Note. -- It is not uncommon for Doubloons and parts of Doubloons to be light-Doubloons should be as heavy as American dollars. An act of Congress, March 3, 1843. legalized this kind of gold at 89 cents 9 mills per dwt. When light its true value may be got at by weighing it with American silver, allowing 77 cents for the weight of a fine cent piece. Portugal and Brazil pieces can be tested by allowing 80 cents for the neight of a five cent piece.



When gold coins have been clipped, or made light by any other process, the following will enable you to ascer tain their value-the test is with American silver.

Half-Eagle is equal in weight to*...314 cents of silver.

Sovereign is equal in weight to....30 cents of silver.

Napoleon is a shade lighter than...25 cents of silver.

Doubloon is equal in weight to....100 cents of silver. X-Thaler is a shade lighter than.. 50 cents of silver.. Ten Guilder is equal in weight to . 25 cents of silver.

RULES TO BE OBSERVED IN USING THIS COIN CHART.

Those Coins used in Commerce: such as Sovereigns, 20 Franc Pieces, X Thalers, Spanish and Patriot Doubloons and Dollars, &c., will of course fluctuate, with the difference between demand and supply. Their quotation in this book can only correspond with their value in trade, and what they are actually worth in passing from hand to hand.

Other pieces there are among the Silver Coins, (indicated by an asterisk *,) which in many cases fall short in weight or fineness, and are not worth what the full weight and standard pieces are. These we have quoted low, to meet the value of the depreciated pieces.
