

WAGE RATES, SALARIES AND HOURS OF LABOUR IN CANADA OCTOBER, 1952

Summary and Introductory Notes

THE general average index of wage rates in Canada rose to 263.3 in 1952 on a base of 1939 as 100. This represents an increase of 8.0 per cent over 1951 and indicates a continuance of the upward trend in wage rates which commenced in the early '30's. While this increase is smaller than the 12.9 per cent rise that occurred in 1951, it is larger than the increases that were experienced in 1949 and 1950.


Of the six major industrial groups, Logging showed the greatest percentage increase in wage rates, for the second consecutive year, 19.3 per cent. The index for Transportation and Communication rose by 11.6 per cent, reflecting increases in all the sub-groups including both non-operating employees and the running trades in Steam Railways. Gains of 8.3 per cent for both Mining and Construction, 7.9 per cent for Service (Laundries) and 6.1 per cent for Manufacturing fell closer to the increase in the general average.

The index numbers contained in this report indicate the changes in wage rates in particular industries or industry groups, and may be used to compare the changes in one industry over a period of time with those in another. However, they do not provide a basis for comparison of the actual rates or wage levels between industries.

SCOPE OF SURVEY

A change was made in 1952 in the manner of collecting data on wages and

working conditions. This change consisted of dividing the former survey into two parts. Data on wage rates, salaries and standard hours were obtained for the last pay period preceding October 1 with the exception of Eastern Canada Logging which was surveyed as of February 1 because of its seasonal nature. Most of the former questions on working conditions were included in a survey made in April, 1953.

The same list of establishments applies to both surveys. These establishments numbered approximately 14,500 in the ten provinces of Canada. Most establishments with 15 or more employees were included in the surveys as well as a representative number of smaller firms in certain industries such as garages and trade.

Information obtained through the surveys is supplemented in some cases by that set out in collective agreements on file in the Economics and Research Branch.

This report consists principally of occupational wage rates statistics and index numbers of wage rates by industry. Articles dealing with wages are published from time to time in *The Labour Gazette*, and statistics are also available on request to the Economics and Research Branch, Department of Labour, Ottawa. Information on working conditions, including standard hours per week, overtime, vacations with pay, statutory holidays, etc., is compiled and published regularly in *The Labour Gazette*, and is also available on request.

WAGE RATES

Tabular Material

Tables of average wage rates and normal hours of work comprise the main body of the report. These are shown by industry in Tables III to V, and VII to XI, inclusive, and for manufacturing as a whole in Tables VI and XII. Table VI gives average wage rates for Labourers, Male, in Manufacturing by locality and Table XII gives average salaries of selected clerical occupations, by province and by city. Table XIII summarizes average standard hours per week for a large number of industries and composite groups. An appendix to the report provides data on wages paid to farm labour, as compiled and published by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

These tables cover wage rates for selected occupations in a large number of industries for Canada as a whole, by province or region, and in some cases by city. The extent to which rates for any occupation in any industry are broken down geographically depends on the nature of the industry, the number of establishments reporting information and the number of workers used in the averages. Care is taken to ensure that the identity of any establishment reporting wage data is not disclosed.

Explanation of Tables

For convenience, the averages are referred to as wage rates although straight-time earnings is a more precise designation as piece work, production bonus, commission, mileage and other incentive payments have been included in some cases.

The rates apply to day work only; they are not influenced by shift differentials, overtime premiums, gratuities, Christmas bonuses or shares in company profits. Similarly, they do not include the value of allowances to employees such as free transportation, uniforms, group insurance and sick benefits. However, cost-of-living bonus payments are included where applicable. Where board and lodging are customarily provided without charge, this is indicated.

Most averages are shown as hourly rates but monthly or weekly rates are also shown in industries where this method of payment is the usual practice. When weekly rates are converted to monthly or vice versa, the conversion factor used is $4\frac{1}{2}$ weeks per month.

In addition to the averages, predominant ranges of rates are shown. These ranges include the rates for the "middle 80 per cent" of the workers although rates for all workers are used in calculating the averages. Ten per cent of the employees receive more and ten per cent less than the limits of the ranges shown.

OCCUPATIONS

Beginning in 1947, occupational schedules have been sent with the survey forms to employers. These schedules consist of lists of representative occupations with short descriptions of each. Their advantage in the survey is that they help employers identify the specific jobs for which wage-rate information is requested. Consequently, the task of compilation is simplified by greater uniformity in the job content of the occupations selected. The preparation of new schedules and the revision of existing ones in co-operation with industry is being continued. As yet not all industries have been covered, but this is the ultimate objective.

The job descriptions are not intended to be all-inclusive nor are they intended as "standards" for jobs in any particular establishment, since the specific duties involved in some occupations vary somewhat from plant to plant, as well as from industry to industry. In addition, workers in the same occupation do not always have the same work load. The work load is frequently heavier for male than for female workers. These two factors affect the job content of all occupations shown in this report, whether such occupations have been reported on the basis of job descriptions or not.

The most important of the criteria used in making the selection of occupations for each industry are: 1. Their numerical importance in the industry; 2. Their prevalence through the industry; 3. Their importance in the manufacturing process or to the type of activity carried on; 4. The stratum of skill; and 5. Their capability of clear definition.

Occupational titles shown in this report are in most cases the same as those used by employers in reporting, although in some cases the latter have been grouped; alternative titles are shown in brackets in some cases. All data pertain to male workers unless otherwise designated.

INDEX NUMBERS

Tabular Material

Table I contains index numbers of wage rates by industries and by main industrial groups for the period 1945 to 1952, the indexes being based on rates in 1939 as 100. This is a continuation of the series first shown in Report No. 26. For the period 1911 to 1952, indexes are also shown for the main industrial groups on the base of average rates in 1939 as 100 in Table II and 1935-39 in Table IIIA.

The following industries, for which wage rates and hours of labour are shown in the report, are not included in the index number calculations; agriculture, stevedoring, truck transportation, grain elevators, dairies, fruit and vegetable canning, fish canning, railway rolling stock, machine tools, baskets and wooden boxes, plywood and veneer mills, chemicals, brick and tile, brass and copper products, trade, garages, civic employees, restaurants and hotels. Information for Newfoundland and that for Clerical Salaries are likewise not included in the index number calculations.

Explanation of Tables

The index numbers shown in this report reflect changes in average wage rates (as previously defined) by industry. Such average rates may be affected from year to year by shifts in the number of workers at various rates within an occupation as well as by actual changes in wage rates in an occupation, establishment or

industry. The wage rates and hence the indexes also reflect the results of up and down grading within an occupational rate range.

The general index number of wage rates is arrived at in stages, by combining the index numbers of individual industries.

To obtain an index number for each industry, for example, Meat Products, or Cotton Yarn and Broad Woven Goods, the following method is used:

- (1) Averages for Canada as a whole are calculated for each of a representative list of occupations;
- (2) Each average is multiplied by its relative weight, this being determined by the proportion of employees in that occupation;
- (3) The sum of the products obtained in (2) for any year, expressed as a percentage of the similar aggregate for the base year, is the index number.

To obtain an index number for a main industrial group, such as manufacturing, indexes computed by the above method are weighted by the employment in each industry as obtained from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, and these products are averaged.

The general average is computed from indexes for the main industrial groups by a similar weighting procedure.

For the period 1901 to 1938, index numbers were calculated by the link relative method. For this period, the percentage change from year to year for each occupation was calculated for each industry, the simple arithmetic average of these percentages obtained, and the resultant percentage increase or decrease applied to the index for the preceding year. To obtain the general index, the main group indexes were weighted in proportion to the number of workers in each group based on data from the decennial census.

HISTORY OF THE REPORT

Statistics of wage rates and hours of labour have been collected by the Department of Labour since it began to function in 1900 and results were published from time to time in *The Labour Gazette*. The first separate report on wages was issued in 1921 as a supplement to *The Labour Gazette*. This was the first in the present series, and it contained statistics for certain trades within various industries in a number of Canadian cities. From 1901-1920, index numbers were shown on a base of average rates in 1913 as 100. The information was obtained mainly from employers and trade unions, but data from collective agreements, information obtained by departmental representatives in the field and that received from *Labour Gazette* correspondents were also used. In subsequent reports, the scope of the statistics has been gradually broadened, additional groups of industries have been added over the years, and the present report contains information for representative occupations in the principal industries of Canada.

RECENT CHANGES

Two tables have been added to this report showing wage rates for selected occupations in Brick and Tile and in Brass and Copper Products. The table for the Electrical Machinery and Equipment Industry shown in previous reports is no longer included. This information is now given in greater detail in the two tables, (1) Heavy Electrical Machinery and Equipment and (2) Refrigerators, Vacuum Cleaners and Miscellaneous Electrical Products.

The number of occupations in the tables has been increased for seven industries, namely: Coal Mining, Boilers and Plate Work, Machine Shop Products, Railway and Rolling Stock Equipment, Heating and Cooking Apparatus, Agricultural Implements and Hotels.

General Wage Changes in 1952

Running Trades: Conductors on one major line received a 12 per cent increase in rates, effective April 1, 1952 and on the other line, 11 per cent, effective May 16. Brakemen, baggagemen and yardmen of both lines received an increase in basic rates of 12 per cent, effective April 1. Locomotive engineers in the Eastern region of both lines received increases of 11 per cent, effective October 1 and in the Western region, 11½ per cent, effective April 1. Firemen on both lines received increases in basic rates averaging 12 per cent, effective April 1, 1952.

Non-Operating Employees: The non-operating employees received an increase in basic rates of 7 per cent plus 7 cents an hour or its daily or monthly equivalent, effective September 1, 1952.

Standard Hours

All classes other than the running trades were on a basic 8-hour day (time and one-half for overtime) and 40-hour week.

APPENDIX

Farm Wages

The data on wage rates in the following tables were compiled from reports of farm correspondents located in all provinces of Canada. Table 1 gives a summary of wage rates as at August 15 from 1941 to 1952 and Tables 2 and 3 give similar data on a provincial basis for the last three years. No data are available for Newfoundland.
