New Phase in the Loual Political Circles

Liberal Party Holds 44 Percent of Prefectural Assembly Seats due to Mass Joining of the Party by Independents

The National Election Management Commission compiled a list of executive heads and local assembly members according to party affiliation indicating the new phase of local political circles following the local elections of last April. This survey was conducted on a nationwide basis for the first time after the local elections.

The survey reveals that:

- l. A greater mimber of independents elected joined political parties after the election than before the election. Particularly in the case of prefectural assembly members, close to two hundred of them joined the Liberal Party and the minor parties only one month after the election. As a result, the Liberal Party holds his percent of the total prefectural assembly seats in the country, securing a predominant position in local political circles with a great margin over the Democratic and the Social Democratic Parties.
- 2. The reduction of the fixed number of local assembly members and the merger of towns and villages were carried out to a considerable extent prior to the election. It became clear that the total fixed number of executive heads and assembly members throughout the country after the election was more than seven thousand less than that before the election.

Trend after the election.

The activities of prefectural assembly members are particularly noticeable. The number of independents immediately after the election was 783, but the mumber was reduced to 587 within one month after the election. On the other hand, the Liberal Party gained 77, while the Social Democratic Party and minor parties, including local political parties organized by newly elected assembly members within the prefectures, registered a gain of 6 and 120 respectively after the election.

Of the prefectures where a great change took place, Ibaragi Prefecture led other prefectures with ten out of eleven independents joining the Liberal Party, followed by Akita and Shizuoka Prefectures where the majority of independents joined the Liberal Party. In Nagano and Mie Prefectures, more than ten independents have organized miner parties within the prefectures. A greater number of independents in Guana Prefecture went over to the Democratic Party, giving an absolute majority to the party in the prefectural assembly.

As the result of this trend, the Liberal Party has increased its influence in Miyagi, Akita, Ibaragi, Kanagawa, Shisuoka, and Hyogo Prefectures. In eighteen prefectural assemblies, the Liberal Party has the absolute majority. The National Election Management Commission interprets that this change in the prefectural assemblies was due to activities to win over independents in connection with the election of speakers and vice-speakers at the first session of prefectural assemblies following the election.

The Mumber of Executive Heads and Assembly Monbers

The number of executive heads and assembly members decreased greatly as command to that prior to the election. The number was 195,560 as of June following the election as against the total fixed number of 202,603 as of 1 harch 1951. The number decreased by 7,013 throughout the country. This decrease was due to the reduction in the number of city, town, and village assembly numbers, and to the marger of towns and villages conducted between the end of last year and the election. There were 399 cities, towns, and villages which reduced the numbers of assembly members in accordance with by-laws, and the number of city, town, and village assembly members reduced was h,232.

Furthermore, there was an increase of thirteen cities through the mergar of towns and villages within three months since March, while the number of towns and villages decreased by 2hh. Since the period between September of last year and June of this year, the number of towns and villages decreased by 665.
