The witness testified he lived in Chiba Prefecture. He identified Exhibit 2554 as his affidavit and verified its contents. \* The affidavit stated that at the time of the attack on Hankow he was with the photographic section of the Asahi. He sailed aboard a gunboat up the Yangtze to Takashina Unit to photograph the actual scenes of the attack on Hankow. He met the Hirata Unit on Oct 24 and joined with it and went to Wuchang on October 26th. They reached Hankow on the 26th. The river was so crowded that it was impossible to come directly along the bank and they had to walk across a number of ships to go ashore.

Since he thought that the Japanese had already completely occupied Hankow \* he entered \* immediately but found no Japanese soldiers and immediately returned to Wuchang.

October 28th he went to Hankow and a great number of vessels were already at anchor and he could not go directly ashore. He had to walk across thirty or forty vessels anchored side by side. The city had been restored to its former condition and the streets were quite as tranquil as in peacetime. He remained there until November 1st, and during that period conditions in the city had completely returned to normalcy. He left Nov 2nd.

SWORN DEPOSITION

Deponent: OGAWA Saburo

Having first duly sworn an oath as on attached sheet and in accordance with the procedure followed in my country I hereby depose as follows:

- 1. I was born on August 17 1912 (Taisho 1), at my home, 452, Nakanojo-mura, Nakauonuma-gun, Niigata-ken. My present address is 32, Konodai, Ichikawa-shi, Chiba-ken.
- 2. I became an employee of the Tokyo Asahi -r. ss in noril,
  1923, and have been in the service of the same company
  until the present time. At the time of the attack on Hankov
  I was with the Photography Section of the same newspaper.
- 3. Under company orders, I, as a member of the Photo raphy Section of the Tokyo Asahi Mewspaper, sailed aboard a gunboat up the Yangtze River from Kiukiang to Actionehen, with the intention of joining the Takashina Unit for the purpose of photographing actual scenes of the attack on Mankow. However, when I happened to meet the Hirata Unit of the Formosan Army on the evening of October 24, 1933, I joined it

and proceeded with it to Wuchang, arriving on October 25.

Passing through Hanyang, we reached Hankow on the 26th. At that time, the Hanshui River, a tributary of the Language, was so crowded with vessels of all sizes that it was impossible for us to come directly alongside the bank. We, consequently, had to walk across a number of ships to go ashore.

pletely occupied "ankow, I entered the city immediately.

"owever, since " found no Japanese soldiers and since the city was almost completely deserted, " immediately returned to Wuchang, again going by way of "anyang.

On October 28, I again went from Wuchang to Mankow. It that time a great number of vestels were already at anchor on the river, so that upon landing I could not go directly ashore, but had to walk across thirty or forty vessels anchor a side by in order to reach the pier. The city had already been restored to its former prosperous condition, and I was able to go to a restaurant as soon as I went ashore. The streets were quite as tranquil as in peacetime.

I stayed in Mankow until November 1, and diving that period conditions in the city completely returned to normalcy.

On Movember 2, I left Mankow for Yochow with the Sixth Division.
