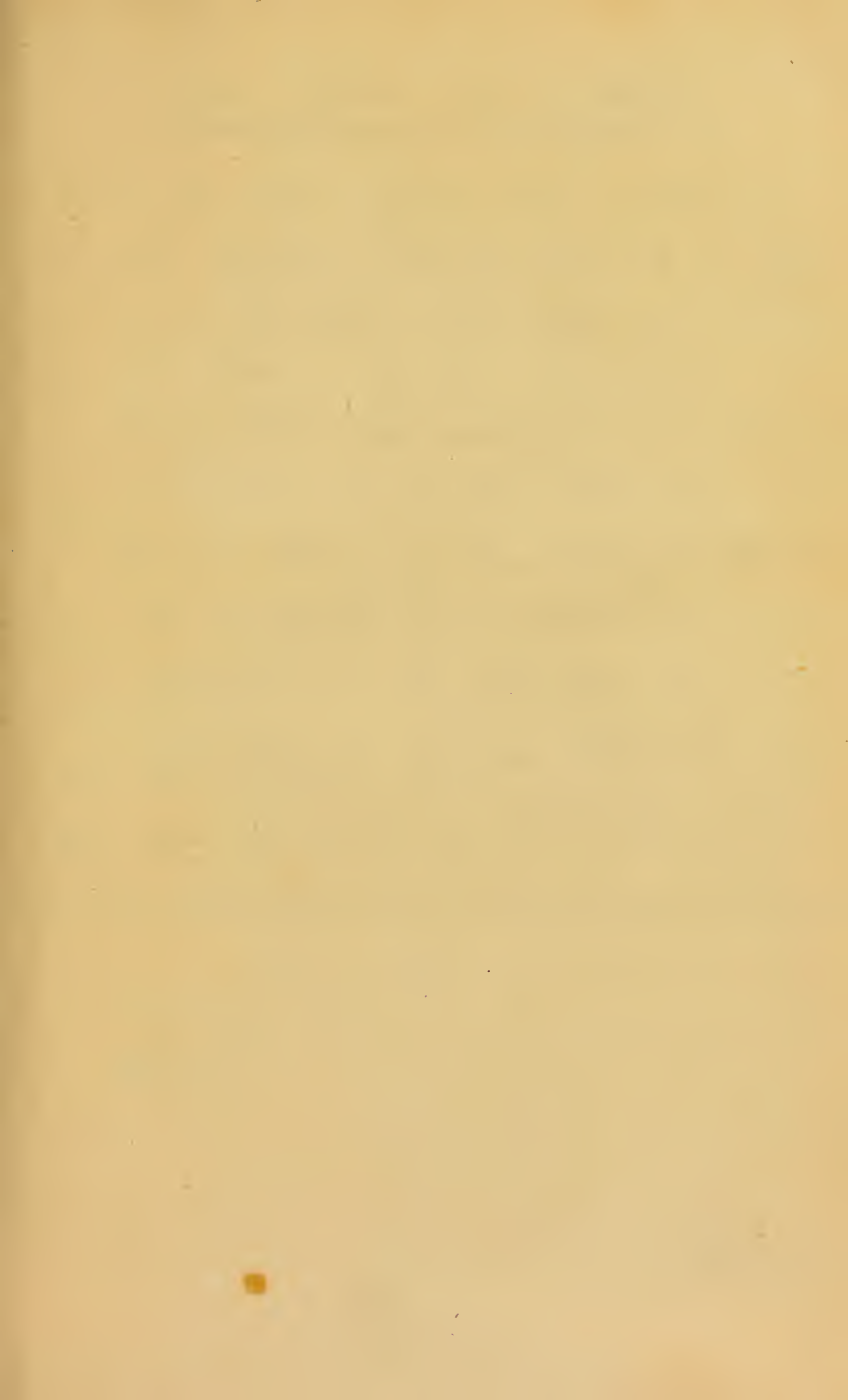

Diese 585 Kataloge umfassende Sammlung gehörte dem bekannten engl. Sammler u. Numismatiker W. Boyne. Der Kat. seiner Sammlung, einer der größten des letzten Jahrzehnts, mit über 3600 No. ist dem letzten Band beigelegt. Bis zum Jahre 1880 sind die erzielten Preise vielfach handschriftlich beigelegt, in den neueren Jahrgängen sind jedoch seltener Preise eingetragen. Es dürfte schwer sein, eine so vollständige Sammlung von Katalogen der weltberühmten Münzauktionen bei Sotheby wieder zusammenzubringen.

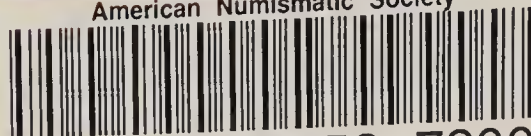
