A defective electric wire on the second floor of the Claiborne Sash, Door and Blind Factory, 2610 Claiborne street, is said to have been responsible for the conflagration that destroyed that structure and damaged a number of other buildings in the vicinity, causing a total loss of about \$27,000.

Alce Plair Gordon, 34 years old, who was shot by her niece, Mrs. Mahel Simpson, 16 years old, on the front gallery of the Simpson home, 7021 Lake avenue late Thursday afternoon, is said to be dying in the Charity Hospital. The woman, who was shot in the right lung, took a train for the worse Friday afternoon and the police were sent to the saloon of Gaspar Greco, 101 St. Charles street, where a quantity of case and barrel whiskey was seized.

The Magda, L.A., postoffice and store was robbed Thursday night by two masked bandits who got about \$30 in cash. The two men went in an automobile and called J. L. McGrew, the postmaster, from his residence, saying that they wanted to buy groceries. He went to the store and when they got inside the strangers whipped out two pistols and ordered McGrew to hold up his hands.

Resources of Louisiana's state banks increased more than thirty-two million dollars in the year ending September 25, according to a statement issued Friday by R. N. Sims, state bank examiner. This is the greatest gain in the history of Louisiana state banks, and is very nearly double the entire gain from September 1, 1911, to September 25, 1916. This phenomenal gain has been steady for the last year, the gain from June 30, 1917, to September 25, 1917, amounting to more than six million dollars.
