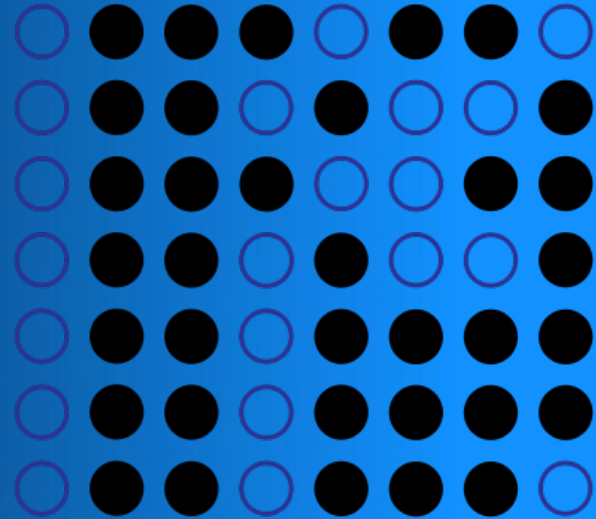

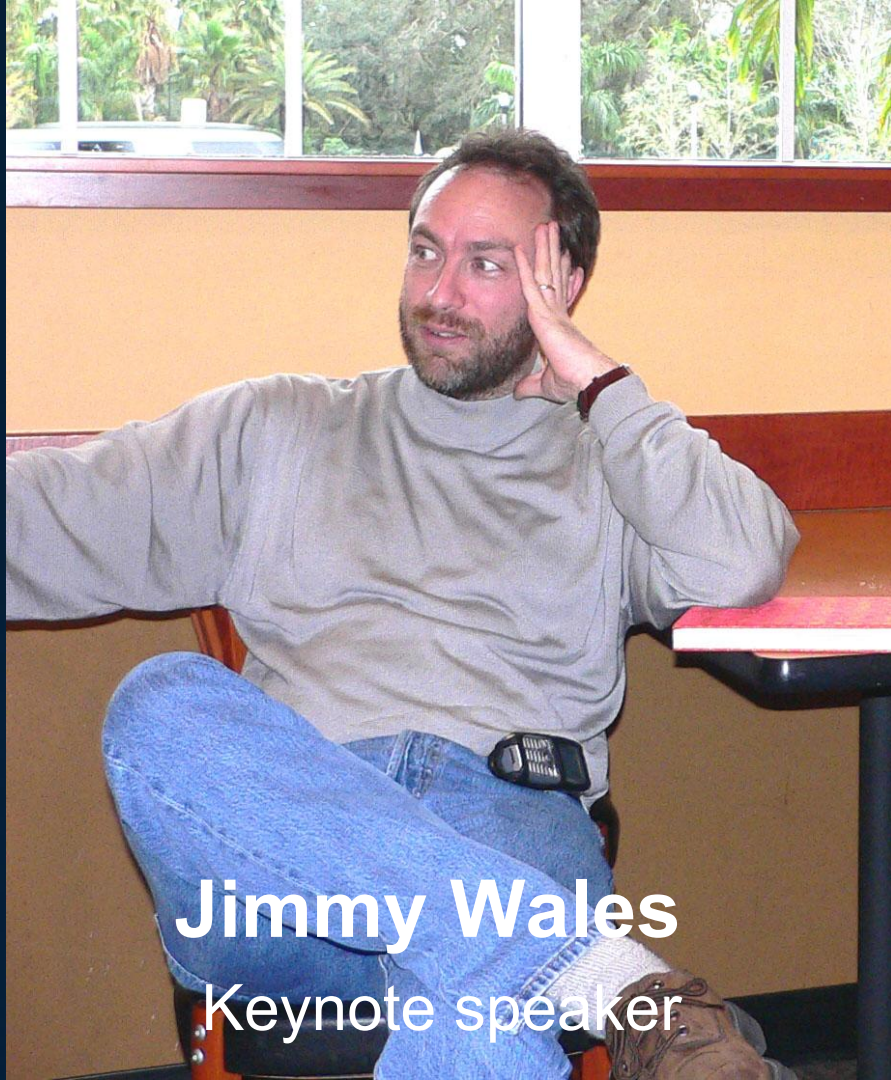

Grant application

The irreplaceable and indispensable list of

DONT'S

1. Open a grant draft with 210 characters and then do not complement it on-wiki for six months.

Primary result: Withdrawal of the grant by Wikimedia Foundation grants administrator.

Secondary result: An opportunity to have an extensive correspondence with the grants administrator!

2. Set the end date of the previous grant to the end of the year and then do not open the next annual grant application before the 12th of July the next year.

Primary result: ineligibility to use remaining funds for the new project.

Secondary result: An irresistible opportunity to use them nevertheless!

3. Use the funds from previous grant and do not make it known to the representatives of Wikimedia Foundation.

Primary result: Conflict with the previous signed grant agreement.

Secondary result: An opportunity to have an extensive correspondence with the grants department of Wikimedia Foundation!

4. If you feel overwhelmed by substantive and important issues, do not attend reporting matters and other bureaucracy.

Primary result: Lack of accessible information about previous activities, lack of funds for future activities.

Secondary result: A challenging opportunity to do all the reporting and application writing in a compressed time period!

Results?

1) Funded grant application of 31,927 euros and 21 cents.

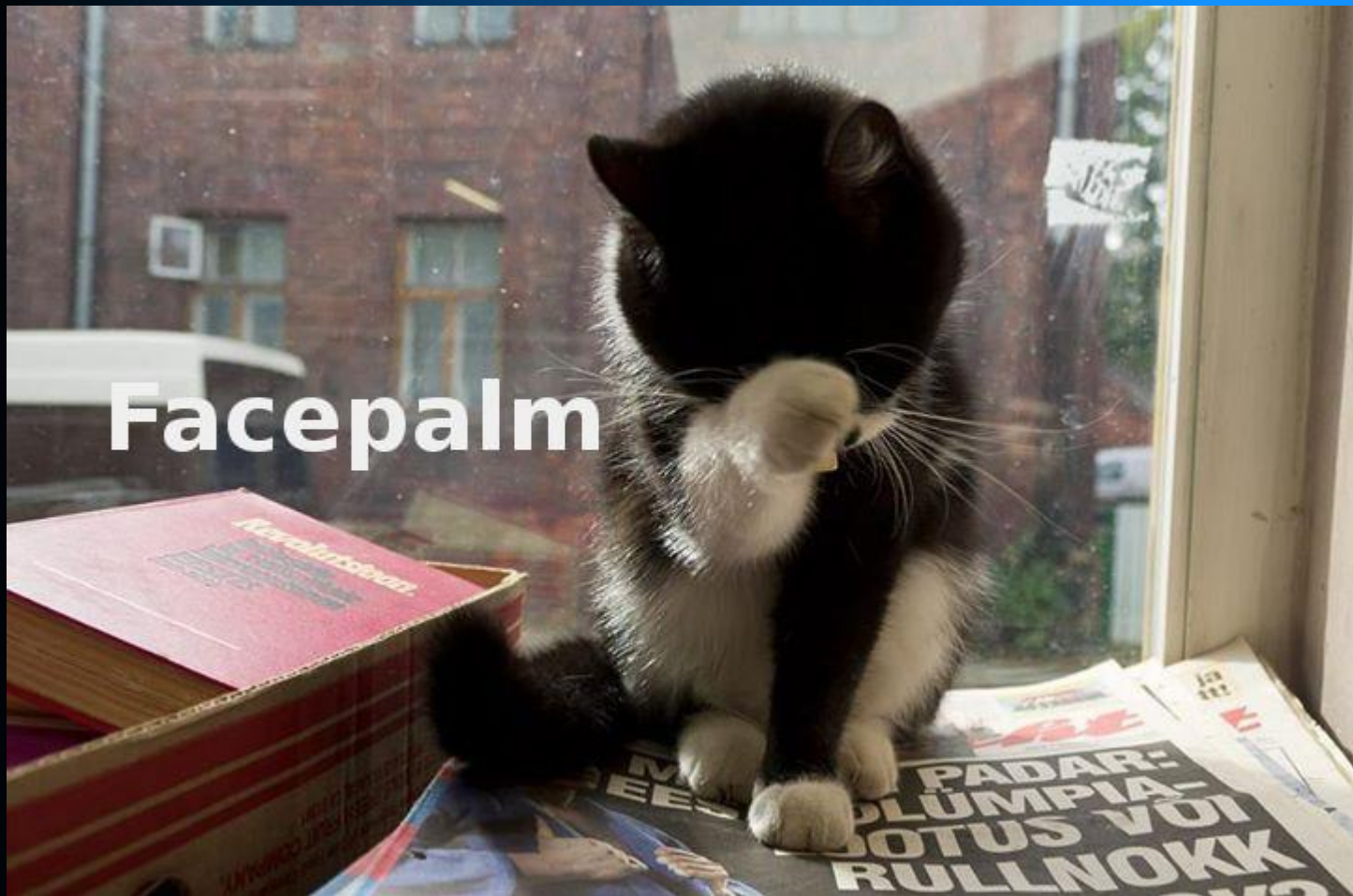
