

PREFACE.

THE AMERICAN SPORTING MANUAL seems to be a necessity. For that reason alone it is published. The aim of the Daily Racing Form Publishing Company is to give the American public the sort of book it needs at a popular price. The thoroughbred turf has been naturally cared for. In other American annual books of record it has always been slurred. The Handicap Tables are keen novelties. Two were first published in the 1897 Manual. In this, five are displayed. In addition an article as to the application of the figures is printed. It contains directions as to the methods used by the editor and handicappers in the office of Daily Racing Form in making their calculations. The track speed and comparative speed tables fit into the figures of handicapping, the basis of which is time. They have been corrected and give the various time tables to date. The history of 1901 pugilism is full and complete and so are the records of every American race track. The book is just what it is said to be, and built for popular use in a popular way.

HANDICAPPING AND PACING.

Successful handicapping is a matter of common sense use of the items of racing. No figures can supply the flexible measure that must be applied to the fields of horses by the turf mathematician. Acquaintance with individuals—horses and men—is the keenest item in handicapping. No figures can give an idea of the liking of horses for different kinds of soil, or human combinations. Both are matters of personal observation and judgment.

The temperament of the thoroughbred is almost as broad in scope as that of humanity. The really great horse, like the sharply acute man, overcomes all difficulties, and wins. There are few really great horses. Some of supreme speed are only creatures of speed. Clifford was a notable example. He would run himself to pieces, unless restrained. The restraint of placing such a horse is often exhaustive and fatal. Imp and Ben Holladay are modern types of the high class and sensible horse. They won their races without riding management. Both showed sense and ambition in their youth—before they raced.

Speed is a keen factor in racing. It is the basis of handicapping of course, because it is the item which bears most sharply upon performance. But speed is valueless unless well calculated upon the basis of how speed was applied in the past. Handicapping is the calculation out of what has been done. Some horses favor racing in front; others choose by mere temperament, to come from behind. Our timing is villainously inaccurate. I have known timers to miss the application of their watches to the start, and average matters on the basis of what horses in the race should do, as compared with what other horses in other races had done. Slipshod time keeping is one of the evils of the American turf. Judges and starters are paid large and timers small sums for their services. Considered in a public way, the timer is a more important official than either judge or starter. The keener of our handicappers, who bet large sums on their ideas of the performance of horses, keep their own time and find such keeping most profitable. The same men watch performance closely and bet on the judgment that comes from pure observation. The winners of today come from the losers of past days.

This fact is the sharpest argument against foreign betting. Mathematics can consider and apply the weights, distances and time of past performance to the probabilities of the future. But figures cannot—unless mingled with the judgment out of observation of racing and knowledge of individual peculiarities—be intelligently applied to racing.

Figures, however, even from the foundation of imperfect timing and report, outclass all other methods of picking winners. For that reason alone the general honesty of racing can be proven, accepted and praised.

The average handicapper, as the public knows him, guesses at his figura-

tive estimates. Unless he does he will not "do." Man isn't a machine. He has moods, strong points, weak points, good days and bad days. The thoroughbred horse is as flexible as man. The bookmaker flourishes upon his percentages, attention to details and the failure of the public to allow for individual peculiarities. Only the great horse and the great man do great things—regularly. Class is the ability to perform and win despite all obstacles.

I consider that there are twenty grades in horsedom. The bad horse isn't any more acrobatic or roguish than the cheap man. Neither can be chosen for reliability. From what I've seen of the turf and its action, I declare, without hesitation, that figures will not select winners unless they are made under the eye of the mathematician who observes the individual he classes, knows that individual's strong and weak points, and at the same time calculates the average of owning and honesty and ability.

The percentage of honesty upon the turf is as high as that of any mercantile corner, with a higher average of chance for trickery. The success of clumsy mathematics as applied to racing proves this statement. If any one does not think so I'll bet him—I to prove my statement, or lose.

THE MATTER OF HANDICAPPING.

The system followed in the office of Daily Racing Form is to estimate in decimal numbers the value of the past racing of the horses in each race—not on the basis of one, but often of twenty or thirty races. Frequently after the test of figures has been applied by the mathematician, the editors add and amend because of special acquaintance or knowledge. So-called "inside information" is never used. The "form" is "form" only.

In this year's Manual, examples are shown of the application of four Handicap Tables. Instead of using a different race for each table as heretofore, the examples are all worked out on one race, which gives the student opportunity to compare results from each, thus enabling him to form his own opinion of their respective merits. The race used was the fifth Hawthorne, September 14, 1899. Examples follow in numerical order of tables as they appear in the Manual:

Results from each of the foregoing tables show that the finish should be as follows: Tulla Fonso, Moroni, Gold Fox, Hard Knot, Fair Deceiver, Tappan.

The actual finish was: Tulla Fonso, Gold Fox, Moroni, Hard Knot, Tappan, Fair Deceiver.

In the note under chart of the race (No. 14560), Moroni is reported as having swerved badly below the sixteenth post, and, as he was beaten only three-quarters of a length for second place, it is probable that, had his jockey been able to keep him straight, he would have finished second, which would have placed the first four horses exactly in the order indicated by all of the handicaps. Knowledge of individuality would cause the handicapper to favor Tappan over Fair Deceiver for fifth place, the former being a game horse, generally consistently doing his best, even when pitted against horses of superior caliber, while the latter, although speedy, has frequently shown a disposition to be faint-hearted when in good company. The layer of odds apparently applied his knowledge of this fact, as he quoted a somewhat longer price against the mare. Altogether, the tables seem to have produced satisfactory results in this race.

A few remarks as to methods of application may be of use to beginners. First—Always get values from races of the same distance as the one you are figuring on if possible. Otherwise take the next shorter distance in preference to the next longer one. Second—There are so many degrees of mud, that necessarily it is difficult to apply the figures of a heavy track race satisfactorily. By careful comparisons, however, a reasonable basis may be arrived at. Perhaps the best way is to use fast track figures, and then use your knowledge of the mud-loving proclivities of each horse in grading the figures up or down as the case may require. For a sloppy track, with good footing underneath, this is certainly best. Third-When two or more horses figure nearly equal, a knowledge of the comparative abilities of the jockeys riding these horses will be found more than useful; in fact, quite necessary to speculative success. Fourth-After all else is said and done, in order to apply with any degree of success any system of handicapping, one must have acquired, by close study or observation of performances, a well-grounded knowledge of the individual peculiarities of each horse being calculated upon Otherwise the work will go for naught. "Figures won't lie." That is, if you make them right.

DIRECTIONS FOR APPLICATION.

The key to the handicap figures above is as follows:

Second column denotes figures of classification. Third column gives the key First column designates time. figures of weights for classification.

A head counts 1 point. A neck counts 2 points. Half a length counts 3 points. A nose counts 1/2 point. length counts 5 points.

One length is equal to 4% pounds at 1 mile, or 14 of a second in time.

Grade down weight and time allowance for lesser distances and grade up for over a mile.

At % of a mile and less, speed is the most important item, outside individuality, to be considered.

As in all handicap tables, the personal judgment of the calculator as to quality, must be used in connection with the figures of classification.

Key to handicap figures as above is as follows: First column designates time. Second column classification values. Hyphenated numbers above each column (for example 15-426 over 1 mile column) 15 is number of points equal to 1 length at 1 mile. 426 means 4.26 points to each pound at one mile.

HOW NOT TO LOSE.

I tackled the thoroughbred racing sport under protest, in the fall of 1889 at Ed Corrigan's West Side track. Before that I had only studied and written about trotters. I was under contract to the Chicago Tribune. The trotters had ended their Western work for the season, and to fill a term I was turned loose among the thoroughbreds. It cost me \$500 that fall. Seeing the necessity of studying the racing side of sporting, I went keenly to the books during the winter. The baseball war turned up before the year was over. I was elected secretary of the National League of Baseball Players and drifted from newspaperdom for a year. But my interest in racing did not die, I kept at the books, and when the Tribune re-engaged me the following spring it was to take charge of its sporting department and personally report racing. Of course I went at my work in a slap-dash way, made mistakes, overlooked personality, bet, and wrote matter which was unfair. I lost \$2,700 that year-1891. Such financial punishment told me that some of my cogs were loose. I had played favorites, information and notion-mildly mixed with public form. I came to the conclusion that form, dashed strongly with knowledge of the personality of the horse, was the true guide. I gathered a lot of individual information about horses and a lesser store of the form of owners. I advised The Tribune to use telegraphic form sheets in 1892 and carried my point. That year I applied the information about horses and men, bet more than I had ever done before and won \$700 on the season. My store of information naturally increased, and in 1893 I cleaned up \$2,800 in betting operations. In 1894 I won \$6,400, mostly at Washington Park. In nineteen days in the middle of that noble meeting I lost but seven bets and won \$7,930.

During the World's Fair meeting at Washington Park I won \$3,450 off a two-dollar note. Though in a position to do so, I never asked an owner for information, except at Hawthorne, where the racing was concise and each regular attendant knew the other and information was gossip. The result of such information was less than profitable. In the averages I simply played the form figures of the past, tempered by what I had seen, outside the figures, the individuality of the horses and prices, when form figures ran into each other. The handicap table was discarded whenever its calculations ran against those of observation.

The latter and the ability to apply it to the horses, as grouped in races, is the key to betting success. Dishonesty on the turf is no broader than that of everyday trade and not worth consideration. I always did of late, though, figure that the incentive to beat a short-priced favorite was too great to be thrown out of calculation. Such favorites are marks for the general turf to shoot at—a natural obstacle for the owner of other horses in the race to bowl over. In the fall of 1894 I started Daily Racing Form—entirely my own idea.

Its work was so keen and hard that the practical application of literary information to everyday racing was impossible and I stopped betting. In 1896, following the old plan, I made seven bets and won six of them. The year following I stopped betting entirely.

The way not to lose as I have found it, is in these few directions:

Never play a horse at less than evens.

Study the horse and its disposition.

Figure form on a basis of universal honesty.

Think for yourself. It is the only way to find how good you are. Give this plan a thorough trial.

When you can, always insure yourself by place betting.

One-two-three betting is not worthy the attention of an intelligent bettor. I once bet Bill Riley at 20 to 1 one-two-three on a horse that went to the post 2% to 1 straight. He was fourth.

Use handicap figures only as a check on your own observation and idea of class.

Never seek to get even on a losing day by taking a chance on a long shot which isn't within calculation. There are other days,

Do not weaken on your choice because the price is long.

The ten years average of winning favorites, all about, is less than 413-7 per cent.

Time is an important factor. Discard the Anglo-American argument about its general worthlessness. I always figured it next to class and individuality.

Class, as I calculate, is general ability to do great things when called upon to do them. Its most important item—supposing ability and speed to be with the horse—is disposition. The highest equine qualities are: Ambition to win and the intelligence to be placed and not to "fight" the rider.

Keep a record of impressions as to individual action and performance in bad going. Less than 17 per cent. of favorites win on tracks that are denominated slow, muddy or heavy.

These are the general rules that led me to avoid loss in betting on the chances of various groups of American race horses.



PUGILISM OF 1902.

Although the knights of the stuffed mitts invaded every state in the Union, excepting New York, during the year 1902, important battles were few and far between. The one most talked of was the championship affair between Jeffries and Fitzsimmons. Bob, it will be rememberd, retired from the ring after he defeated Tom Sharkey, and the fact he came out from his retirement to swap punches with the big ex-boiler-maker added interest in the fight. There was the usual but unnecessary amount of palaver indulged in before they signed articles, but when that important part of the affair was settled, matters went along smoothly. Reports had both men training faithfully, and when they stepped into the ring at San Francisco on the night of July 25 they were fit to fight for a kingdom. It was the consensus of opinion of nine out of every ten fight critics that Jeffries would win and easily at that. He won, as was expected, but only after receiving a most artistic beating. Fitz never fought better and cut his big opponent into ribbons before he succumbed from the effects of a solar plexis wallop. He was, however, greater in defeat than was Jeffries in victory. On the night of December 20 the champion received quite a set-back by failing to stop a big miner, named Jack Munroe, in four rounds.

Gus Ruhlin, Jeff's previous victim, Ed Martin, Bob Armstrong and Tom Sharkey, of the heavy-weight brigade, appeared in London during the coronation festivities. Ruhlin trimmed Sharkey, and Martin put it over his colored brother, Armstrong. Sharkey got "his" so often since Jeffries loosened his slats he is no longer a factor in the ring. Ruhlin hankers for another whirl at the champion, and Martin, despite the stiff argument Armstrong gave him in Philadelphia, also talks of exchanging blows with Jeff. Jim Corbett, however, claims prior right to exchange ring courtesies with the champion. The other big fellows, such as Peter Maher, Fred Russell, "Mexican Pete," Hank Griffin and Gus Lawler, are still useful, as towel wielders. Joe Goddard, known as the barrier champion, and at one time an American champion possibility, was shot in Philadelphia during an election riot and may not recover.

In the general shifting of championship titles, which occurs every year or two, Frank Erne, Frank Childs, Jack Root and George Gardner figured. The title Erne won from Kid Lavigne, and which he defended successfully for several years, was taken from him by Joe Gans in less than sixty seconds of fighting. The sudden but not unexpected termination of the fight was a sad blow to Frank and his most ardent admirers. There was some talk of a return match, but this ended in smoke. Later Erne took another crack at the game and fell a victim to the new championship aspirant, Jimmy Britt. The latter broke into the professional ranks during the year, and before beating Erne, defeated, among others, Kid Lavigne. Britt carries all the ear marks of a champion, but as he draws the color line he will be compelled to play second fiddle to Gans. Gardner relieved Jack Root of the light heavy-weight championship gift title, only to lose it later to Jack Johnson, who also won the colored heavy-weight championship by defeating Frank Childs. Johnson, by the way, looks like a comer. He was not taken seriously until he beat Joe Kennedy in four rounds and Jack Jeffries in five. It was then he was considered some shucks, and when later he defeated Hank Griffin, Frank Childs, George Gardner, Fred Russell and George Lawler, he was voted a good one.

The best light heavy-weight fight of the year, from a slugging view point, was that between Marvin Hart and Kid Carter, at Louisville. It was without doubt the most desperate and the hardest fought battle between men in their division ever witnessed west of the Alleghanies or east of the "Rockies," and at the end the winner, Hart, was as badly used up as was the loser. They also whaled each other for six rounds at Philadelphia and were both outpointed by Jack Root in six-round tilts. Bill Hanrahan, an active member in the same class, died in Chicago. Joe Choynski, the veteran, is still with us, and engaged in a number of battles with varied success. He won over Hanrahan, Al Weinig and Frank Childs, but lost to Carter and Jack O'Brien. Joe believes he is as good as ever, and will remain in the game.

In the middle-weight division we still have Tommy Ryan roosting on the top rail. Ryan was not overly busy during the year, still he managed to pick up enough money to pay expenses and add a little to his bank account. His only fights of importance were with Gorman in England and Carter at Fort Erie, winning both easily. His rival for the middle-weight post of honor, Jack O'Brien, of Philadelphia, was about the busiest fighter in the country. The majority of his battles took place in Philadelphia, where no decisions are rendered. There is a dearth of simon-pure middle-weights of class, so Ryan and O'Brien have practically the field to themselves. In the next division, the welter-weights, we have the same old boys whacking away at each other. Joe Walcott, who in the preceding year beat Champion Rube Ferns, lost to Kid Carter and won from George Gardner, and in the fall of the year injured his arm in a bout with Frank Childs, which shelved him for several

months. The other welters, Ferns, Matthews, Neil, Coughig, and we might add Martin Duffy, have battled with varied success. Al Neil, of San Francisco, however, appears the best of the white welters.

The feather-weights, barring Champlon Corbett and Terry Mc-Govern, have been a busy bunch. Benny Yanger, who classes next to Corbett and McGovern, had a prosperous year and did not book a loser, while on the other hand the two top sawyers, although always in the public eye, had a troublesome time of it. They were driven out of Hartford, New London, Louisville, matched for Baltimore and stopped in Detroit. Besides this, Corbett was prevented from fighting at Denver, his home, and at St. Louis. He engaged in a few six-round tilts in Philadelphia, and won from Joe Bernstein in Baltimore. McGovern engaged in but one fight, that with Dave Sullivan, whom he defeated. The horde of other feathers were continuously at it, winning and losing with regularity. In the bantam-weight class we still have Harry Forbes, who is the best, and he, like Yanger, Abe Attell and Eddie Hanton, the latest addition to the ranks. wound up the year without a defeat. Every state in the Union, with the exception of New York, is now open to the "pugs," and there is a possible chance of New York falling into line, a bill permitting boxing is ready for presentation in January. Kentucky was declared out in September, but came into the field again in December. The best active fighters classify about as follows: Heavy-weights, Jim Jeffries, Bob Fitzsimmons, Jim Corbett, Gus Ruhlin, Ed Martin, Jack Johnson and Bob Armstrong, Lightheavies, George Gardner, Jack Root, Marvin Hart and Kid Carter. Middle-weights, Tommy Ryan and Jack O'Brien. Welter-weights, Joe Walcott, Al Neil, Matty Matthews, Tom Coughig, Martin Duffy, Hugo Kelly, Mike Schreck, Young Gibbs and Rube Ferns. Light-weights, Joe Gans, Jimmy Britt, Jack O'Keefe and Otto Sieloff. Feather-weights, Young Corbett, Terry McGovrn, Benny Yanger and Abe Attell. Bantam-weights, Harry Forbes, Johnny Reagan and Tommy Feltz.

RULES GOVERNING PUGILISM.

There are but two sharp codes of rules governing fistic contests: Those of the London prize ring, and the set formulated, after being drawn up, by the Marquis of Queensberry, who, in his day, was the best amateur boxer in all England. The two codes are displayed here:

MARQUIS OF QUEENSBERRY RULES.

Rule 1—To be a fair stand-up boxing match in a twenty-four foot ring, or as near that size as practicable.

Rule 2-No wrestling or hugging allowed.

Rule 3—The rounds to be of three minutes' duration, and one minute time between rounds.

Rule 4—If any man fall, through weakness or otherwise, he must get up unassisted, ten seconds to be allowed him to do so, the other man meanwhile to return to his corner, and when the fallen man is on his legs the round is to be resumed and continued until the three minutes have expired. If one man fails to come to the scratch in the ten seconds allowed, it shall be in the power of the referee to give his award in favor of the other man.

Rule 5—A man hanging on the ropes in a helpless state, with his toes off the ground, shall be considered down.

Rule 6-No seconds or any other person to be allowed in the ring during the rounds.

Rule 7—Should the contest be stopped by any unavoidable interference, the referee to name time and place, as soon as possible, for finishing the contest; so that the match must be won and lost, unless the backers of both men agree to draw the stakes.

Rule 8—The gloves to be fair-sized boxing gloves of the best quality and new.

Rule 9—Should a glove burst, or come off, it must be replaced to the referee's satisfaction.

Rule 10-A man on one knee is considered down, and if struck is entitled to the stakes.

Rule 11-No shoes or boots with springs allowed.

Rule 12—The contest in all other respects to be governed by the revised rules of the London Prize ring.

LONDON PRIZE RING RULES.

Rule 1-The ring shall be made on turf, and shall be four-and-twenty feet

square, formed of eight stakes and ropes, the latter extending in double lines, the uppermost line being four feet from the ground, and the lower two feet from the ground. In the center of the ring a mark be formed, to be termed a scratch.

Rule 2—Each man shall be attended to the ring by two seconds and a bottle-holder. The combatants, on shaking hands, shall retire until the seconds of each have tossed for choice of position, which adjusted, the winner shall choose his corner according to the state of the wind or sun, and conduct his man thereto; the loser taking the opposite diagonal corner.

Rule 3—Each man shall be provided with a handkerchief of a color suitable to his own fancy, and the seconds shall entwine these handkerchiefs at the upper end of one of the center stakes. These handkerchiefs shall be called "Colors," and the winner of the battle at its conclusion shall be entitled to their possession as the trophy of victory.

Rule 4—The two umpires shall be chosen by the seconds or backers to watch the progress of the battle, and take exception to any breach of the rules hereinafter stated. A referee shall be chosen by the umpires, unless otherwise agreed on, to whom all disputes shall be referred; and the decision of this referee, whatever it may be, shall be final and strictly binding on all parties, whether as to the matter in dispute or the issue of the battle. The referee shall be provided with a watch for the purpose of calling time; the call of that referee only to be attended to, and no other person whatever shall interfere in calling time. The referee shall withhold all opinion till appealed to by the umpires, and the umpires strictly abide by his decision without dispute.

Rule 5—On the men being stripped it shall be the duty of the seconds to examine their drawers, and if any objection arises as to insertion of improper substances therein, they shall appeal to their umpires, who, with the concurrence of the referee, shall direct what alterations shall be made.

Rule 6—The spikes in the fighting boots shall be confined to three in number, which shall not exceed three-eighths of an inch from the sole of the boot, and shall not be less than one-eighth of an inch broad at the point; two to be placed in the broadest part of the sole and one in the heel; and in the event of a man wearing any other spikes, either in toes or elsewhere, he shall be compelled either to remove them or provide other boots properly spiked, the penalty for refusal to be a loss of the stakes.

Rule 7—Both men being ready, each shall be conducted to that side of the scratch next his corner previously chosen; and the second on the one side and the men on the other, having shaken hands the former shall immediately leave the ring, and there remain until the round be finished, on no pretense whatever, approaching their principals during the round, without permission from the referee. The penalty to be the loss of the battle to the offending parties.

Rule 8—At the conclusion of the round when one or both of the men shall be down, the seconds shall step into the ring and carry or conduct their principal to his corner there affording him the necessary assistance, and no person whatever shall be permitted to interfere in his duty.

Rule 9—On the expiration of thirty seconds the referee appointed shall cry "Time," upon which each man shall rise from the knee of his second and walk to his own side of the scratch unaided; the seconds immediately leaving the ring. The penalty for either of them remaining eight seconds after the call of time to be the loss of the battle to his principal; and either man failing to be at the scratch within eight seconds shall be deemed to have lost the battle.

Rule 10—On no consideration whatever shall any person except the second and the referee be permitted to enter the ring during the battle; nor till it shall have been concluded; and in the event of such unfair practice, or the ropes or stakes being disturbed or removed, it shall be in the power of the referee to award the victory to that man, who, in his honest opinion, shall have the best of the contest.

Rule 11—The seconds shall not interfere, advise or direct the adversary of their principal, and shall refrain from all offensive and irritating expressions, in all respects conducting themselves with order and decorum, and confine themselves to the diligent and careful discharge of their duties to their principals.

Rule 12—In picking up their men, should the second wilfully injure the antagonist of their principal, the latter shall be deemed to have forfeited the battle on the decision of the referee.

Rule 13—It shall be a fair "stand-up fight," and if either man shall wilfully throw himself down without receiving a blow, whether blows shall have been previously exchanged or not, he shall be deemed to have lost the battle; but this rule shall not apply to a man who in a close slips down from the grasp of his opponent to avoid punishment, or from obvious accident or weakness.

Rule 14—Butting with the head shall be deemed foul, and the party resorting to this practice shall be deemed to have lost the battle.

Rule 15—A blow struck when a man is thrown or down shall be deemed foul. A man with one knee and one hand on the ground, or with both knees on the ground, shall be deemed down; and a blow given in either of these positions shall be considered foul, providing always that, when in such position, the man so down shall not himself strike, or attempt to strike.

Rule 16—A blow struck below the waistband shall be deemed foul, and in a close, seizing an antagonist below the waist, by the thigh or otherwise, shall be deemed foul.

Rule 17—All attempts to inflict injury by gouging, or tearing the flesh with the fingers or nails, and biting shall be deemed foul.

Rule 18—Kicking, or deliberately falling on an antagonist with the knees or otherwise when down, shall be deemed foul.

Rule 19—All bets shall be paid as the battle money after a fight is awarded. Rule 20—The referee and umpires shall take their positions in front of the center stake outside the ropes.

Rule 21-Due notice shall be given by the stakeholder of the day and

place where the battle money is to be given up, and be exonerated from all responsibility upon obeying the direction of the referee; all parties be strictly bound by these rules; and in future, all articles of agreement for a contest be entered into with a strict and willing adherence to the letter and spirit of these rules.

Rule 22—In the event of magisterial or other interference, or in case of darkness coming on, the referee (or stakeholder, in case no referee has been chosen), shall have the power to name the time and place for the next meeting, if possible on the same day, or as soon after as may be. In naming the second or third place the nearest spot shall be selected to the original place of fighting where there is a chance of its being fought out.

Rule 23—Should the fight not be decided on the day all bets shall be drawn, unless the fight shall be resumed the same week, between Sunday and Sunday, in which case the referee's duties shall continue and the bets shall stand and be decided by the event. The battle money shall remain in the hands of the stakeholder until fairly won or lost by a fight, unless a draw is mutually agreed upon, or, in case of a postponement, one of the principals shall be absent, when the man in the ring shall be awarded the stakes.

Rule 24—Any pugilist voluntarily quitting the ring previous to the deliberate judgment of the referee being obtained shall be deemed to have lost the fight.

Rule 25—On an objection being made by the seconds or umpire the men shall retire to their corners, and there remain until the decision of the appointed authorities shall be obtained; if pronounced "foul" the battle shall be at an end, but if "fair," "time" shall be called by the party appointed, and the man absent from the scratch in eight seconds after shall be deemed to have lost the fight. The decision in all cases to be given promptly and irrevocably, for which purpose the umpires and the referee should be invariably close together.

Rule 26—If a man leaves the ring, either to escape punishment or for any other purpose, without the permission of the referee, unless he is involuntarily forced out, shall forfeit the battle.

Rule 27—The use of hard substances, such as stones or sticks, or of resin in the hand during the battle shall be deemed foul, and on the requisition of the seconds of either man, the accused shall open his hands for the examination of the referee.

Rule 28—Hugging on the ropes shall be deemed foul. A man held by the neck against the stakes or upon or against the ropes shall be considered down, and all interference with him in that position shall be foul. If a man in any way makes use of the ropes or stakes to aid him in squeezing his adversary he shall be deemed the loser of the battle, and if a man in a close reaches the ground with his knees, his adversary shall immediately loose him or lose the battle.

Rule 29—All glove or room fights to be as nearly as possible in conformity with the foregoing rules.

RACING STATISTICS OF 1902.

This is the first carefully prepared statement that has ever been published showing the total yearly winnings of the thoroughbred in the United States as a whole. The period covered is the year 1992, from January 1 to December 31, inclusive. In the main the figures are official, but one item is an estimate that is more likely to be too small than too large. That is the allowance of \$250,000 to cover such meetings as Dallas, Los Angeles, Denver, Sacramento, and a host of fairs and small meetings of various descriptions at which purses are offered for the runners.

The imposing, the surprising, feature of this tabulation is that it reveals the magnificent total of \$4,662,424 as the gross earnings of the horses that raced over the tracks of the United States in 1902. This is at least a million dollars more than any expert would have named at an off-hand estimate, and is impressive evidence touching the vitality and strength of the American turf. The various racing fields contributed to this total as follows, in order of importance:

By dint of industriously campaigning from San Francisco to New York and back again, the veteran trainer and owner, Green B. Morris, enjoys the satisfaction and fame of heading the list of winning owners of 1902. His margin over the Chicago owner John A. Drake, is not a great one, but is sufficient. The \$92.120 of the Drake stable was nearly all won by two horses, Savable and Wyeth. F. C. McLewee & Co., who rank third, won their \$84,730 with their two magnificent racers Gold Heels and Major Daingerfield. August Belmont's fine total of \$77,466 was won by horses of his own breeding. One thing stands out plainly enough in the list of winning owners, and that is that S. C. Hildreth would have been the leader had he retained the horses he sold to Durnell & Herz, the money they won for the latter firm, added to his own credit of \$71,375, being more than enough to have enabled him to lead Green B. Morris. Owners whose horses made satisfactory returns last year were those of J. W. Schorr, Barney Schreiber, Whitney & Duryea, G. C. Bennett & Co., L. V. Bell, S. S. Brown and P. Dunne, and also the one-horse stable of Mrs. L. Curtis. The stables of Messrs. J. R. & F. P. Keene, W. C. Whitney, A. Featherstone and J. B. Haggin won respectable sums, but because of their big strings and many disappointments were all probably on the losing side.

A little analysis will show that western stables make a good showing. Of the thirty-seven stables that won \$25,000 or more, twenty-one are western owned, and in this Green B. Morris is credited to the east, when as a matter of fact he might with equal propriety be credited to the west. The table following gives the winnings of all stables credited with \$5,000 or more:

HORSES OF 1902.

A speedy weight-carrying and staying three-year-old, Major Daingerfield is the leading winner among the horses of 1902. His splendid total of \$57,685 was gallantly won, and he was probably the best three-year-old of the year, although that is a matter the admirers of Hermis and McChesney consider open to debate. A twoyear-old, the Futurity winner, Savable, comes second, with \$46,100 to his credit. Third, fourth and fifth places are filled by two-yearolds, two splendid representatives of the four-year-old and upward class in Gold Heels and Advance Guard being sixth and seventh in the winning list. That the richest prizes of the turf are for the two-year-olds and three-year-olds is amply demonstrated by the fact that of the twenty leading winners of the year only four were four years old or more, Gold Heels, Advance Guard, Blues and Flying Torpedo, the other sixteen winners of the twenty being nine threeyear-olds and seven two-year-olds. The table following gives the winnings of all horses that won \$4,000 or more and furnishes decidedly interesting reading:

A very busy rider last year was jockey J. Ranch, who hails professionally from California, but is a Chicago born lad. He leads all riders of last year in number of races won and number of mounts. He does not lead in percentage, Buchanan being first in that respect, with 23.71; Coburn second, with 23.68; Dominick third, with 23.59, while Ranch's percentage is 23.41. A comparison of this record in the saddle of last year with those of other leaders of recent years affords the following interesting exhibit:

BILLIARD RECORDS TO DATE.

The game of billiards, so far as professionalism is concerned, has passed its zenith, and as time elapses it will be seen that the skill exhibited by Frank C. Ives and Jacob Schaefer in their record breaking matches of November 12 to 17. 1894, New York, N. Y., and December 3 to 8, 1894, Chicago, Ill., must be classed with the lost arts. The style of game then played was that known as "14-inch balk line, anchor barred, one shot in." In the first series of games, six nights, 600-point blocks, Ives made a grand average of 48 24-37; Schaefer, one of 41 20-37. At Chicago, Ives' figure was 41 33-87; that of Schaefer 32 47-87. Ives made the record run of 359; Schaefer the record average, 62 14-15 in 944 points, for one night's play. It is asserted that nothing approaching the above performances will ever again be seen. Slosson, the third first-class American expert, is far below Ives and Schaefer in speed at the same style of billiards, and the nearest "shortstop" record, that of Sutton, is a grand average of 21 1-10 in less than half the number of points played by Ives and Schaefer.

Obstacles have since been raised to impede the speed of the first-class men, and it may be said that the billiardist of the future will be so inured to overcoming difficulties that upon the return to 14-inch balk line billiards, he will contiue counting indefinitely, just as would a champion of the present if he reverted to playing with four balls. But the argument will not hold, as a steeplechaser never was known to win a high-class race on the flat after being pounded to death across country carrying a crushing weight. Even so great a billiardist as Maurice Vignaux contends that the latest improvement in billiards, i. e. "18-inch balk line, anchor barred, no shot in," is too hard a game, and if this man, with his wonderful physique and perfect pendulum stroke, so argues, what chance is there to build up a champion from a youngster who thinks nothing but the latest innovation is the style of billiards for a beginner.

The institution of "academy" play in this country was looked to as a means of developing billiard experts, as in France the great players have thus been enabled to gain a good livelihood, at the same time being furnished with hours of the best practice daily. But Green's Academy in Chicago has now been in operation a long time, and as yet has developed nothing sensational in the way of experts new to the admirers of the game.

Best run, push shot and jawing prohibited—321, Cyrille Dion, Irving Hall,

New York, N. Y., in a match against John Deery, November 29, 1872. Best average, push shot and jawing prohibited—40 20-37, Cyrille Dion, in

a match of 1,500 points against A. P. Rudolphe, Tammany Hall, New York, N. Y., April 7, 1876.

Best run, push and crotch barred—492, Melvin Foster, Irving Hall, New York, N. Y., April 1869, in play-off game with P. Snyder. Best run in match, 321, Cyrille Dion, November, 1872, contest with John Deery.

THREE BALL GAME.

Best run, 5×10 table, the standard match size: 1,531, Maurice Vignaux, in a match of 4,000 points against George F. Slosson, Paris, France, April 12, 13, 14, 1880. The game began April 10, 800 points being played each night. On the third night Vignaux reached 2,400, with an unfinished break of 651. The next night he ran 800 and Slosson did not get a shot. When he had made 80 on the final night's play, he missed.

Best average—333 1-3, Jacob Schaefer, in a match of 1,000 points against George F. Slosson, McCormick's Hall, Chicago, Ill., May 15, 1879.

Best run on 4½x9 table—3,000, Jacob Schaefer in a match against J. F. B. McCleary, May 29, 30, 31, 1890. McCleary received odds of a discount. After Schaefer began his fourth inning McCleary did not get a shot.

Best average on a 4½x9 table—751, Jacob Schaefer, in 3,000 points, San Francisco, Cal., May 29, 30, 31, 1890. This record has incorrectly been published as 750. Schaefer's score was 0, 4, 0, 3,000. Total 3,004. The 4 made in the second inning were discounted by McCleary, who made a total of 15.

AMATEUR RECORDS.
