PETITION

Representing 5 other people, Ito and Minato visited here this morning to seek the advice of labor officer in regard with their employment and retirement allowances.

1. They had been working as drivers for the Etajima Motor Pool. They got discharge notices just thirty days ago. With their 'advance-discharge-notification-period' expiring today, they were sent to the Etajima AFLMO.

A Sergeant in charge of indigenous labor suggested them to work as laborers. They refused because their wages as laborers would be too small after transportation fares have been gouged out. Then the Sergeant said, they claim, that they will not be paid retirement allowances.

They further quoted the Sergeant as saying that their names will be put on the black list and that they will never given any job by the Occupation Forces.

2. They questioned Mr. Lord of the authenticity of the Sergeant's story. Mr. Lord got contact with the Sergeant. There was much discrepancy between the visitor's story and Sergeant's. Mr. Lord explained the bewildered visitors what the Sergeant had to say.

The Sergeant story runs as follows:

a. He explained the drivers discharged that they will be reinstated in their former position when the expansion work of Etajima School has been completed. He suggested them to work as laborers only temporarily to stop up the vacuum in employment.

b. He said to them that their refusal to the new placement will be considered when they want to get jobs in Etajima.

c. He thinks that they are eligible for the retirement allowance.

2. Mr. Kawasaki, Chief, Employment Section, Kure PESO explained the situation as follows:
  - a. Since the Labor Requisition Order was submitted to PESO, steps were taken; (a) Publicity thru newspaper twice, (b) Publicity thru radio once.
  - b. All PESOs were requested to refer interpreters available to Kure PESO thru Hiroshima Prefectural PESO's Liaison Meeting which is held twice a month.
  - c. In view of the demands for interpreters in Yamaguchi and some other prefectures, it is considered that there are few capable interpreters in other prefectures as well as Hiroshima.
  - d. Kure PESO will continue it's effort in order to fulfill the Etajima Labor Requisition as soon as possible thru other PESOs as suggested by Mr. Domanowski.

Conference was held between Mr. Keisel and Mr. Ishida <sup>Natural</sup> PESO, Mr. Tomiyasu Occupation Force Labor Management Office.

1. The conference was in furtherance of the conference held between Mr. Domanowski and the aforementioned officials on the subject matter, 7 December 1950.

2. The two officials were called in as the result of the conference held yesterday between Mr. Keisel and Major Harrison and Major Lockhard of BCOF in which BCOF officers agreed upon the method decided upon to recruit labor expeditiously and properly without receiving the police assistance.

3. PESO and OFLM chiefs were informed of the method to be used hereafter, which is BCOF will give two copies of labor requisition to the Occupation Force Management Office. At this point, the responsibility of recruiting labor is placed in the hands of the Japanese agencies and it will be up to OFLM Office to carry the ball from that point on.

4. Following suggestions were made:

a. The OFLM Office will forward one copy of the labor requisition to PESO by hand carrier. The OFLM will log in and out the exact time it received the requisition and the exact time the requisition was sent to PESO.

b. PESO in turn will log in the exact time it receive the requisition and the time the requisition was fulfilled. This was recommended for their mutual protection in case issues arise because of delay in the recruit of labor.

c. That PESO will receive a list of former employees of BCOF and register each as prospective applicants so that if request is made by name, the procedure can be expedited as to whether or not the designated person will be available.

5. For the time being, both PESO and OFLM Office were requested to report the progress of the new method Monday of each week until it could be



proved that this system will work out effectively. Following information were requested: the week

- a. Number of requisition received during the week.
- b. Number of labor recruited during the week.
- c. Requisition log in and out-time from DFIM Office.
- d. Time required to fulfil requisition on the part of PISO.
- e. Progress on the registration of ex-BCOF employees and prospective applicant.

6. Finally, both parties were informed that since they are working for common aim that their work should be coordinated and that there should be no personal disagreement on any problem, and to report immediately of any hitch encountered so that the situation can be remedied before BCOF starts complaining of ineffectiveness of the operation.
