.

US Gov is appreciative of measures which were taken by Sov Gov to effect repatriation of Am citizens liberated by Red Army and feels that it has given Sov Authorities every assistance in effecting repatriation of Sov Nationals from areas under Am military occupation. The US Gov desires to point out however that in effecting the repatriation of American citizens no US repatriation mission was permitted to enter Soviet Zones. Record indicates that more than 2,000,000 Soviet Nationals have been turned over to Sov authorities from such areas and US Gov is desirous of completing repatriation of any remnants at earliest possible date and in accordance with US Govts interpretation of Yalta Agreement. CGUSFA is accordingly prepared to permit small repatriation mission to enter Am Zone in Austria for limited period to complete work of repatriation when a plan of operations acceptable to US Command has been agreed upon. It is suggested that Sov commander in Austria communicate with CGUSFA with view to working out necessary arrangements. Activities of the proposed mission will be subject to the authority of CGUSFA within limits established by cited arrangements.

State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee has considered  
CC 5635, CC 7968, CC 8563 and Colm-Dodge-Goldsmith Program  
and concludes as follows:

A. SWNCC approves principles of first step referred to in CC 5635 which is designed to eliminate monetary overhang. Also apd in principle are measures designed to prevent gain or advantage from financial reform and to reduce disparity of loss resulting therefrom as between owners of monetary claims and owners of other assets. Further SWNCC considers that Germany should have program to take care of most needy victims of war and to eliminate excessive war gains.

B. With respect to more comprehensive proposals for equalizing gen war losses contained in Colm-Dodge-Goldsmith Plan (as distinguished from losses specified in subpar A above), we do not approve at this time extension of proposal to cover all types of war losses nor do we now approve mortgage method outlined in step 2 of plan. However, you are auth to discuss these subjs with other members of Allied Control Council and to place before them related proposals envisaged in steps 2 and 3 of plan.

C. Doubts here on equalization of gen war losses concern scope of program. Whether program is proper responsibility of mil govt, whether it appears to be economically or

administratively feasible, or whether it will result in too great concentration of economic power in govt with consequent strifling of private initiative, are questions which cannot be answered without further elaboration of plan itself. It is requested that you forward at proper time your recommendations as to types of war losses which should be recognized, your estimate of ability of German economy to provide partial compensation for such losses as well as ability of available administrative machinery to implement program, and your comments on concentration of economic authority.

D. Insofar as mortgage procedure of step 2 is concerned, we believe that alternative methods such as sp property tax and capital gains tax should be carefully explored in course of quadripartite discussions. Your further recommendations at proper time on this aspect of program are also requested.

excerpt from 2 Aug NY Times article entitled "Japanese  
testing of silk opposed" based upon interview with silk  
trade: "Any attempt to impose Japanese tests for silk  
grading will meet heavy resistance among silk weavers and  
traders within US it was learned yesterday following  
publication of a report fr Tokyo that a 'Silk expert'  
on Gen MacArthur's Staff has urged tests be conducted by  
Japanese conditioning houses and that the USCC be eliminated  
fr handling silk.

"Traders of raw silk in NY have previously voiced  
their dissatisfaction with the current method of silk  
handling by the USCC whereby it is sold on a sealed bid  
basis instead of being put up for auction to the highest  
bidder. They emphasized however the dependability of  
American tests has been fully established, whereas there  
is considerable doubt concerning Japanese tests. From  
past experience, the traders said, silk purchased here  
on Japanese tests proved to be fr 2 to 3 points lower in  
grade when subjected to American testing methods. With  
the best grades of silk selling around \$16 a lb such a  
condition would mean American buyers would be paying from  
25 to 50 cents more per lb than that particular grade  
warranted, it was pointed out."

Testing here is better than in New York. If these changes are made Japan could provide America with at least 15,000 bales monthly, provided all types and all grades were shipped."

Mr Magagna said raw silk stocks on hand July 1, before new silk began arriving, amounted to 90,000 bales. He also asserted the United States Commercial Company's failure to act had frozen 156 million square yards of pure silk piece goods here for which world textile markets are clamoring. Since SCAP reopened silk trade 55,000 bales have been shipped or scheduled for shipment. 13,100 bales have been sold in New York

Above comes WD as complete surprise. No basis here to support Magagnas statements. As you know all WD dealings with USCC have been entirely satisfactory. Pres Schieck USCC has asked WD for official denial, stating that if Magagnas statement represents either WD or theater views he would seek to withdraw USCC participation. He has been assured that it does not represent WD views and was advised WD assumes Magagnas quoted statements were not cleared by SCAP and if in fact any portion export program unsatisfactory to SCAP discussion would be confined to official channels. Numerous inquiries by press here embarrassing WD and USCC. USCC requests that SCAP consider issuance press release Tokyo stating Magagnas views are not those of theater authorities. Please discuss with SCAP.

A. Hq UNRRA Wash points out similar proposal for British zone, Germany was objected to by UNRRA, ERO, at this time; it therefore suggests, and WD concurs, proposed release be withheld until conclusion UNRRA council meeting, Geneva, beginning 5 Aug unless Dir Gen UNRRA personally approves earlier release.

B. WD, State and Hq UNRRA Wash wish to assure proposed release not discourage voluntary repatriation nor engender passive attitude among DP and UNRRA pers by creating impression that USFET is ready and willing to assume UNRRAs present DP responsibility other than on temporary, emergency basis. Hence proposed release cited urad S 7183 should be amended to read substantially as follows:

1. Par 2, sentence 1; substitute: "With the Army entering an interim stage between full mil occupation which began VE Day and the constabulary type occupation which became eff 1 July and with possible discontinuance of UNRRA in the US zone, USFET Hq has evolved contingent plans to meet situation in event proposed international refugee organization, expected to be established by UN Gen Assembly meeting in Sep, is unable to assume responsibility for administering DP centers immediately upon UNRRA termination."
