With reference to our letter TI/si/242, dated 19 Jul 46, regarding the Procurement Demand No OSKE 773, we have to report to you that the statement therein to the effect that Sodium Bar Carbonate has been seized by the Eighth Army is incorrect. The information given to us by the local dealers was based upon the notice circulated by the Soda Industrial Chemical Controlling Company, Tokyo, that no salt neither salt products should not be released without obtaining sanction from the Eighth Army, from which the local manufacturer understood that all soda products were seized by the Eighth Army.

We have already arranged that the Nijubi Fire Extinguisher Company could obtain the required quantity of the Sodium Bar Carbonate and are pleased to report now that they will be able to fulfill the Procurement Demand by 15 Sept.

We regret having passed to you this incorrect information through the carelessness on our part, and assure you that we shall have full investigations in the future whenever we receive similar information when fulfilling the Procurement Demands.

SUBJECT : Improper Procurement of Cloth

TO : Commanding General, I Corps, APO 301
(ATTENTION: MG Section)

1. There has come to the attention of this headquarters an instance of improper procurement of Japanese goods by the 25th Division Quartermaster, Osaka. Two irregularities are involved, namely the procurement of private property, and the critical items which are intended for use in rehabilitating the Japanese civil economy, pursuant to SCAPIN 53 of 24 Sep 45 and Operational Directive No. 28, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 16 Nov 45.

2. The circumstances are as follows: Upon receipt from the 43rd CIC Detachment of a confirmed report that a quantity of rayon and koseichi material of Japanese military origin was stored by the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company KK, 103 Muroyama-cho, Yokkaichi, Mie Prefecture (coordinates: 1153.2-1327.8), the Commanding Officer, Battery C, 8th Field Artillery Battalion, Takajaya, Mie Prefecture, requested the Custodian Bureau, Japanese Home Ministry office, Tsu, to cause an inventory of the stocks of that firm to be made. Accordingly, the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company prepared an inventory of all goods of military origin. This original inventory consisted of pages 1 and 2 of Inclosure 1. On 9 April this inventory was turned over to the tactical commander, who returned it to the Custodian Bureau, with the stipulation that the inventory must include all textile supplies, regardless of origin or date of receipt. In compliance with this order, the Company on 11 April submitted a supplementary inventory of all textile supplies of non-military origin. These are listed on pages 3 to 9, inclusive, of Inclosure 1. On 12 April the firm was declared a "target".

3. On 25 May, an officer (2d Lt Harlow) of the 25th Division Quartermaster, Osaka, appeared at the factory with a "Request for Japanese Supplies and Facilities", a copy of which is attached as Inclosure 2. On the basis of this demand, the firm delivered the following materials:

Cloth, cotton white	4 bales
Cloth, cotton jeans	2,318 yards
Cloth, cotton shirting	4,963 yards
Cloth, rayon (5,563 yards)	89 rolls
Cloth, koseichi (2,880 yards)	48 rolls



4. The white cotton cloth, cotton jeans, and cotton shirting is claimed by the Ito Hosiery Mill to be private property and did not belong to the Ito Hosiery Mill but was the property of the Mie-ken Textile Control Company (Mie-ken Sen-i-seihin Tosei KK, of Matsuzaka), which is the official ration agency for textile products in Mie Prefecture. The inventory submitted to the tactical commander on 11 April 1946 (see Inclosure No.1) indicates that these items mentioned above were received subsequent to the armistice and had no relation to war production or military agencies.

5. It is believed that the procurement of the above items come under the provisions of paragraph 1 a, Inclosure No. 1 to Operational Directive #33, headquarters Eighth Army, dated 26 March 46, and that the rayon and koseichi come within the provisions of SCAPIN #53, 24 September 1945, and Operational Directive #28, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 16 November 1945.

6. This matter was referred informally to the 25th Division for the purpose of presenting evidence that the above mentioned procurement had been made in accordance with SCAP Directives to which attention is invited to a copy of a report by Inspector General, 25th Division and to the recommendation made by the Inspector General, 25th Division, and approved by Commanding General, 25th Division. A copy of this report is attached hereto as Inclosure #4.

7. The Inspector General 25 Division informed this Headquarters by telephone that the approved recommendation (Incl 4) has been complied with and that the textiles referred to have been returned to Ito Hosiery Mill or turned back to Home Ministry as indicated in the recommendation.

SUBJECT: Alleged irregularity in procurement of textiles

TO : Commanding General, 25th Infantry Division, APO 25

1. During the early days of the occupation of Japan, the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company KK, 103 Muroyama-cho, Yokkaichi, Mie Prefecture, a privately owned establishment whose normal pursuit is the manufacture of hosiery and underwear, was declared a military target by the 98th Division, processed and subsequently returned to the Japanese Management.

On or about 1 April 1946, following receipt of information that a quantity of textiles, namely rayon and koseichi cloth, formerly property of Japanese Armed Forces, was stored on the premises of the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company, this establishment was again declared a military target and an inventory of all property formerly belonging to the Japanese Armed Forces was called for.

3. Upon the inventory being received by the officer in charge of this target, it was believed to be incomplete whereupon the inventory was returned for modification. Upon the inventory being returned to the Ito Manufacturing Company, practically every item of property on the premises was listed, including many items of textiles, quantities of finished garments and machinery, which were privately owned and not former property of the Japanese Armed Forces. (Incl # 7)

4. Upon this inventory being received in the Japanese Material Section, this headquarters, it was referred to Division Supply Agencies for the purpose of determining whether or not it contained items of property which were required for use by occupational forces. As a result, a requisition was submitted for a quantity of textiles which were listed in this inventory. However, this requisition was not processed thru authorized procurement procedure.

5. On or about 25 May 1946, a representative of the Division Quartermaster presented the requisition referred to in preceding paragraph (copy attached as Incl # 9) to Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company for, and obtained therefrom, a quantity of textiles as follows:

6. At approximately the same time the textiles referred to above were procured, additional items of textiles were procured from various other places, making a total of 12 items so procured. No record could be obtained as to the source of the additional 7 items (see incl #6).

7. On or about 31 May 1946, the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company presented a letter to the Detachment of 83rd Military Government Company, Tsu, Honshu, wherein the procurement of the 5 items of textiles referred to in paragraph 4, supra, was reported and claim made that items 1, 2 and 5 was privately owned property and not former property of Japanese Armed Forces. (Incl #8). This information was passed informally to the Chief of Staff, 25th Division, and subsequently used as a basis for this investigation.

8. An inventory of textiles on hand in the warehouse of the Division Quartermaster disclosed that of the original quantities of the 5 items of textiles procured from Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company the quantity now on hand is as follows:

9. An examination of the books and other records of the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company indicates conclusively that ownership or source of these 5 items of textiles are as follows:

- a. Item No 1, cloth, cotton white:
Item No 2, cloth, cotton jeans:

On consignment to Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company from Mie Prefecture Textile Manufacturing Company to be made into garments by Ito and the finished garments returned to Mie Prefecture Textile Manufacturing Company.

- b. Item No 3, Rayon:
Item No 4, Cloth, koseichi:

Property of the Japanese Navy. Item No 3 was delivered to Ito on or about 6 July 1945 by Japanese Naval Base, Yokkaichi, to be made into hosiery and underwear for the Japanese Navy. Item No 4 was delivered to Ito on or about 21 August 1945 by Japanese Naval Arsenal, Tsu, Honshu, without instructions as to disposition.

- c. Item No 5, Cloth, cotton shirting:

Purchased by Ito from Tokai Knitted Goods Controlling-Manufacturing Association, Nagoya, Honshu. This lot originally amounted to 12,326 yards, being obtained on 26 September 1945 and payment therefor in the amount of 4,512.00 Yen being made on 12 February 1946.

10. Inasmuch as the textiles procured from Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company were listed in the "Inventory of munitions stock on hand"(Incl #7), submitted by this concern, these items were considered by the procurement officer as being former property of the Japanese Armed Forces, and as such items were desired for use by the occupational forces, the withdrawal was believed to have been authorized. Had these items been property of the Japanese Armed Forces, the withdrawal would be authorized (Reference Annex 10 to Administrative Order 23, Hq I Corps, 5 April 1946-Incl #10). However, as items 1, 2 and 5 were not property of the Japanese Armed Forces, but were privately owned property of the manufacturers, their preemption or taking possession of for use of occupational forces is unauthorized except thru proper procurement procedure and upon prior approval of such procurement by SCAP (Reference paragraph 2d, Operational Directive No 33, Hq Eighth Army, 26 March 1946, and Annex 7 to Administrative Order 6, Hq 25th Infantry Division, 10 Feb 1946-Incl #10).

11. The Division Quartermaster states that of the 5 items of textiles obtained from Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company, Item No 1 is most desirable for use by this command. A quantity of this material has already been consumed in the manufacture of white jackets for mess personnel. However, there is on hand at the present time at the Division Quartermaster 4,800 yards in excess of the amount procured from Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company. The Division Quartermaster further states that Items 3 and 4 are of little or no value to the Division due to the poor quality of this material.

CONCLUSIONS

12. Certain items of privately owned property, including textiles, were erroneously listed on inventory submitted by Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company. Such inventory should have contained only property of Japanese Armed Forces.

13. In taking possession of property, believed to be former property of Japanese Armed Forces, the Division Procurement Officer also took possession of privately owned property, namely 2,400 yards cloth, cotton white, referred to herein as Item No 1; 2,318 yards cloth, cotton jeans, referred to herein as Item No 2, and 4,963 yards cloth, cotton shirting, referred to herein as Item No 5.

14. The preemption or taking possession of the textiles referred to in the preceding paragraph as Items No 1, 2 and 5 by occupational forces was unauthorized, and such items of privately owned property may only be procured thru proper procurement procedure as referred to in paragraph 6, Operational Directive No 33, Headquarters Eighth Army, 26 March 1946.

RECOMMENDATIONS

15. That the following textiles which were erroneously procured from Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company, Yokkaichi, Mie Prefecture, and which are now on hand in the Division Quartermaster Warehouse, be returned to the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company and their receipt obtained therefor.

Item No 1 - Cloth, cotton white 2,400 yards
 Item No 2 - Cloth, cotton jeans 2,210 yards
 Item No 5 - Cloth, cotton shirting 5,600 yards

(NOTE: Excess yardage of Item No 5 to compensate for shortage of Item No 2)

16. That upon compliance with recommendation contained in preceding paragraph, the requisition-receipt given Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company by the Division Procurement Officer for the 5 Items of textiles procured from that company be recovered.

17. That the following textiles, which were removed from the Ito Hosiery Manufacturing Company and which was formerly property of the Japanese Navy, and determined as not being needed by the Division Quartermaster, be turned over to the Japanese Home Ministry for civilian use, Item No 3, cloth, Rayon, 5,880 yards; Item No 4, Cloth, koseichi, 2,760 yards.

18. That the Commanding Officer, 83rd Military Government Company, Nara, Honshu, be advised of action taken in this matter.

19. That no further action be taken in this matter.

We presented 12 copies of the above-mentioned list (in 9 pages) to the Custodian Office of Miye prefecture on 11th April, 1946 in accordance with their request.

These lists, we heard on the other day, were by the request of 1st Lt. Holcobe, 25th Inf. Div. at Takazhaya.

We reported at the first time on 9th April the 1st and 2nd pages of the above list only (i.e. all the goods we had received from the Japanese Military relations.)

But, as they insisted us to be listed all the goods we had received from elsewhere or had kept during the war-time and kept on the end of March except those of lands, buildings, furnitures, money & etc., we followed their advice and adding 7 pages (from 3rd to 9th), we presented again on 11th April, as above.

On 25th May, 1946, an Officer (2nd Lt. Haalow ? -- spelling is not sure) came to our factory from the 25th Inf. Div. Osaka and requested us some materials (Cloths) handing " REQUEST FOR JAPANESE SUPPLIES AND FACILITIES." We had to deliver the cloths he requested and the specification lists as per copies attached.

We told him the fact that some of the cloths he requested were not munitions but were personal properties. He said that, even if it were so, we had reported in the list of munitions and he took away these goods, but the payment would be made by the Japanese Government through the prefectual office against this form. He also told us kindly that if we had reported by mistake, we should have to make correction officially so early as possible that not to repeat same troubles in future.

Under these circumstances, we would ask you to kindly make the necessary steps to make correction of the list (i.e. to cancel the 7 pages-- from the 3rd to 9th.) Because, we found that those listed in these 7 pages are no relations with the list of munitions stock on hand month ending March, 1946. And, if it possible, we would like to return us the following goods, as these are in the 3rd page and 6th page of the list.
