It was made by the squaws of the tribe for the Chief's daughter. Col. Hoffman informed Mrs. Hewson that he had been stationed at different posts near the wild Indian tribes for almost twenty years, and in all that time had not seen another Indian doll, nor an attempt to make one. It may be considered the only Indian doll ever made, and therefore a very rare curiosities.
