We sell our stock and warrant it true to name and of quality represented, with the express understanding and agreement that should any not prove true to name, we will refund the money paid or replace the vines with others that are true, but are not liable for damages other than herein named.

Location.—Three miles south of Dunkirk, at which point we ship by either the L. S. & M. S. R. R.; N, Y. L. E. & W. R. R.; N. Y. Chi. & St. L. (Nickel Plate) R. R.; W. N. Y. & P. R. R.; and D. A. V. & P. R. R. Electric cars connecting with all day and evening trains at Dunkirk go directly past our office and cellars.

Packing done in the most thorough manner. No CHARGE FOR BOXES.

- **Coods delivered** free at our freight, express or post-office, after which our responsibility ceases.
- We never substitute, but we reserve the right to fill orders for one-year vines with older vines of the same size, unles instructed to the contrary.
- **Samples** will be mailed to those wishing to purchase in quantity, at 100 rates, with 5 cents added for postage on three 1-year vines, and 10 cents on three 2-year vines.
- **Time of shipment.** For fall trade we usually begin digging Oct. 1. Our Grape Vines and Currants being stored in cellars, e n be safely sent by mail or express any time during winter, and by freight after March 1st.

### TERMS.

Cash, or satisfactory references from unknown correspondents.

All Bills shipped before Nov. I, must be paid by Dec. Ist. From responsible dealers who order in the Fall for Spring trade (vines not to be shipped before Nov. 1), we will accept note at bank due May 15th next without interest if references are satisfactory.

For all Bills not paid by Dec. 1st, we will draw at sight, without notification.

Interest charged on all bills overdue. Note PAYABLE AT BANK for 30 or 60 days will be be accepted on satisfactory references.

If to be shipped C. O. D., satisfactory references or one-fourth of the bill must be sent with the order by unknown correspondents; return charges on the money will in all cases be charged.

Weight of vines packed for shipment:-- I year No. 1, about 100 to 150 lbs. per 1000. I year No. 2, about 80 to 110 lbs. per 1000. 2 year No. 1, about 280 to 350 per 1000.

We will quote freight or express rates to any point on application.

#### THE "EATON" CRAPE.

Awards.-Silver Medal by Mass. Hort. Society, and Bronze Medal by American Pomological Society.

The following is an editorial from the Rural New Yorker:

"We have frequently alluded to the Eaton Grape. The vine has proven perfectly hardy, as vigorous as Concord, with large leaves, free from mildew, continuing healthy until frost. The berries hold well to the stems; they neither mildew nor crack more than Concord, though of the largest size. The pulp is less than the Concord or Worden, and not so tough. The berry is for the most part juice; not so sweet as Concord, but free, or nearly so, of the foxy flavor of that variety. The bunches average larger than those of any hardy, healthy black grape ever grown here. It ripens *fully*, a few days before Concord.

EATON: —Largest bunch and berry of any I have grown. I have clusters larger and finer than the colored plates sent out. Quality is very good, better than Concord; is a fine grower and seems perfectly hardy. We had the hottest and driest season ever known here, but Eaton never wilted; seemed perfectly at home in this hot climate. Ripens with Concord.—G. W. BROWN, Winfield, Kansas.—*Am. EATON.- Very large and showy bunches and berries; fruit about double the size of Concord. Very strong and healthy so far. -Report of Arkansas Experimental Station,
