New York: Colored fowl continued to move well at prevailing selling levels. Fancy New England vearlings sold readily dut nearby leghorn fowl met a limited request and prices were shaded in an effort to clear. Truck receipts of springs were light to moderate with heavy carryovers. Stock showed wide range in size, quality and condition. Liceral concessions were offered in order to effect a clearance. However, supplies were not entirely cleared at the close. Market weaker. Miscellaneous items such as ducks, radbits, roosters, squabs and pigeons sold slowly as quoted Market irregular. The following are wholesale selling prices as reported by the trage on this morning's market? cross, droilers, fryers and roasters 31–32, carried 28–31, rocks, 32, red 31–32, few large possibly higher and leghorns 25–28, according to size quality and condition. Colored fowl ranged from 28–33, with fancy New England stocks high as 34–35. Leghorn 28–28½, poor lower, A few ducks sold at 28½, radbits 25–30, roosters 24½, Squads and pigeons were quoted at 35–40 per pair with small and poor lower. 4 cars (which were carried) were on track at Long Island City, plus 3 due l Later in day and 1 car at Weehamken for the live poultry trade. The 2 late arrivals that were carried from yesterday's market originated from Illinois and Wisconsin. Today's first car at Weehamken arrived from Indiana. The 18½ truckloads delivered to dealers up to 12 noon included: 11 Delaware cross, 1 Va.rocks, and cross with a few fowl, 1 W va rocks, ½ Pa.leghorn, ½ Tenn, colored, ½ Penn, ½ Tenn, ½ Tenn, ½ Fowl. 55 Long coops were carried from yesterday's market and were composed of 379 crosses, 28 rocks, 40 reds, 21 leghorn, 34 colored, total 502 springs: 13 red, 18 leghorn, making 31 fowl, 2 miscellaneous, Direct receivers received till late morning 66, 721e Philadelphia: Market darely steady on fancy fowl, Large fryers and roasters; weak on prollers, Extent of weakness on prollers evidenced by some fancy englices. Having deen sold at 28 which was 2½–3¢ delow ceilings.

DUE TO APPROACHING LABOR DAY HOLIDAY AN ACTIVE DEMAND DEVELOPED WHICH CLEARED DESIRABLE STOCK QUICKLY. MARKET GENERALLY FIRM ALTHO THERE WAS NO MATERIAL CHANGE IN VALUES.
