SUBJECT: Nikolay Yakovlevich ALIBAEV (201-275,525)

1. The source of the following information is UNKNOWN (RS-2/37), a former KGB-style security officer whose name has been established to be Nikolay Yakovlevich ALIBAEV. An entry exists on the book "List of diplomatic couriers" (LDC), Volume 1, Category 10, which entry may be classified to BY/CB, classification 170.
2. In early June 1962, ALIBAEV was interviewed by Canadian (DND) personnel, and the two discussed classification of photographs of Soviet diplomatic couriers, and Soviet classifying data on each. He was asked to place our source by name or photograph.

3. The following entry appeared on the list given to ALIBAEV:

NAME	: ALIBAEV, Nikolay Yakovlevich
BORN	: 9.5.1911, Russia
TELE NO	: 06901 issued 11-3-57
TRAVEL to Canada	: 19 June 1957, accompanied by V.A. KREMEROV
POSITION	: Russian R.I.S. officer

4. When UNKNOWN saw this entry and the corresponding photograph, he commented that he thought it possible that ALIBAEV was identical with an officer he knew to be in the Dulepov Directorate and whom UNKNOWN reported the United States and Canada. (Whether ALIBAEV recognized him by name or by photograph is not clear from the record of the interview.) ALIBAEV added that when a KGB officer travels as a courier, he is usually accompanied by another KGB man. (Typical, e.g., see TPS) travel together.

5. As shown above, ALIBAEV was accompanied on his trip to Canada in June 1957 by "V.A. KREMEROV". A photograph and biographic data on KREMEROV appeared on the list that was shown to UNKNOWN but he failed to comment on the entry. (According to SR records, Vitaliy Yakovlevich KREMEROV, born on 20 April 1914, the subject of 201-104, 207, was identified by KREBIV as a "travel courier", date of info - 2054). His last recorded diplomatic courier trip took place in February 1960.

6. AB records on Filatov Yevgenyich ALEXEYEV (201-175,514) include no identification of his photograph (not by name) by DEDVANEK. DEDVANEK said he was probably identical with an officer he knew to have been in the KGB First Directorate (Foreign Directorate) as of the 1952-53 period who was possibly assigned to the American or British Department. This individual by the same name was identified as a communications intelligence unit officer attached to the East Berlin state security ministry as of the 1955-56 period. The Germans reported (PCB1-3620, 10 February 1963) that Alexeyev's trip to Canada in 1957 was for the purpose of collecting an agent in Canada "recruited" by the KGB legal service to Canada. The agent, Major Gerasimov claimed, was to have visited Moscow from Canada via the China rail (trans-Siberian). This information was later divulged by the Germans.

AKSENOV, Col. Nikolay

OSWALD is not known to have ever met AKSENOV. Marina said he once tried and was refused. Marina stated that she had an interview with ~~him~~ AKSENOV in order to try to expedite their exit visas (according to the diary, they applied in August 1961). Since Marina was notified ~~####~~ in late December 1961 that they would be granted visas, she must have seen him between August and December 1961. No other contact, ~~###~~ personal or written is known.

1. Nikolay Vasilyevich AKSENOV, KGB type now in Cyprus, was assigned to Cyprus in Feb 1961. There is no indication in his 201 that he left the country during 1961.

2. N.G. AKSENOV was reported by Berlin Base as a Soviet Trade Delegation official, possibly a KGB officer under cover, ~~####~~ apparently assigned to the STD in East Berlin in 1955 and 1956. No further info# which might confirm or deny identity with Col Nikolay.

3. Nikolay YAKOVLEVICH AKSENOV was chief of a communications intelligence group in the KGB residency in East Berlin from October 1956 until April 1957 (possibly earlier and later, but no info). No identifiable connection to Col. Nikolay.

4. Nikolay Yakovlevich AKSENOV was Soviet courier on the North America Scandinavia run in spring 1957 on two trips. Jan and Feb 1958, France and Belgium. No information identifying him with Col. Nikolay.

5. Nikolay Aleksandrovich AKSENOV NTS employee in Frankfurt, Germany, 1954-5.

6. Nikolay ~~M~~KSENOV, Soviet Air Force

7. Nikolay AKSENOV, born 1884, reported from Japan in 1954.
