appears that General Teran has been...
appointed by the Vice President, General...
in Chief of a division of 2,100 men, which...
are to be marched to this Department for...
protection of its inhabitants, against the...
inroads of the Indians. This force is to...
be formed of 600 infantry and 300 cavalry...
from San Luis Potosi; 400 infantry from...
Zacatecas; 300 from New Leon; 300 from...
Tamaulipas; and 200 from Coahuila and...
Texas. The different states from which...
these forces are to be drawn, are called...
upon to use every exertion to furnish...
and equip the troops, on account of the...
scarcity and want of funds in the...
National Treasury.

LONDON, FEB. 25.

We really consider the division upon...
Lord John Russell's motion on Tuesday...
evening to be rather a triumph for his...
Lordship's principle than a defeat. But...
let it be well understood what that...
principle was. It was not favorable to...
any general theoretic Parliamentary...
reform—to any dissolution and fanciful...
recomposition of the present House of...
Commons: it simply avowed, that three...
places of immense population should be...
represented in Parliaments. Nor did it...
assert the right of popular representation...
only. His Lordship made a calculation...
of the property in those places, and his...
motion required a representation for...
property as well as persons, or for...
masses of persons in proportion to...
their property. Against such a motion, then...
with something, certainly, of the

feared odium of Parliamentary reform...
(though most unjustly hanging about...
it—there was only a majority of forty...
eight in a House consisting of three...
hundred and twenty-eight Members. This...
we again state to be a triumph; and...
as surely as the Catholic question has...
been carried, so surely will it be...
carried, that Manchester, Leeds, and...
Birmingham—places so swarming in...
population, so large in extent, and...
abounding with so much property—shall...
have a voice in the councils of the...
nation.—Times.

The great question of Parliamentary...
Reform has, according to annual...
usage, been submitted to the...
consideration of the House of Commons. Although...
the declared object of the Noble...
Mover was to engage the House to...
adopt a plan of a limited extent, and...
for a specific purpose, yet we have...
advisedly designated it as a Motion for...
Parliamentary Reform generally, for...
to that consummation it would...
inevitably lead. We are, therefore, opposed...
to it on broad general principle. Lord...
John Russell proposed to restrict the...
extension of the franchise to the three...
great towns, Manchester, Leeds, and...
Birmingham, thereby numerically...
augmenting the House of Commons by...
six additional Members. Has the Noble...
Mover maturely weighed the claims...
of other unrepresented towns? Can he...
believe that an example of this kind...
will not be eagerly caught at and...
immediately urged? With what justice...
could Birmingham claim a privilege...
which was denied to Sheffield? What...
Magic is there in the arbitrary...
addition of six, which gives it an...
advantage over twelve or twenty-four? Is...
not the House at this moment...
inconveniently numerous? Does not every...
human being, who knows any thing, know...
that the principle of Representation is...
general? Can any man deliberately say...
that any great manufacturing interest is...
not at this moment adequately...
represented for all practical purposes? In...
one word, is the proposed innovation...
necessary? No. Is it convenient? No. Is...
it just? No. Would it satisfy the...
advocates of Reform? No, no, no. While...
we dissent from the distinguished...
Noblemen with whom the debate...
originated, we can do full justice to the...
temperate, candid, and eminently able...
speech with which he introduced his...
motion. We think him wrong, but we are...
sure he is sincere, we reject his...
doctrines, but we applaud his candour...
and respect his ability. We would...
claim particular attention for the...
speech of Mr. Under-Secretary...
Twiss. We do this the more...
willingly—first, because we are...
sure the speech itself will amply...
reward the trouble—and, next, because...
we think we perceive a desire to...
comment upon the speaker with an...
asperity, which seems to us in...
favour of personal rather than...
political feeling. Courts.

Present State of Spain.—An article...
in the "Foreign Quarterly Review" under...
this title, contains a number of...
highly interesting particulars of the...
condition of that naturally fine country. It...
says, by the way, a merited...
compliment to a work which we have...
taken occasion to mention, the...
travels of the Rev. Joseph Townsend, in...
1786-87, as one "that will bear an...
advantageous comparison with any of a...
similar description either in the...
English or any other language." Though...
Spain is not represented as in the...
most prosperous condition, yet the...
reviewers assert that she has now...
as great a population and commerce...
as she has ever had. Don Antonio de...
Casimiro has the merit, they say, of...
having demonstrated the fallacy of the...
statements respecting her immense...
population and flourishing commerce...
during the reigns of Ferdinand and...
Isabella, and of Philip the Second. She...
has, in truth, sunk into insignificance, not...
from absolute decline, but because she...
has not made the same progress as...
other states. Her population, which in...
1787 was ten millions, may now be...
estimated at fourteen millions, and the...
increase since 1800 has been three...
millions, being about a sixth of the...
total number in 1800. In most of the...
seaport towns there has also, of late...
years, been a considerable improvement...
in the buildings; and in those of the...
north, rents have advanced considerably, and...
the houses are fully occupied. These...
facts deserve notice, both because they...
are not in accordance with the...
general notions, and because they...
demonstrate that, with a wise policy, the...
natural resources of the country could...
make her every thing that would be...
desired. In the province of Granada...
indeed, in Valencia and Catalonia, the...
increase of population has been...
vastly greater.

The state of agriculture, however, is...
lamentably bad. The vast accumulation...
of property in few hands, and the...
inalienable tenures by which they are...
held, have caused the usual results...
of oppression to the cultivators, and...
of final poverty even to the great...
proprietors. The rich lords, with...
enormous incomes, are obliged to keep...
up whole armies of retainers, according...
to that great law of a tendency to...
con-

sort of an equilibrium, which we have...
mentioned before. The lands in Leon, Castilla, &c. are unenclosed, the...
farmensils are clumsy and rude, and the...
roads neglected. Yet with the most...
slovenly culture, the produce is more...
than sufficient for the wants of the...
people. Except in Catalonia, Valencia and...
Murcia, corn is conveyed on the backs...
of mules and asses, or in small ox carts;...
and the effect of this clumsy transport...
on the foreign exportation may easily...
be imagined. The backward state of...
Spain cannot more strongly be inferred...
than from the fact, that though three...
and a half times as large as England, the...
outlay on roads does not amount to...
one-twentieth of the sum expended for...
the same purpose in the latter country. The...
additional consumption by cattle of the...
land in other ways, are thus vastly...
increased. The importance of roads is...
proved in Spain by the circumstance, that...
the districts in their immediate...
neighbourhood are cultivated, while...
others of greater fertility farther off, are...
often left entirely waste. Canals are...
little known, though wanted for...
irrigation.

Spain is the heaviest taxed country...
in Europe, taking into view the want of...
industry and commerce. The ostensible...
revenue of six millions sterling costs...
in the collection, in the opinion of well...
informed Spaniards, more than twelve...
millions. The taxes are unequal, and more...
than 16,000 persons are employed in the...
revenue. The troops are irregularly...
paid, and the fundholders fare no better. The...
income is generally less than the...
expenditure. The burdens imposed on the...
clergy are such as to have materially...
diminished their means, and many of...
them are indifferently enough provided for.

We defer to mention at present the...
state of manufactures, or the effect of...
the prevailing poverty on the moral and...
police of the country, and in producing...
pauperism. We have formerly contrasted...
the state of crime in the manufacturing...
country of England, with that existing...
in agricultural Spain. Pauperism and...
vice, it will be seen, are not...
necessarily connected with manufactures;...
but they are certainly so with...
great inequality of property.—Baltimore...
Americas.

GRAND CANAL IN HOLLAND.
Extract of a letter to a gentleman in...
New York, dated Amsterdam, 30th of...
January, 1830.—An event, which, in its...
consequences, is not without interest...
for our commerce with foreign...
countries, induces us to inform you of...
the happy result of an enterprise which...
may become of great importance to...
Amsterdam, and which proves more...
the advantage of the grand canal of...
North Holland. The object of it, was...
to cause the ice to be sawed for a...
distance of 20 leagues, to open a...
passage for the vessels detained in our...
port. A premature winter having taken...
by surprise many ships bound...
outwards, their owners, and those...
interested in their cargoes, determined...
to force their passage through the...
canal of North Holland to the New...
Diep, and from thence to the sea. This...
bold undertaking was commenced and...
notwithstanding numerous obstacles, excessive...
cold, and a great quantity of snow, was...
completed in some weeks, and on the...
27th inst. a number of vessels put to...
sea. Therefore experience has proved, that...
under similar circumstances, our...
communication with the ocean may be...
kept open; in this occurrence we...
see a proof, that spirit of energy in...
commerce, which at all times has...
distinguished this nation, still exists in...
full vigor in this city.
