At the Court at Windsor Castle, the 28th day of April 1972

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that by reason of urgency this Order requires to be made without a draft having been approved by resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(3) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972(a), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Title and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Appropriation (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 and shall come into operation on 2nd May 1972.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(b) shall apply for the interpretation of the following provisions of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

Issue and appropriation of moneys for services in Northern Ireland

3.—(1) The sums granted and authorised to be issued by the Consolidated Fund Act (Northern Ireland) 1972(c) out of the Consolidated Fund towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty, amounting, as appears by that Act and by Schedule (A), in the aggregate to the sum of one hundred and fifty-one million, twenty thousand, two hundred and ninety-seven pounds, may, notwithstanding the prorogation of the Parliament of Northern Ireland by section 1(3) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972 without the grants having been appropriated, be so issued and are hereby appropriated for the several services and purposes expressed in Schedule (B).

(2) In addition to the sums granted as mentioned in paragraph (1) out of the Consolidated Fund, the sums which, under the Appropriation Acts (Northern Ireland) 1971(a) were authorised to be applied as appropriations in aid for the year ended 31st March 1972, shall be treated as having been increased or, as the case may be, decreased by the sums respectively set forth in columns 3 and 4 of Part II of Schedule (B) in respect of the several services specified in that Part.

(3) This Article shall have effect in relation to any sum issued or appropriated in aid before the commencement of this Order as if this Order had been in force at the time that sum was issued or appropriated.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order authorises the issue of moneys out of the Consolidated Fund of Northern Ireland and appropriates those moneys for specified services in Northern Ireland, including moneys issued before the coming into operation of the Order.

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
