Why do we need them?

- > Someone has the data! many institutions have in their possession author databases, photographies, multimedia that they can donate to the world.
- Many of them don't know they can share that knowledge. It is up to us, the community, to help and guide them along the way.
- Someone has to upload the data!
- > They bring new ideas to the table. And maybe new institutions to talk too.

What can we offer?

- > Tools and workshops on data triage: Many tools that we commonly use on Wikidata might help them on their work.
- Authority control: Not all national libraries know they can add their authority control on the Wikimedia Projects
- Visibility: More traffic on their institutional sites, which translates to more online visits from people all over the world.
- > Food (of course)
- A way to share experiences, follow up, connect people, bring new tools to strengthen the projects.
- A space to learn new things, not only new tools to use in the project (i.e. train in Python to learn programming and also use PyWikibot)
- Becoming part of a global community.

How did we work? With Wikimedia Argentina we...

- Made agreements with libraries and archives to liberate data to the world.
- Mentored cultural ambassadors about the benefits of sharing data and upload it to Wikidata
- > Using the new content, we made workshops to teach everyone to use Wikidata and spread the word
- Organized monthly meetups
- > Started a Telegram channel
- Gave workshops and presentations during free software events.
