

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

Dickinson Seminary, will soon, with more than usual success, complete the fifth year of its history. The Trustees, from the beginning, have been determined to give it rank among the highest Seminaries of learning, and they are now pleased to know that, it occupies an enviable position among the first schools of the land. Its beautiful and healthful location at Williamsport, Lycoming Co., Pa., in one of the most picturesque and lovely valleys of the Susquehanna, its convenience of access, being within 30 hours ride of Baltimore and Philadelphia—its abundant facilities for thorough instruction—its high tone of morality, all combine to commend it to the continued patronage and confidence of the public. Though under the immediate care of the Philadelphia and Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, it is not intended to be sectarian. It proposes to furnish a sound, christian, education to the numerous youths who annually flock to its Halls. Having the two sexes under the same Board of Instruction and government, it combines all the advantages, with few of the disadvantages, of a Male and a Female Seminary. Teachers and Pupils live together as a well regulated family.

COURSE OF STUDY.

This embraces a period of three years and is designed to qualify students for teaching in any High School or Academy, or for any department of business. Upon completing the following course the student will be entitled to a DIPLOMA. Those intending to enter college, and others, not wishing to complete the course, can pursue such studies as they desire.

For those studies marked with a Star, others may be substituted.

Those entering upon the above Course, must be well grounded in Arithmetic (Davies,) English Grammar, (Chandler's,) Geography, (Morse's,) Etymology, (Lynd's,) and History, (Goodrich's.)

EXERCISES in Penmanship, Reading, Orthography, Composition and Declamation, continued throughout the course.

Those who wish to pursue the Classics further than is contemplated in the above course, can use any approved text-books; and those who prefer it, may substitute the French and German for the Latin and Greek.

LECTURES on the several branches of Natural Science will be delivered at regular and stated periods.

VOCAL MUSIC.—Instruction in this science will be given to the entire school, by a competent teacher, at regular periods.

A NORMAL CLASS will be formed (when required), and special attention will be given to those who may wish to prepare themselves for the important duties of teaching.

A BIBLICAL CLASS will also be formed for the benefit of such as have the Ministry in view.

ACCOMMODATIONS.

This Institution is furnished with a fine building for school purposes, and a large and commodious Boarding House, recently erected for the accommodation of students from abroad. This is arranged in separate departments for each sex, and is placed under the care of an experienced steward. The Principal's family also occupies a portion of the same building, while the Preceptress and several other Teachers lodge in it, and board, in common with the student, at the Steward's table. Each room is furnished with heavy articles, but the students must provide their own sheets, counterpanes, pillow-cases and towels; all of which, together with all articles of clothing, *must be carefully marked.*

ADMISSION.

Application for admission must be made to the Principal, at his office in the Seminary Building. None will be admitted to the Academic Department who will not pledge themselves to observe all the rules and regulations of the Institution. Every student will be considered a member of the school until the Principal shall be notified of his intention to leave.

APPARATUS.

The Institution is furnished with a superior collection of apparatus, together with full sets of maps and charts, and an interesting cabinet of minerals, thus affording every requisite facility for illustration and experiment in Astronomy, Philosophy, Chemistry, Anatomy, and Physiology.

LIBRARY.

The nucleus of a library has been formed, which already embraces many of the most valuable works in the English language. To this, constant additions are making; and every student, for a trifling fee, can have access to a rich and entertaining fund of information.

DISCIPLINE.

The discipline is mild but firm, calculated to promote intellectual advancement and improvement of the heart. Every encouragement will be afforded to the studious and well-disposed, but the indolent and unprincipled can find no resting-place within the pale of the Institution.

RELIGIOUS SERVICE.

Every student is required to attend the religious exercises at the opening and close of school each day, as well as public worship twice every Sabbath, at such place as parents or guardians may designate.
