DEATH OF AN OLD PILOT.

Joseph Henderson, one of the oldest, wealthiest, and most widely known pilots in the New
York Bandy Hook service, died yesterday of
peritonitis at his home in Brooklyn. Mr.
Henderson was connected with pilot-boat
America No. 2, and returned from a cruise on
Monday last. He has been in the pilot service
forty-five years, and was a Government pilot
during the war. He leaves a widow and three
sons. He was worth \$100,000.

Henderson took the steamer Trutonic to sea on her first westward race across the Atlantic with the City of New York. He it was who piloted the Baltimore to the ocean on the occasion of the Ericeson funeral. The funeral will take place from his late residence, N . 633 Willoughly Avenue, and will be attended by a number of shipping men, steamship officers, and the Board of Pilot Commissioners.
