This night intruder mission contacted Accident over Davao City, which had been shelled for the previous three day period by a naval gun from Samal Island. This a/c was to observe if the gun was firing, but apparently it was not as no sign of firing could be seen. Accident then told the pilot to drop bombs on Panakan, a town seven miles north of Davao, also telling him there was a wharf jutting out from the town that was to be left undamaged. The bombs were released over the town, but hits could not be observed due to the cloud coverage. The plane then returned to the base.
