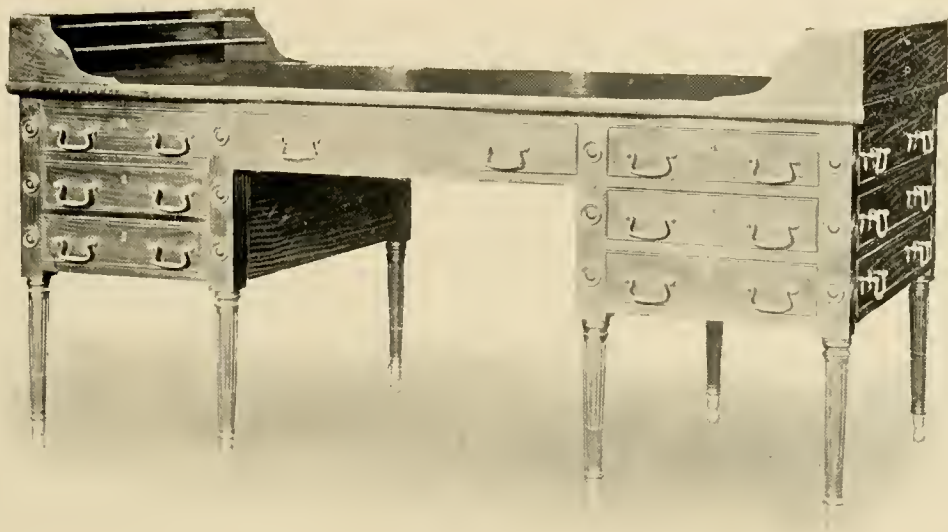

Height, 36 inches. Width, 42 inches. Depth, 21 inches. Mirror Back, 18 x 36

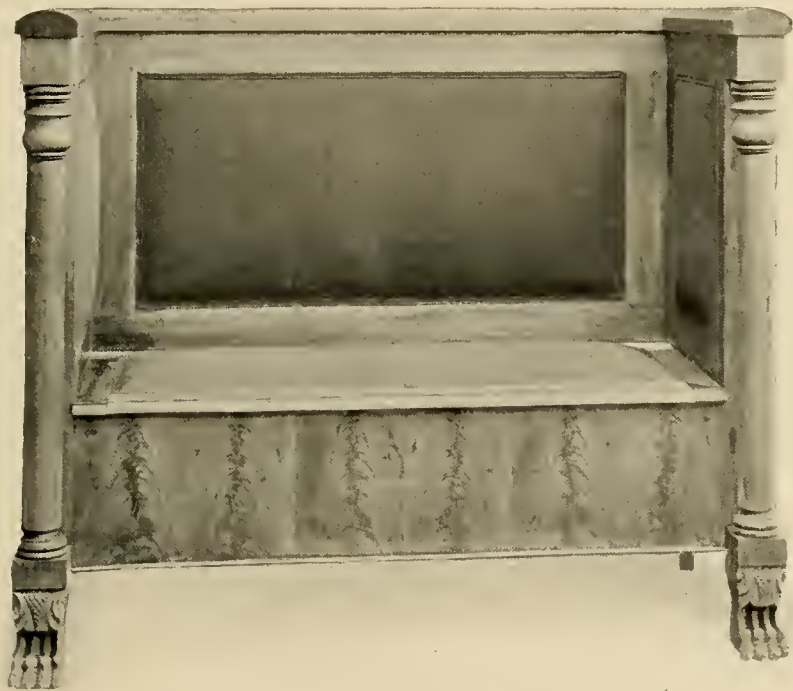
An old Southern home furnished the original of which this beautiful piece is a copy. While simple indeed, it is very satisfying.

These are to be had in variety—some having open backs, some elaborately carved.



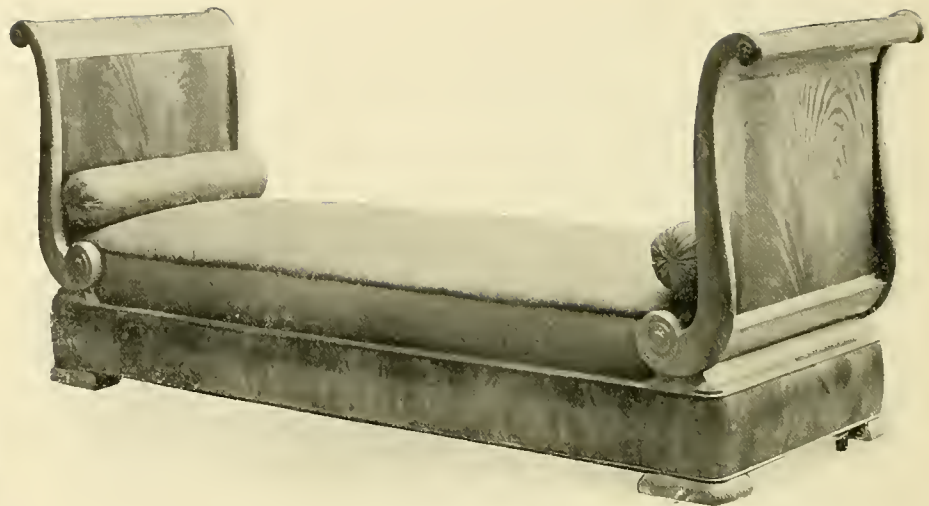
No. 220. Hall Settle

A typical Southern Colonial piece.

**No. 212. Arm Chair**

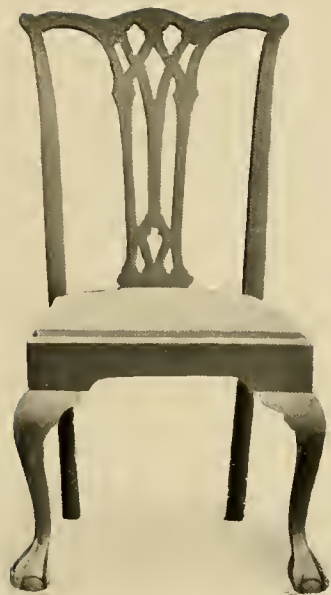
Adapted for use in a dining room when a set of arm chairs is desired in fact wherever a small arm chair can be used.

Length, 17 inches. Height, 8 inches.  
Substantially made. Has carved spindles and claw feet.







No. 105. Chair

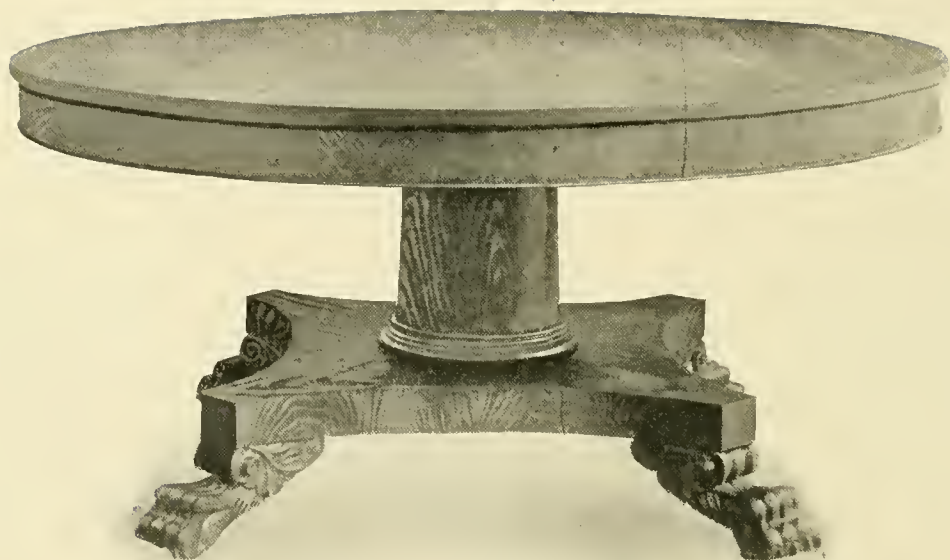
This excellent chair follows the lines of one of Chippendale's best models. Chaste and clean cut as to line, perfect in construction. Made also with arms. One of the most satisfactory dining chairs to be had.

## No. 262. Desk

Height, 40 inches. Width, 36 inches. Depth, 18 inches.

Beauty and utility are charmingly combined in this Desk. The leaf and front are crotch mahogany. Opening the desk operates the slides automatically, saving one's nerves and the desk's hinges at once.





No. 199. Dining Table

Diameter of top, 60 inches.

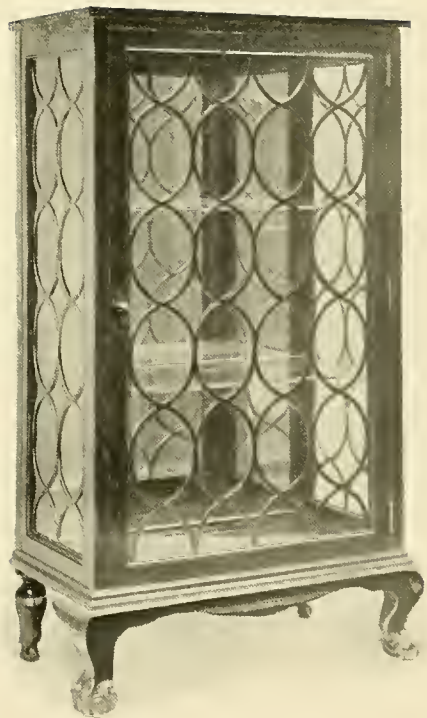
Who possesses this piece may be proud to call his friends "to sit around his mahogany."

The mirror back and glass shelves make this a capital piece for the display of one's finest glass and china. Note the liberal depth.

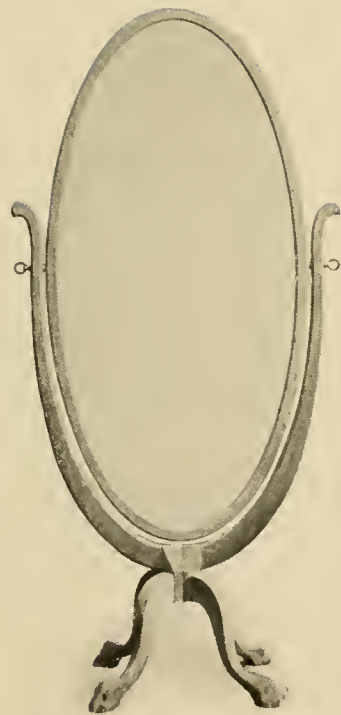
No. 190.

A Chippendale model, about 1760. Sturdy and strong but having excellent lines.

Side chair to match.





**No. 280. Sheraton Hanging Cabinet**

Length, 48 inches. Height, 36 inches. Depth, 18 inches.  
Mirror back.

Suggestive of the Dendy Sadler interiors. Inlaid lines relieve the plain surfaces and the whole effect is graceful and pleasing.

**No. 235. Cheval**

Height, 59 inches. Glass, 24 x 52 inches.

This Cheval occupies little floor space, the glass is large, and the piece as a whole is convenient and graceful.

**No. 187. Oval Table**

Length, 30 inches. Width, 22 inches. Height, 27 inches.

There are innumerable uses for such a table. We make it with square top and with claw feet, or as illustrated.





### No. 250. Dresser

Height of case, 36 inches.

Width 44 inches.

Depth, 21 inches.

Plain French Plate Mirror, 22 x 29 inches.

Front of case and mirror frame are fine crotch mahogany.

Chiffoniers of several styles to match.

### No. 278. Miniature High Boy

Height, 54 inches.

Width, 27 inches.

An admirable piece for one's smaller articles of apparel. Quite as convenient and somewhat more graceful than the average chiffonier.





### No. 303. Octagonal Library Table

Diameter of top, 60 inches.

None of the "old feeling" has been lost in reproducing this table. The top is solid mahogany and the base is fine crotch mahogany. We still have the original.

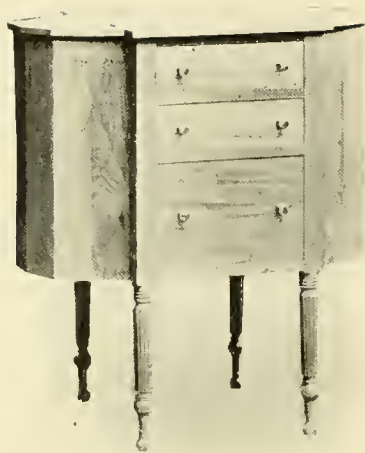
### No. 252. Man's Chiffonier

Height, 48 inches. Width, 40 inches.

Depth, 25 inches.

Divisions in top drawers for neckwear, collars and cuffs. Large drawer for shirts, also divided. Trousers trays enclosed in cabinet. Have we overlooked anything for a man's convenience?





### Martha Washington Sewing Table

No. 130.

Height, 28 inches. Length 27 inches.  
Width, 15 inches.

Who can conceive one more practical? The deep pockets on the ends and a delightful little needle tray in the upper drawer are interesting and very useful features.



### No. 181. Narrow Chiffonier

Height, 48 inches. Width, 28 inches. Depth, 21 inches.

One of a series composed of dressers with oval or square mirrors, bureaus, twin beds, chiffoniers of standard width having square or round mirrors all of fine proportions, tastefully carved, and having crotch mahogany fronts.

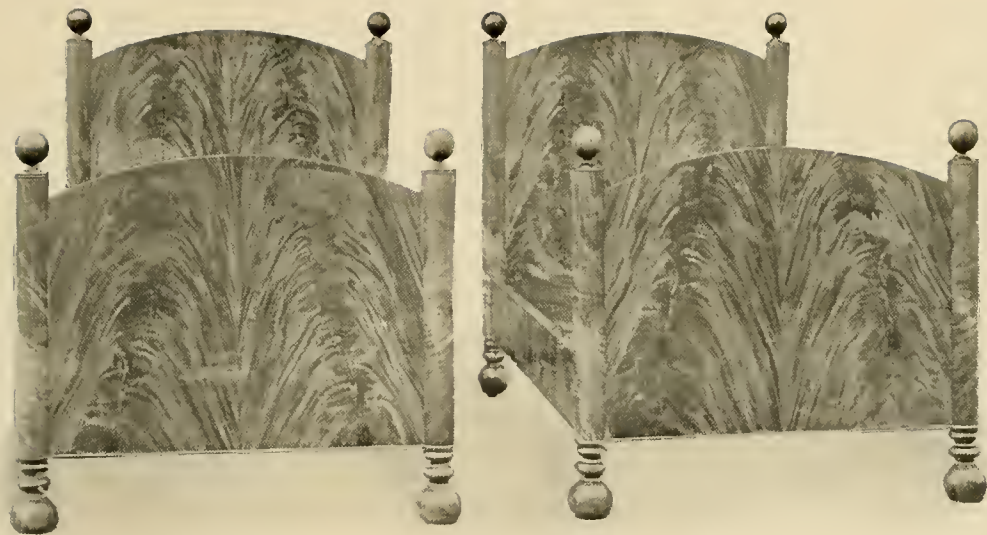
### No. 231. Oval Writing Table

Height, 33 inches. Width 36 inches.  
Depth, 22 inches.
