Wiki Loves Africa encourages, develops, and provides oportunities for Africa's photographers, creatives and cultural practitioners by leveraging the power of the open movement.

An intended benefit of the project is that, by the competition being hosted locally, it actively contributes to the development of local creatives and the Wikimedia volunteer communities.

Wiki Loves Africa contributes to the UN's SDG 10: Reducing Inequalities: Reduce inequality within and among countries.
