1. Unidentified flying object reported by State Trooper, object observed near Reith Ridge 5 miles west of Pendleton, Oregon, on Highway 30, by 5 carloads of civilians. At time of sighting:

- a. Weather: Clear
- b. Visibility: Unlimited
- c. Winds: (surface) Southwest at 21 knots
(4,000 Ft) Northwest at 30 knots

2. Object was observed visually without optical aids.

3. Maximum time of observation: 5 minutes.

4. Time of Sighting: 152055Z Jul 52.

5. Description of Object: Silver colored, spherical in shape, and about 35-100 feet in diameter.

6. Estimated Speed: Very Fast.

7. Estimated Height: 4,000 Feet.

8. Maneuvers of object: Dipping, moving Eastbound, over Reith Ridge, West of Pendleton, Oregon.

9. Last visual contact: 152100Z Jul 52.


