SUBJECT: Transfer Recommendation for GTMO Detainee, Mirzam Mohammed,
ISN: US9AF-00644DP

1. (S) **Personal Information:** Mirzam Mohammed is an Afghan national born in 1964 (age 38) in Gorband, Afghanistan. Detainee has been diagnosed with latent tuberculosis, but is otherwise in good health.
2. (FOUO) **Detention Information:** Subject detainee was an Afghan farmer forcefully conscripted to fight for the Taliban Army against the Hizb-e-Wahdat in Bamian Province. While serving the Taliban Army, detainee worked primarily as a cook. Detainee claims that he did not see any combat while serving the Taliban. On 5 November 2001, the detainee was captured at gunpoint by two people in his village, and turned over to the American forces patrolling the village. Detainee assumed that these people turned him in because, for some unknown reason, they held a grudge against him. Detainee was later transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba, where he arrived on or about 11 June 2002. The detainee was transferred to the Guantanamo Bay detention facility because of his general knowledge regarding the Taliban order of battle and command personalities in Bamian Province. The detainee has been cooperative, but JTF GTMO considers the information obtained from and about him as not valuable or tactically exploitable.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on current information, detainee ISN: US9AF-00644 is assessed as neither affiliated with al-Qaida nor as being a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee folder, the knowledgeability brief (KB), and subsequent interrogations by JTF GTMO, the results of which are available on the JTF GTMO detainee database, the detainee has no further intelligence value to the United States and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detainee has not expressed thoughts of violence or made threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on the above, detainee does not pose a future threat to the U.S. or U.S. interests.
