1. Present availability of linguists with CIC MOS's is such as to preclude furnishing of replacements in Korea from 441st CIC sources.

2. Supply of qualified military intelligence Japanese and/or Korean linguists is inadequate, at the present time, to meet requirements stated in par 5, basic communication without retarding rotation of such personnel now in Korea and/or requiring return to Korea of such personnel who have accrued more than twenty four (24) points in Korean service.

3. In the event that requirements are considered sufficiently urgent to warrant action outlined in par 2 above, suggest Eighth Army:

a. Initiate action to reorganize the 302nd MIS Co to increase the number of interrogator, translator and interpreter cells by the amount required to furnish linguist support for CIC activities utilizing an appropriate number of present CIC spaces.

1. We wish to do everything in our power to assist you in solving your CIC linguist problems. Unfortunately, at present, adequate numbers of linguists with CIC MOS's are not available; therefore, we cannot furnish replacements to you from 441st CIC sources.

2. The entire problem of furnishing qualified military intelligence Japanese and/or Korean linguist replacements to Eighth Army is complicated by the necessity for rotation. If your requirements as outlined in basic communication are to be met, it appears that under present criteria it will be necessary that you retard rotation of linguist personnel now in Korea and we require the premature return to Korea of personnel already rotated to Japan by reason of their having accrued more than twenty-four (24) points in Korean service. It is suggested, therefore, that you carefully review your request for thirty-five (35) linguists to determine that this is the minimum requirement.

3. If you consider that your CIC linguist requirements are sufficiently urgent to warrant action outlined in par 2 above, suggest you initiate action to reorganize the 302nd MIS Company to increase the number of interrogator, translator and interpreter cells by the amount required to furnish linguist support for CIC activities utilizing an appropriate number of present CIC spaces.

1. Creation of another MIS organization as proposed in C/N 1 above will not solve CIC linguist shortages in Korea as indicated by Col Van Natta in his letter (Incl 1) and would not be in consonance with DA concept that an Army Hqs should have one MIS unit containing necessary MI operational personnel for support of G2 activities.

2.

2. Qualified linguist personnel who have not already served in Korea are not available in FEC under the recommended spaces for the CIC augmentation of thirty-five (35) spaces recommended in par 3, C/N 1. Present flow of linguist replacements from ZI is barely sufficient to permit continuation of linguist rotation from Korea. According to DA, sufficient number of qualified oriental linguists from the ZI to fulfill all FEC linguist requirements is not forthcoming in the near future.

3. The 302d MIS Co is presently the linguist agency for G2, Eighth Army which could be reorganized to accommodate additional linguist spaces to fulfill CIC linguist requirements in Korea. This would result in efficient utilization of personnel, reduce administration and be more in consonance with DA concept of utilization of MIS units.

4. Accordingly, Incl 4 is alternate draft 1st Ind to G2, Eighth Army which states that in the event that requirements are sufficiently urgent to retard rotation of linguists in Korea, Eighth Army initiate action to reorganize the 302d MIS Co utilizing thirty-five (35) or more of Eighth Army's present CIC spaces to include additional interrogator, translator, or interpreter cells to support CIC activities.

5. Recommend approval and dispatch of Incl 4.

1. Reference letter from ACoFSS, G2, EUSAK, 8 Jan 52, file nr. KGI, subject as above, Incl 1.
2. Attention is invited to the following relative to letter referenced supra:
 - a. EUSAK CIC detachments do not possess any military spaces calling for linguist MOS's. Any CIC linguists that EUSAK CIC detachments receive carry CIC MOS's basically and their oriental linguistic ability is only an infrequent added specialty.
 - b. The CIC Center is unable from its personnel resources to provide the minimum requirement of CIC agents qualified as oriental linguists for CIC assignments in the FEC.
 - c. Local procurement agency for oriental linguists is MISG/FE, G2, GHQ, FEC.
 - d. A few CIC agents with linguistic ability in oriental languages are assigned to the 441st CIC Det but nearly all of them possess either enough or almost enough points to make them eligible for rotation out of Korea and the theater after very short periods of service.
3. A draft 1st indorsement to referenced letter is enclosed as Incl 2. It suggests that ACoFSS, G2, EUSAK, initiate action to activate a MIS detachment utilizing thirty-five (35) or more spaces out of their present CIC spaces. This is the means by which 441st CIC Det has provided for qualified linguists. Draft Ind also points out this action would be generally in accord with that recommended by ACoFSS, G2, EUSAK, in letter 23 Sep 51, file nr. KGI, subject: "Formation of Provisional MIS Company." (Copy of this letter is attached as Incl 3.)




SUBJECT: Formation of Provisional Military Intelligence Service Company

TO: Assistant Chief of Staff, G2
General Headquarters
Far East Command

1. Recommend that a Military Intelligence Service Company be activated to furnish linguist personnel to CIC detachments operating in Korea. The primary mission of this company will be the operation of a Central Interrogation Center which will screen security risks and interrogate prisoners of war for counterintelligence information.

2. Suggest that the company be organized under the provisions of TO&E 30-600, dated 20 October 1948, and Changes 1 and 2 thereto, dated 12 September 1950 and 27 April 1951 respectively. A breakdown of the proposed teams, total strength of 110, is shown in Inclosure 1. Language qualifications of personnel assigned to this company should include 80% Korean (or Japanese, in lieu thereof), 15% Chinese and 5% Russian.

3. Inclosure 2 lists the items of equipment from TO&E 30-600, with Changes, which would be required for the company.

4. It is requested General Headquarters, Far East Command, establish a Provisional Military Intelligence Service Company, authorizing overstrength of personnel and equipment pending Department of the Army approval.

5. This company is not to be established in Korea, nor the personnel charged against EUSAK Troop basis, until an armistice has been declared and exchange of prisoners and displaced persons is contemplated.

It is requested that your General Order announcing attachment of the 191st CIC Detachment to the 6th CIC District for operational control and training include specific reference to the provisions of paragraph 4b, Annex A (Intelligence) to CINCFC Operation Plan 3-51, with particular emphasis on paragraph 4b(3). This is considered desirable to facilitate local liaison in providing for continued CIC support of the 1st Cavalry Division and its installations.

3. It is further requested that the effective date of the attachment be delayed at least until 15 February in order to enable the Commanding General to settle his command and assure its immediate security.





1. a. Paragraph 3 of reference communication directs that one clearly legible copy of each operational report developed by the Counter Intelligence agencies will be submitted on a continuing basis direct to the Chief, Counter Intelligence Corps, Ft Holabird, Md. Since this copy is to be used for microfilming, only an original will serve.

b. This policy means that the Counter Intelligence Corps Detachments in the field must either type reports twice, or else they must submit a carbon copy to the headquarters they serve.


2. The prestige and reputation of the Counter Intelligence Corps is a touchy matter. Since most of its work is confidential, good work is classified and only errors receive publicity. This has created resentment and misunderstanding in the minds of many commanders: "Free-wheeling", "working for themselves, not the outfit", are common, usually unjustified, complaints. For a commander to have to read carbon copies of his own Counter Intelligence Corps Detachment's reports, while the original goes to the distant Chief in Baltimore is humiliating and irritating; to require teams to type all reports twice is a needless burden.



