PREFACE.

THE AMERICAN SPORTING MANUAL seems to be a necessity. For that reason alone it is published. The aim of the Daily Racing Form Publishing Company is to give the American public the sort of book it needs at a popular price. The thoroughbred turf has been naturally cared for. In other American annual books of record it has always been slurred. The Handicap Tables are keen novelties. Two were first published in the 1897 Manual. In this, five are displayed. In addition an article as to the application of the figures is printed. It contains directions as to the methods used by the editor and handicappers in the office of Daily Racing Form in making their calculations. The track speed and comparative speed tables fit into the figures of handicapping, the basis of which is time. They have been corrected and give the various time tables to date. The history of 1903 pugilism is full and complete and so are the records of every American race track. The book is just what it is said to be, and built for popular use in a popular way.

HANDICAPPING AND RACING.

Successful handicapping is a matter of common sense use of the items of racing. No figures can supply the flexible measure that must be applied to the fields of horses by the turf mathematician. Acquaintance with individuals—horses and men—is the keenest item in handicapping. No figures can give an idea of the liking of horses for different kinds of soil, or define human combinations. Both are matters of personal observation and judgment.

The temperament of the thoroughbred is almost as broad in scope as that of humanity. The really great horse, like the sharply acute man, overcomes all difficulties, and wins. There are few really great horses. Some of supreme speed are only creatures of speed. The restraint of placing such a horse is often exhaustive and fatal. Africander and McChesney are modern types of the high class and sensible horse. They won their races with riding management. Both showed sense and ambition in their youth before they raced.

Speed is a keen factor in racing. It is the basis of handicapping of course, because it is the item which bears most sharply upon performance. But speed is valueless unless well calculated upon the basis of how speed was applied in the past. Handicapping is the calculation out of what has been done. Some horses favor racing in front: others choose by mere temperament, to come from behind. Our timing is villainously inaccurate. Some timers miss the application of their watches to the start, and average matters on the basis of what horses in the race should do, as compared with what other horses in other races had done. Slipshod time keeping is one of the evils of the American turf. Judges and starters are paid large and timers small sums for their services. Considered in a public way, the timer is a more important official than either judge or starter. The keener of our handicappers, who bet large sums on their ideas of the performance of horses, keep their own time and find such keeping most profitable. The same men watch performance closely and bet on the judgment that comes from pure observation. The winners of today come from the losers of past days.

Mathematics can consider and apply the weights, distances and time of past performances to the probabilities of the future. But figures cannot—unless mingled with the judgment born out of observation of racing and knowledge of individual peculiarities—be intelligently applied to racing.

Figures, however, even from the foundation of imperfect timing and report, outclass all other methods of picking winners. For that reason alone the general honesty of racing can be proven, accepted, and praised.

The average handicapper, as the public knows him, guesses at his figurative estimates. Unless he does he will not "do." Man isn't a machine. He has moods, strong points, weak points, good days and bad days. The thoroughbred horse is as flexible as man. The bookmaker flourishes upon his percentages, attention to details and the failure of the public to allow for individual peculiarities. Only the great horse and the great man do great things-regularly.

Some suggestions are pertinent in this connection. Never play a horse at less than evens. Study the horse and its disposition.

Figure form on a basis of universal honesty.

When you can, always insure yourself by place betting. Use handicap figures only as a check on your own observation and idea of class.

Never seek to get even on a losing day by taking a chance on a long shot which isn't within calculation. There are other days. Do not weaken on your choice because the price is long. The ten years average of winning favorites, all about, is less than 41 3-7 per cent.

Keep a record of impressions as to individual action and per-formance in bad going. Less than 17 per cent. of favorites win on tracks that are denominated slow, muddy or heavy.

THE MATTER OF HANDICAPPING.

The system followed in the office of Daily Racing Form is to es-timate in decimal numbers the value of the past racing of the horses in each race—not on the basis of one, but often of twenty or thirty races. Frequently after the test of figures has been applied by the mathematician, the editors add and amend because of special ac-quaintance or knowledge. So-called "inside information" is never used. The "form" is "form" only.

In this year's Manual, examples are shown of this application of four handicap tables. Instead of using a different race for each table as heretofore, the examples are all worked out on one race, which gives the student opportunity to compare results from each, thus enabling him to form his own opinion of their respective merits. The race used was the fifth Hawthorne, September 14, 1899. Examples follow in numerical order of tables as they appear in the Manual:

Results from each of the foregoing tables show that the finish should be as follows: Tulla Fonso, Moroni, Gold Fox, Hard Knot, Fair Deceiver. Tappan.

The actual finish was: Tulla Fonso, Gold Fox, Moroni, Hard Knot, Tappan, Fair Deceiver.

In the note under chart of the race (No. 14560), Moroni is reported as having swerved badly below the sixteenth post, and, as he was beaten only threequarters of a length for second place, it is probable that, had his jockey been able to keep him straight, he would have finished second, which would have placed the first four horses exactly in the order indicated by all of the handicaps. Knowledge of individuality would cause the handicapper to favor Tappan over Fair Deceiver for fifth place, the former being a game horse, generally consistently doing his best, even when pitted against horses of superior caliber, while the latter, although speedy, has frequently shown a disposition to be faint-hearted when in good company. The layer of odds apparently applied his knowledge of this fact, as he quoted a somewhat longer price against the mare. Altogether, the tables seem to have produced satisfactory results in this race.

A few remarks as to methods of application may be of use to beginners. First-Always get values from races of the same distance as the one you are figuring on if possible. Otherwise take the next shorter distance in preference to the next longer one. Second-There are so many degrees of mud, that necessarily it is difficult to apply the figures of a heavy track race satisfactorily. By careful comparisons, however, a reasonable basis may be arrived at. Perhaps the best way is to use fast track figures, and then use your knowledge of the mud-loving proclivities of each horse in grading the figures up or down as the case may require. For a sloppy track, with good footing underneath, this is certainly best. Third-When two or more horses figure nearly equal, a knowledge of the comparative abilities of the jockeys riding these horses will be found more than useful; in fact, quite necessary to speculative success. Fourth-After all else is said and done, in order to apply with any degree of success any system of handicapping, one must have acquired, by close study or observation of performances, a well-grounded knowledge of the individual peculiarities of each horse being calculated upon Otherwise the work will go for naught. "Figures won't lie." That is, if you make them right.

NOTE.—The speed of tracks is liable to vary from year to year, owing to new dressing or difference in methods of working by superintendents. For instance, Hawthorne, at the time these examples were made, was faster than Harlem. Since then it has been generally somewhat slower. Handicappers should keep close watch of these changes. The best way of comparison is to note the records made by a number of consistent horses over the same track the previous year and compare with records the same horses are now making.

For the convenience of students we republish the charts of races referred to in the examples.



PUGILISM OF 1903.

The year just ended leaves Jim Jeffries still the boss of all the heavy-weights, and from present indications his name will stand at the head of the pugilistic list for years to come. Never in the history of the American prize ring has a heavy-weight champion engaged in as many championship battles, in so short a space of time, as has Jeffries. His record up to date, including his first championship victory, is as follows: Two wins over Bob Fitzsimmons, two over Jim Corbett, and one each over Tom Sharkey and Gus Ruhlin. John L Sullivan, during his reign of ten years, can boast of but four championship battles, including his win of the title from Paddy Ryan and his defeat at the hands of Jim Corbett, his other championship battles being with Charlie Mitchell, which resulted in a draw, and his victory over Jake Kilrain. Corbett, while champion, beat Mitchell and lost to Fitzsimmons, and the latter, after beating Corbett, lost the championship to Jeffries. With a general clean-up of all the oldtimers and no new aspirants in sight worth mentioning, Jeffries' hold on the top rung of the pugilistic ladder appears life-long. In the next division, the light heavy-weights, Bob Fitzsimmons holds the trump hand. His recent defeat of George Gardner, who won the title of that class by defeating Jack Root twice and defending it against Marvin Hart, was one of the surprises of the year, and demonstrated beyond a doubt that Fitzsimmons is the next best man to Jeffries, and the greatest fighter, considering his age, of modern times.

Although Tommy Ryan has engaged in no championship battles since he defeated Kid Carter at Fort Erie, September 15, 1902, he still retains the honor of being the best of the middle-weights. His strongest rival at present is Philadelphia Jack O'Brien, and as they have signed articles to battle for the championship after February 1, the middles may, after that date, talk business with a new champion. Ryan, however, says he has no fear of the result. Joe Walcott, the "black demon," at present, as in the past, seems to hold every one safe in the welter-weight division, despite the fact Martin Duffy, Matty Mathews, and a half dozen others, believe they are the best, They might be among their own color, still they give Joe a wide berth. Joe Gans, also a man of color, although decided against in his recent contest with Sam Langford, is looked upon as the topsawyer of the light-weights, but his title is somewhat clouded because he positively refuses to match at the light-weight limit. Of

the legitimate light-weights that are giving him a merry chase for his pugilistic seat in the band wagon, are Jimmy Britt, Jack O'Keefe, Buddy Ryan and Martin Canole. Of these Britt has the better claim, because of his defeat of Canole, who won a ten-round bout from O'Keefe. Jack, however, holds one win over Britt, on a foul, and has held him to a twenty-round draw, but the Canole defeat counts against him. Young Corbett tightened his hold on the feather-weight title by again adding Terry McGovern's name to his list of victims, but he is being closely trailed by Eddie Hanlon, the San Francisco feather, who has the honor of being the first boy to score a win over Benny Yanger. The above-named three and a horde of others have pressed the feather-weight limit close to the 130 notch, which in justice to their lighter brethren, is wrong. Among the simon pure feathers, the names of Abe Attell and Harry Forbes, with regards to science, stand out stronger than the score or more of others that can battle at and below 124 pounds, but they are blanketed by Corbett, Hanlon and Yanger.

During the past year the name of Frankie Neil of San Francisco, became known from coast to coast. The 'Frisco lad defeated Harry Forbes for the bantam-weight championship in a rather unsatisfactory two-round battle. However, the referee declared him the winner, and he is now the accepted champion of the little fellows.

A classification of the fighters in their respective divisions would read about as follows: Heavy-weights, Jim Jeffries, Bob Fitzsimmons, Jim Corbett, Gus Ruhlin, Tom Sharkey, Jack Johnson, Sam McVey, Jack Monroe, "Denver" Ed Martin, "Sandy" Ferguson and Hank Griffen.

Light heavy-weights, Bob Fitzsimmons, George Gardner, Joe Choynski, Jack Root, Marvin Hart and Kid Carter.

Middle-weights, Tommy Ryan, Jack O'Brien, and the others bunched.

Welter-weights, Joe Walcott, Martin Duffy, Matty Mathews, and take your pick of the balance.

Light-weights from 133 to 138 pounds, Joe Gans, Jimmy Britt, Jack O'Keefe, Buddy Ryan, Martin Canole, Mike Ward and Willie Fitzgerald.

Light and heavy feather-weights, Young Corbett, Eddie Hanlon, Benny Yanger, Terry McGovern, Young Mowatt, Tim Callahan, Hugh McPadden, Kid Broad, Abe Attell, Harry Forbes, and the others huddled together.

Bantam-weights, Frankie Neil and Johnny Reagen, with a score of others firm in their belief that they are better.

RULES GOVERNING PUGILISM.

There are but two sharp codes of rules governing fistic contests: Those of the London prize ring, and the set formulated, after being drawn up, by the Marquis of Queensberry, who, in his day, was the best amateur boxer in all England. The two codes are displayed here:

MARQUIS OF QUEENSBERRY RULES,

Rule 1—To be a fair stand-up boxing match in a twenty-four foot ring, or as near that size as practicable.

Rule 2-No wrestling or hugging allowed.

Rule 3—The rounds to be of three minutes' duration, and one minute time between rounds.

Rule 4—If any man fall, through weakness or otherwise, he must get up unassisted, ten seconds to be allowed him to do so, the other man meanwhile

to return to his corner, and when the fallen man is on his legs the round is to be resumed and continued until the three minutes have expired. If one man fails to come to the scratch in the ten seconds allowed, it shall be in the power of the referee to give his award in favor of the other man.

Rule 5-A man hanging on the ropes in a helpless state, with his toes off the ground, shall be considered down.

Rule 6-No seconds or any other person to be allowed in the ring during the rounds.

Rule 7—Should the contest be stopped by any unavoidable interference. the referee to name time and place, as soon as possible, for finishing the contest; so that the match must be won and lost, unless the backers of both men agree to draw the stakes.

Rule 8-The gloves to be fair-sized boxing gloves of the best quality and new.

Rule 9-Should a glove burst, or come off, it must be replaced to the referee's satisfaction.

Rule 10-A man on one knee is considered down, and if struck is entitled to the stakes.

Rule 11-No shoes or boots with springs allowed.

Rule 12—The contest in all other respects to be governed by the revised rules of the London Prize ring.

LONDON PRIZE RING RULES.

Rule 1—The ring shall be made on turf, and shall be four-and-twenty feet square, formed of eight stakes and ropes, the latter extending in double lines, the uppermost line being four feet from the ground, and the lower two feet from the ground. In the center of the ring a mark be formed, to be termed a scratch.

Rule 2—Each man shall be attended to the ring by two seconds and a bottle-holder. The combatants, on shaking hands, shall retire until the seconds of each have tossed for choice of position, which adjusted, the winner shall choose his corner according to the state of the wind or sun, and conduct his man thereto; the loser taking the opposite diagonal corner.

Rule 3—Each man shall be provided with a handkerchief of a color suitable to his own fancy, and the seconds shall entwine these handkerchiefs at the upper end of one of the center stakes. These handkerchiefs shall be called "Colors," and the winner of the battle at its conclusion shall be entitled to their possession as the trophy of victory.

Rule 4—The two umpires shall be chosen by the seconds or backers to watch the progress of the battle, and take exception to any breach of the rules hereinafter stated. A referee shall be chosen by the umpires, unless otherwise agreed on, to whom all disputes shall be referred; and the decision of this referee, whatever it may be, shall be final and strictly binding on all parties, whether as to the matter in dispute or the issue of the battle. The referee shall be provided with a watch for the purpose of calling time; the call of that referee only to be attended to, and no other person whatever shall

interfere in calling time. The referee shall withhold all opinion till appealed to by the umpires, and the umpires strictly abide by his decision without dispute.

Rule 5—On the men being stripped it shall be the duty of the seconds to examine their drawers, and if any objection arises as to insertion of improper substances therein, they shall appeal to their umpires, who, with the concurrence of the referee, shall direct what alterations shall be made.

Rule 6—The spikes in the fighting boots shall be confined to three in number, which shall not exceed three-eighths of an inch from the sole of the boot, and shall not be less than one-eighth of an inch broad at the point; two to be placed in the broadest part of the sole and one in the heel; and in the event of a man wearing any other spikes, either in toes or elsewhere, he shall be compelled either to remove them or provide other boots properly spiked, the penalty for refusal to be a loss of the stakes.

Rule 7—Both men being ready, each shall be conducted to that side of the scratch next his corner previously chosen; and the second on the one side and the men on the other, having shaken hands the former shall immediately leave the ring, and there remain until the round be finished, on no pretense whatever, approaching their principals during the round, without permission from the referee. The penalty to be the loss of the battle to the offending parties.

Rule 8—At the conclusion of the round when one or both of the men shall be down, the seconds shall step into the ring and carry or conduct their principal to his corner there affording him the necessary assistance, and no person whatever shall be permitted to interfere in his duty.

Rule 9—On the expiration of thirty seconds the referee appointed shall cry "Time," upon which each man shall rise from the knee of his second and walk to his own side of the scratch unaided; the seconds immediately leaving the ring. The penalty for either of them remaining eight seconds after the call of time to be the loss of the battle to his principal; and either man failing to be at the scratch within eight seconds shall be deemed to have lost the battle.

Rule 10—On no consideration whatever shall any person except the second and the referee be permitted to enter the ring during the battle; nor till it shall have been concluded; and in the event of such unfair practice, or the ropes or stakes being disturbed or removed, it shall be in the power of the referee to award the victory to that man, who, in his honest opinion, shall have the best of the contest.

Rule 11—The seconds shall not interfore, advise or direct the adversary of their principal, and shall refrain from all offensive and irritating expressions, in all respects conducting themselves with order and decorum, and confine themselves to the diligent and careful discharge of their duties to their principals.

Rule 12-In picking up their men, should the second wilfully injure the

antagonist of their principal, the latter shall be deemed to have forfeited the battle on the decision of the referee.

Rule 13—It shall be a fair "stand-up fight," and if either man shall wilfully throw himself down without receiving a blow, whether blows shall have been previously exchanged or not, he shall be deemed to have lost the battle; but this rule shall not apply to a man who in a close slips down from the grasp of his opponent to avoid punishment, or from obvious accident or weakness.

Rule 14-Butting with the head shall be deemed foul, and the party resorting to this practice shall be deemed to have lost the battle.

Rule 15—A blow struck when a man is thrown or down shall be deemed foul. A man with one knee and one hand on the ground, or with both knees on the ground, shall be deemed down; and a blow given in either of these positions shall be considered foul, providing always that, when in such position, the man so down shall not himself strike, or attempt to strike.

Rule 16—A blow struck below the waistband shall be deemed foul, and in a close, seizing an antagonist below the waist, by the thigh or otherwise, shall be deemed foul.

Rule 17—All attempts to inflict injury by gouging, or tearing the flesh with the fingers or nails, and biting shall be deemed foul.

Rule 18-Kicking, or deliberately falling on an antagonist with the knees or otherwise when down, shall be deemed foul.

Rule 19-All bets shall be paid as the battle money after a fight is awarded.

Rule 20-The referee and umpires shall take their positions in front of the center stake outside the ropes.

Rule 21—Due notice shall be given by the stakeholder of the day and place where the battle money is to be given up, and be exonerated from all responsibility upon obeying the direction of the referee; all parties be strictly bound by these rules; and in future, all articles of agreement for a contest be entered into with a strict and willing adherence to the letter and spirit of these rules.

Rule 22—In the event of magisterial or other interference, or in case of darkness coming on, the referee (or stakeholder, in case no referee has been chosen), shall have the power to name the time and place for the next meeting, if possible on the same day, or as soon after as may be. In naming the second or third place the nearest spot shall be selected to the original place of fighting where there is a chance of its being fought out.

Rule 23—Should the fight not be decided on the day all bets shall be drawn, unless the fight shall be resumed the same week, between Sunday and Sunday, in which case the referee's duties shall continue and the bets shall stand and be decided by the event. The battle money shall remain in the hands of the stakeholder until fairly won or lost by a fight, unless a draw is mutually agreed upon, or, in case of a postponement, one of the principals shall be absent, when the man in the ring shall be awarded the stakes.

Rule 24-Any pugilist voluntarily quitting the ring previous to the de-

liberate judgment of the referee being obtained shall be deemed to have lost the fight.

Rule 25—On an objection being made by the seconds or umpire the men shall retire to their corners, and there remain until the decision of the appointed authorities shall be obtained; if pronounced "foul" the battle shall be at an end, but if "fair," "time" shall be called by the party appointed, and the man absent from the scratch in eight seconds after shall be deemed to have lost the fight. The decision in all cases to be given promptly and irrevocably, for which purpose the umpires and the referee should be invariably close together.

Rule 26—If a man leaves the ring, either to escape punishment or for any other purpose, without the permission of the referee, unless he is involuntarily forced out, shall forfeit the battle.

Rule 27—The use of hard substances, such as stones or sticks, or of resin in the hand during the battle shall be deemed foul, and on the requisition of the seconds of either man, the accused shall open his hands for the examination of the referee.

Rule 28—Hugging on the ropes shall be deemed foul. A man held by the neck against the stakes or upon or against the ropes shall be considered down, and all interference with him in that position shall be foul. If a man in any way makes use of the ropes or stakes to aid him in squeezing his adversary he shall be deemed the loser of the battle, and if a man in a close reaches the ground with his knees, his adversary shall immediately loose him or lose the battle.

Rule 29—All glove or room fights to be as nearly as possible in conformity with the foregoing rules.

BILLIARD RECORDS TO DATE.

Noteworthy happenings in 1903 professional billiards were 'imited to a tournament at the 18-inch balk line game, two shots allowed in balk, which was held in Paris, France; a challenge from Sutton to Schaefer for the championship at the 18-inch balk line. one shot allowed in balk, which failed to bring about a match, and a tournament for the championship of the northwest at the 14inch balk line, played at Duluth, St. Paul, Minneapolis and Fargo, in which $4\frac{1}{2}x9$ tables were used, making the affair unworthy of more than passing recognition.

The tournament in Paris began February 15 and terminated February 20. It was not a success. Two Frenchmen, Vignaux and Cure, and two Americans, Slosson and Sutton, participated. Schaefer and the French expert, Fourniel, two of the most skillful billiard players in the world, were in Paris when the contests were held, but, after having been announced as entries, had a disagreement with the promoters and refused to compete. Slosson was not in satisfactory practice when he went abroad to engage in the games and it was no surprise to those who were aware of his condition that he did not win a game and made the poorest public showing of his career.

Then the tournament eventuated in a French court of law, which, on May 20, adjudicated the question of first prize, together with the right to the emblem and title that went with it. The six games played resulted in Vignaux, Sutton and Cure each winning two. Cure beat Sutton and Slosson, Sutton beat Slosson and Vignaux, and Vignaux beat Sutton and Cure. Thereupon Vignaux, who had averaged a little over 22 in his total score, as against a fraction over 21 by Sutton and a trifle more than 20 by Cure, claimed first money, the emblem and championship.

When the management expected from six to eight contestants in order to confine the time to be occupied in deciding the outcome to a certain period and avoid continuances on account of possible ties, inserted in the conditions a stipulation that, in the event of ties the winners should be determined by the grand averages. Sutton and Cure asserted that by verbal agreement that stipulation was waived. The management sustained their contention. Vignaux appealed to the courts to enforce his claims and was awarded all he asked, while the costs of the litigation were assessed against Sutton and Cure. The best game of the tournament was between

Vignaux and Sutton, the latter winning by a score of 500 to 471, with an average of $31\frac{1}{4}$ and a high run of 200.

During the summer, while Schaefer was in Chicago, Sutton, who remained abroad, issued a challenge for the 18-1 emblem. Schaefer maintained that it was of improper form and did not accept it. Upon Schaefer's return to Paris Sutton issued a challenge which complied with all the requirements of the conditions governing the emblem. He deposited a forfeit with a representative of the donors of the trophy and subsequently claimed the championship, alleging that Schaefer had failed to cover the deposit within the time specified by the rules regulating possession and defense of the title. Schaefer answered that he had posted the necessary money. The parties who instituted the championship and provided the emblem ruled in favor of Sutton, who accordingly declares himself the champion. Schaefer, however, retains the emblem. There is no prospect of a game for it and no probability that it will be voluntarily transferred to Sutton.

The contestants in the Northwestern tourney were Spears and Billiter of Minneapolis, Ferris of Fargo, Peterson of St. Paul and Hatley of Duluth. In the tournament proper Billiter and Hatley tied and in the playoff the Duluth representative won.

In amateur billiards the tournament held in February by the Hanover Club of Brooklyn was incomparably the feature of the year's events. It was also an unqualified success. The chief prize was the Brooklyn Daily Eagle Gold Championship Cup. There were seven contestants, who finished in the following order: Wilson P. Foss. Haverstraw, N. Y.; Edward W. Gardner, Passaic, N. J.; Charles F. Conklin, Chicago; J. Byron Stark, Wilkesbarre, Pa.; Dr. L. L. Mial, J. Ferdinand Poggenburg, New York City; Arthur Townsend, Brooklyn. Foss and Gardner each won five of the six games they played. Foss was beaten by Conklin. while Gardner lost to Foss. When the tie was decided Foss again defeated Gardner. Playing against Dr. Mial, Foss averaged 18 2-3, the best amateur record. His grand average, 12.12, also established a new record.

A tournament for the amateur championship of France and Belgium was held in Paris in April and May. It was won by M. Rerolle, who won seven games without a defeat, made a single average, in 400 points, of 33.33 and a grand average, in 2,800 points of 15.91.

Mussey's annual, Class A, tournament, at three-cushion carroms, does not attract much attention outside of Chicago. Nevertheless it brings together a group of players of remarkable skill at the most difficult of angle games. Among the amateurs who

frequent Mussey's there are a dozen gentlemen, who, at three cushions, are the equals, if not the superiors, of any other like number of amateurs or professional experts in the world. Last year's tournament between those stars resulted in a victory for H. J. Avery, who the year previous made the extraordinary record of 50 points in 51 innings, displacing the late Wayman C. Mc-Creery's record of 53 innings. It has recently been claimed that the deceased St. Louis amateur had made a record of 51 innings, but the claim is not well substantiated. When alive McCreery never claimed to have beaten 53 innings and William P. Mussey, who conducted correspondence relating to the then unprecedented feat of McCreery is positive that the subject about which he wrote was 53 innings. Avery's performance is authentic.

BEST RECORDS AND AVERAGES.



RACING STATISTICS OF 1903.

The year 1903 was one of unprecedented prosperity in the field of thoroughbred racing. It was thought that the high-tide mark had been reached in 1902, but in the course of the year just ended the imposing total of \$5,190,450 was won by the runners, a splendid advance over the total of \$4,662,424 of the year 1902. The figures are official except as to an estimate of \$350,000 for meetings at Seattle, Brookline, Mass., Pimlico, the Georgia circuit, Los Angeles Fair Meeting, Sacramento, Dallas, Petaluma and many hundreds of fairs at which purses were hung up for the runners. Since at Seattle alone fully \$100,000 was raced for, this estimate of \$350,000 is more than probably too low, but it is used conservatively to be on the safe side. Great as is this showing of 1903, it is already apparent that it is to be exceeded in 1904. The tendency is to increase offerings by all the long-established racing organizations and the advent of such new clubs as the Kansas City Jockey Club, Los Angeles Jockey Club and Hot Springs Jockey Club and these are factors that should serve to bring the total of 1904 very close to the \$6,000,000 mark, if it does not go beyond it. The veteran turfman, Green B. Morris was at the head of the list of winning owners in 1902, with \$98,350 to his credit, but Mr. William C. Whitney achieved that justly coveted position in 1903 with winnings of \$102,569. Morris was far down in the list with \$28,865 won. The western owner, John A. Drake, who was second in 1902 with \$92,120, was also comparatively low in the list with stable earnings of \$31,378. His successor in second place was J. B. Haggin with the fine sum of \$89,795, to which Waterboy was the chief contributor. The Hampton Stable was third with \$83,790, mostly won by the grand colt, Africander. The popular owner, Captain Samuel S. Brown, shows up well in fourth place with \$80,630. a material advance over his \$46,845 won in 1902. The chairman of the Jockey Club, Mr. August Belmont, held his own in good style in 1903 with \$75,508, as compared with \$77,466 won in 1902. Sidney Paget and E. R. Thomas are well up in the list with \$77,185 and \$75,460 respectively. Mr. Edward Corrigan won \$32,427 in 1902 and \$52,840 in 1903, but so huge was his list of horses in training that it is doubtful if the increased sum much more than paid ex-John E. Madden, F. Cook and S. C. Hildreth all had a penses. measure of success that meant prosperity. Other owners who did well in 1903 through the successful performances of their horses were James R. Keene, Frank Farrell, Barney Schreiber, The Goughacres Stable, Foxhall P. Keene, E. E. Smathers, W. B. Jennings & Co., W. M. Scheftel, M. J. Daly, J. B. Respess, J. W. Colt and Clay Bros. The western turfmen, J. W. Schorr and George C. Bennett. each had a disappointing turf year when compared with their much greater returns in 1902. Very prolific of good horses, speedy, staying, up to high weights and comparing favorably with the best of preceding years, was 1903. It fell to a very great three-year-old, Africander, to head its list of winning horses, just as one of that age, but not so grand a racer, Major Daingerfield, did in 1902. Africander won \$70,810, Major Daingerfield \$57,685. A remarkably fast four-year-old, Waterboy, was second in the list with \$50,775 to his credit, the Futurity winner, Hamburg Belle, being third with \$47,125 and the champion two-year-old colt, Highball, fourth with \$39,925. Last year the second, third and fourth in the winning list were the two-year-olds, Savable, Irish Lad and Mizzen, with \$46,100, \$42,770 and \$32,056 to their credit respectively. Of this trio only Irish Lad upheld his twoyear-old fame by landing \$27,350 as a three-year-old and including the Brooklyn Handicap in his victories. The American Derby winner, The Picket, comes fifth with \$33,680 won and the great fouryear-old, McChesney, more than repaid the \$30,000 E. E. Smathers paid for him by winning a total of \$31,175. Claude, Shorthose, Aristocracy, Pulsus, Magistrate, Delhi, Hermis, Hurstbourne, Beldame, Igniter and Race King were all winners of sums out of the ordinary and all ahead of the best horse of the year, Dick Welles, the latter not being extensively engaged. A rider unknown to track fame in 1902 enjoys the singular good fortune of having achieved the highest honors of his profession in his first season of extensive employment on the leading tracks of the country. It was not luck that enabled Grover Cleveland

Fuller to achieve such distinction, but skill of the highest order. He not only scored the most winning mounts, but his percentage was greater than that of Odom, Burns, Redfern, Bullman, O'Neill, Dominick and other skillful riders of more experience. Of the jockeys of long established reputation Shaw alone excelled him in percentage. Another new rider, the lightweight boy, L. Wilson, was second in respect to number of winning mounts. It is to be noted that whereas in 1902 Ranch and Helgesen each rode in more than a thousand races, H. Phillips alone passed over the thousand mark in 1903. The following table shows the records of the jockeys who have headed the winning list in recent years:


Quite an unusual number of young riders came into prominence by good work in the saddle, L. Wilson, H. Phillips, S. Bonner, D. Hall, Hildebrand, Higgins, D. Austin, F. Smith, W. Hicks, Romanelli and Chandler being conspicuous examples. Such stars of other nearby years as Winkfield, Coburn and Cochran fell from public favor because of increasing weight that seemed to impair their skill. Shaw, Adkins, J. Sheehan, Henry, D. Hall, Ferrell, Buchanan and Battiste were removed from active work in the saddle by being ruled off or suspended indefinitely. The jockeys who rode twenty or more races in 1903 were these:


