WAR TAX WILL BE ADDED

Base Ball Admissions Likely to Be Increased 10 Per cent.

New York, May 15.—A special meeting here of the National League of professional baseball clubs, various phases of the baseball situation which have arisen since the opening of the season were considered.

Among the subjects discussed by the club owners and league officers is the government tax upon gate receipts; the possible conscription of players for army service; reduction of club rosters and reports of conditions in the cities represented by senior league teams.

President John K. Tener outlined a plan whereby the 10 per cent tax upon admission charges to ball parks would be assessed on the purchasers of tickets. In a general way, it is proposed to levy an additional charge beginning next month.

OFFER SERVICES TO JOHN M.

Seventy-one Have Already Volunteered for Roosevelt Army

Seventy-one men have offered their services to Col. John M. Parker for the Roosevelt division. A telegram yesterday was received from Capt. Ronen Bock, former captain of the old Jefferson Guards, in which he offered the services of several citizens in his community.

Captain Bock has had considerable military experience. When the war broke out with Germany he sent out a call, but as he only enlisted seventy-one men and was unable to bring his company to war strength he decided to offer the services of the men to Colonel Roosevelt.

The proposed conscription of men for the army between the ages of 21 and 30 years of age is expected to deprive the various clubs of the services of one or more of their players and provision will have to be made to replace such members of the teams by men drawn from either the minors or other sources.
