

Extensive burning of many villages is raising shelter and protection concerns. Humanitarian needs are likely to be: food, nutrition, health, shelter, protection. Before the crisis there were 170 000 highly food insecure people.

21 000 Rakhine people and from other ethnic groups have been internally displaced, receiving assistance from the Government.

Humanitarian activities in North Rakhine State continue to be suspended except for the Red Cross Movement.

Potentially 300 000 Rohingyas remain outside camps in Central and North Rakhine State, with no or very little access to humanitarian assistance. Needs are difficult to assess due to lack of access, but are likely to include: food, nutrition, health, shelter and protection.
