CITY BUSINESS AT COUNCIL MEETING

ABOUT EMPLOYMENT OF CHINESE LABOR Auditing Controversy Again - Water Supply Outside Limits and Other Matters Discussed.

The first business before the city council last night was the consideration of a letter from the trades and labor council, in which it was stated that Chinese were being employed by a contractor digging and at Elk Lake for the waterworks department.

Ald. Williams waxed indignant. "This should be no laughing matter," he said. "You have only to go across the water and you can get a meal cooked by white people, but in this city all the cooking is done by Chinese."

Ald. Cameron understood that there was only one Chinaman employed at Elk Lake. It was a case in which the work was being done outside the city, and the council had no control.

The following letters from Senator Macdonald and Water Commissioner Raymer were read, and received and filed.

Receipts and expenditure for the year ending 31st Dec., 1901. Receipts: Water rates and rents, \$65,079 25. Expenditure: Maintenance pumping, \$11,408 85.

Table with financial figures: Station, Maintenance, Construction, Completion, etc.

Balance transferred to the corporation city of Victoria, \$ 851.97. On this I based my remarks, that the commission report and the auditor's report, if the council will consider the wording of the report as heretofore set forth, they will justify the conclusion I came to, and that the working is misleading.

The Water Commissioner said that the city accounts cannot be called incorrect. My first impression was that Mr. Kent had been misled by the auditor's report, but I knew his name appeared with the auditor at the bottom of such accounts.

Mr. J. Macdonald, M.P., said he had handed to me for report a letter from Senator Macdonald, of even date. The statement to which Senator Macdonald refers is simply an abstract from the treasurer's books, and appears in the annual reports, as an appendix to that of the water commissioner.

The city engineer reported on several applications of sewers and the cost thereof, and recommended that the offer of J. Haggerty for the supply of beach gravel for finishing the Government street work at the old contract price should be accepted.

The water commissioner sent in the following report concerning the extension of the waterworks to the Toke road and the proposed tank to supply high levels:
