# ADVERTISEMENT.



THE advanced state of the LYCEUM LIBRARY has long demanded a new and improved CATALOGUE, and the following has been gratuitously compiled with a view of supplying the desideratum. Great care has been taken to make it correct in each department, for which end every accessible source of information has been consulted.

The Compilers have increased and amplified the SECTIONS under the different CLASSES, to suit the character of the present Works in the Library. The Title of each has been carefully transcribed from the Book itself; and some anonymous Works will be found to have the names of the Authors assigned to them; these are well authenticated. For facility of reference, the same Work, in some instances, will be found inserted in two Sections, when it appears to partake of the character of both.

The new Analytical Arrangement of the PAMPHLETEER, and MISCELLANEOUS PAMPHLETS, it is hoped, will prove acceptable and useful.

Each Section is so Printed as to admit of interleaving.

No further remarks, by way of explanation, seem necessary, as the TABLE of CONTENTS will best elucidate the plan of the Work.

TERMS OF ADMISSION.

I.—EVERY Person who is admitted a Member of the Society, shall, at the time of his admission, pay into the hands of the Librarian or the Treasurer, the sum of two guineas; he shall also pay the further sum of six shillings and three-pence in advance, for every half-year following, or such a proportion of it as shall be rated from the time he subscribes, to the first day of the following January or July. And the money hence arising, shall be laid out in promoting the interest and design of the Institution.

II.—Every Subscriber shall have the right to dispose of his property in the Library in any mode by which personal property is usually transferred; the sum of five shillings to be paid on every transfer, except by a Father or Mother, or his or her Son or Daughter, or the Son or Daughter to his or her Father or Mother, or Brother or Sister, on the payment of one Shilling; and in cases of death free.

III.—Any Lady or Gentleman, during an occasional residence in the town, may be accommodated with the use of the Library, on paying the sum of two shillings and sixpence per Month in advance, provided that such occasional

resident be introduced by a Subscriber, (who shall sign his name in a book kept for that purpose, and be answerable for any loss, damage, or fine) and agree to be subject to the laws of the Society.

#### OFFICERS OF THE SOCIETY.

IV.—The Officers of the Society shall consist of a Committee, President, Treasurer, Secretary and Librarian.

V.—All the Subscribers, as being contributors equally to the support of the Institution, shall have their rights, powers, and privileges the same; (except in such cases as shall be hereinafter specified,) their voices shall in all cases be of equal weight, and they shall all, without distinction, be eligible to any of the above mentioned offices.

#### GENERAL MEETING.

VI.—A General Meeting shall be held annually, on the *Second Thursday* in December, at Six o'clock in the evening, in the Library Room, and a notice that such General Meeting is to be held, shall be sent by the Librarian to each Member, in the preceding week. The President of the Society shall take the Chair at half-past Six o'clock precisely, and in case of his absence at that hour, the Subscribers present shall choose a Chairman and proceed to business.

VII.—All questions which come before the Society (except such as relate to the alteration or repeal of laws, or the proposal of new laws) shall be determined by the sense of the majority of the Members present. Ladies, who are Subscribers, shall have the privilege of voting by proxy, providing the proxy be a Subscriber. The manner of voting shall in all cases be by ballot, and when the numbers are equal, the President shall have the casting vote.

VIII.—No law, once established, shall be repealed or altered, nor any new law added, except at a general meeting, and by two-thirds of the Members present: any new law, or repeal, or alteration proposed, shall be fairly written out, and signed by the proposer, and shall be hung up in the Library Room for inspection, at least one calendar month previous to the general meeting, and a printed copy thereof sent to each Member.

#### COMMITTEE.

IX.—A Committee of eleven Members shall be chosen annually out of the Society at large, at the aforesaid general meeting, in the manner following:—Each Member of the Library shall be requested to make out a list of Gentlemen, not exceeding eleven in number, of whom he wishes the Committee to consist;

which list he shall sign with his own name, and either deliver it to the Librarian, or send it by a Subscriber, provided that such Subscriber countersign the same, and it may be delivered any time before the day of meeting, or on that day, up to the hour at which all other business shall have been disposed of. The Librarian shall immediately deposit such list (through a crevice provided for that purpose) in a locked box, of which the President shall keep the key. Six Scrutators shall be appointed by the annual meeting, to whom shall be delivered the box and key, with which they shall retire into the Committee Room, and when they have cast up the votes, report the names of the Committee to the President, who shall then declare them duly elected. Should any person thus elected, refuse to take upon himself the appointment, he who has the next number of votes shall come in, of course, and the order of those who have an equal number of votes shall be determined by lot. And that the three Gentlemen next in rotation on the annual list of the Committee, be appointed Auditors of the Treasurer's accounts. The Scrutators shall be appointed in the following manner:—The names of all the Subscribers shall be put into a ballot box, and the President shall draw out the names, and the first six, who shall be present at the meeting, and willing to accept the office, shall be appointed thereto.

X.—If any Person deliver in a list of names for the choice of a Committee, with a forged signature, knowing it to be forged, the Person so presenting the same, shall forfeit his share in the Library, and be incapable of ever again becoming a Member of the Society.

XI.—The Committee, at their first Meeting shall elect a President, and also a Treasurer, and a Secretary, out of their number, by each of them producing, in writing, the names of the Persons he is desirous to have voted into those offices; and those Persons who have a majority of votes, shall be duly elected. If any vacancy should occur in the Committee, it shall be supplied as in the case of a person refusing to take upon him the appointment.

XII.—The Committee, for the time being, shall be empowered to take such Rooms as they shall think proper for the use of the Society, the expenses of which shall be paid out of the funds of the Institution.

XIII.—The Committee shall meet once every month in the Committee-Room, to transact the business of the Society, any four of whom, with the President or his Deputy, shall be competent to act; but if the President be absent, and have neglected to appoint a Deputy, the members present, if amounting to five in number, shall constitute a Committee, and have power to choose a President for the day.

XIV.—Every absent Member of the Committee, unless confined by sickness, or out of Town, shall be fined sixpence; if absent three times successively, except

for the reasons above mentioned, he shall lose his seat in the Committee; and for every time the President shall be absent (except for the above reasons) and neglect to appoint a Deputy, he shall be fined one shilling.

XV.—The President and Committee shall fix the time to be allowed for reading each particular book, which shall be written on a paper in the inside of the cover.

XVI.—The Committee shall have power to appoint the Bookseller to the Library, and to buy the books, where, and in what manner, they shall think most advantageous to the Subscribers; and also have power to fix the amount of fines for tearing or damaging any book.

XVII.—Any three of the Committee may order a pamphlet, not exceeding the value of five shillings, at any time between their stated meetings, on entering their names in a book to be kept for that purpose.

XVIII.—The Committee may order to be printed, as often as they shall think necessary, a Copy of the Laws, a List of the Subscribers, and a Catalogue of the books, which shall be sold to the Subscribers, and not paid for out of the general fund.

XIX.—The Committee may stop the circulation of such books, as (after admission) are discovered to have an immoral tendency.

XX.—The Committee may call a General Meeting of the Subscribers, whenever they shall judge it expedient.

XXI.—The Committee may shut up the Library, for the purpose of examining its state, whenever they shall think necessary.

#### PRESIDENT.

XXII.—The President, with another Member of the Committee, shall occasionally visit the Library, to inspect the Librarian's accounts, and to examine the state of the books, and shall report their observations to the Committee at their next Meeting.

XXIII.—The President, of his own authority, may order into the Library, once a month, any book he pleases, not exceeding the value of ten shillings.

XXIV.—The President may call an extraordinary meeting of the Committee, whenever he thinks necessary.

## TREASURER.

XXV.—All the Cash received by the Librarian, whether arising from subscriptions or forfeitures, shall be paid into the hands of the Treasurer.

XXVI.—The Annual Accounts shall be made up to the seventeenth day of November in each year.

## LIBRARIAN.

XXVII.—The Librarian shall be elected by the Society at large, at a General Meeting, and shall continue in office, without re-election, so long as it shall be agreeable to himself and the Society. He shall attend at the Library from the first of May to the first of September, from Nine to half-past one, and from three to eight o'clock; and the remainder of the year from ten to half-past one, and three to nine o'clock, every day, (Sundays excepted,) and for every book taken out before ten, or after eight, he shall be paid one-penny for his own use. He shall keep an accurate account of the Books, in whose hands they are, deliver them out, receive them in, and note the time; likewise receive the half-yearly subscriptions, and strictly enforce the payment of the fines; he shall also examine carefully the books when they are returned, and inform the Committee of any tearing or other damage they may have sustained, in order that proper fines may be imposed on those accounts. He shall inform the Subscribers when a General Meeting is to be held, and shall give notice to all the Members of the Committee, one day at least before each of their stated meetings. He shall not carry on the business of a Bookseller, nor hold any Ticket or Share in the Library; the duties of his office are to be performed in person, (except when he is unavoidably absent) and then by a competent Deputy to be approved by the Committee. In consideration of his trouble, he shall be paid such annual salary as shall be agreed upon at a General Meeting of the Subscribers.

XXVIII.—The Librarian shall keep a Book, in which he shall enter under its proper Head, the title of every book received into the Library.

## BOOKS, FINES, &amp;c.

XXIX.—Any Subscriber may propose what books he pleases, by entering the titles in a book kept for that purpose in the Library, which the Librarian shall lay before the Committee at their stated meetings, that the books so proposed may be voted for or against by ballot.

XXX.—The Subscribers may read the books in the Library-Room, during the hours of its being open. They shall be allowed to take out no more than one folio, or one quarto at a time;—but if an octavo or duodecimo, two volumes (if of

(the same work) provided they keep them only the time permitted for reading one. A Review may be taken out with any other book. Subscribers in the country may keep any book until the first Tuesday after the time allowed for reading it expires, and they shall be further privileged to take out three volumes of a set, of any size, except folios and quartos, of which they may take two volumes at one time, provided they keep them only the time permitted for reading one of them; and when any country Subscriber applies for a book which may not be in the Library at the time of such application, the Librarian be allowed, as soon as it is returned, to enter it in the applicant's name, and forward it at his risk and expense, provided such book have previously been nine months in circulation.—Whoever lends a book to any Person out of his own family, or receives one from any other Person than the Librarian, shall forfeit two shillings for every book so lent or received. If the time allowed for reading any book should expire on a Sunday, it shall be returned the day following. Whoever keeps any book, during the first year after its admission, longer than the time limited, shall be fined two-pence per day, and one-penny per day afterwards; but no fine shall exceed the value of the book. Should there be any dispute respecting the fines, it shall be determined by the Committee at their next meeting.

XXXI.—The half-yearly subscription, of six shillings and three-pence, shall be regularly paid on or before the first of January, and the first of July, in each year; and no Subscriber shall have a book from the Library until his subscription be paid. Whoever does not pay his subscription on or before the days above-mentioned, shall pay sixpence additional, and also sixpence per month for every month afterwards, that he shall continue in arrears.

XXXII.—If any Subscriber shall at any time suffer any other Person to procure books from the Library in his name, and not for his own use, or shall leave his subscription unpaid for one whole year, or refuse to pay the fines imposed upon him and confirmed, or shall refuse to return to the Library any books which may have been delivered to him, he shall forfeit his Property in the Library. No person shall have a book from the Library who refuses to pay his fines. A printed notice of the following form shall be sent to such Persons as apply for books before their fines are paid:—

*You are indebted to the Library*

*for*

*you are, therefore,*

*by the thirty-second law, not allowed to have another book till you have paid the fine above mentioned.*

XXXIII.—All the new books shall remain in the Library fourteen days, after which time they shall go into circulation. The Reviews and other Periodicals, shall lie fourteen days on the table, but any one of them may be taken out half an hour previous to the closing of the Library, provided it be sent in within half an hour after the opening of the Library on the following morning, in default, a fine of sixpence per day shall be levied. The Pamphlets and Reviews during the year in which they come out shall be covered with strong paper, and have their titles written on the covers; and all the books in the Library shall, at such times as the Committee may think proper, be half-bound, and cut, have strings in them, and be lettered on the back.

XXXIV.—Whoever applies first to the Library for any book, shall have it, and the rest in order, as they apply; if two or more apply at the same time, the dispute shall be determined by lot. No book within the first year of its circulation, shall be re-entered to the same person, till it has remained in the Library at least one week.

XXXV.—If any book be lost, the Person to whom it was delivered shall pay the full value of it; and if the book be one of a set, the Person who lost it shall take the remaining volumes, and provide a new set of equal value for the Library.

XXXVI.—Duplicates of works and such temporary publications as the Committee may judge proper to be disposed of, shall annually, in January and February, be parcelled out into lots, and exposed for sale in the Library Room to the highest bidder, among the Subscribers only; the bidding to be made in sealed notes, addressed to the Committee, for their acceptance at their next regular meeting; the lots not so disposed of may be sold afterwards in the same manner to Non-Subscribers. But no other description of books shall be sold, unless with the consent of two-thirds of the Members at their General Meeting.

XXXVII.—The Subscribers to this Library shall severally have the privilege of introducing a friend (not being a resident within ten miles of this town) to read in the Library Room, *gratis*, for one month, provided he enter his name and place of residence, and also his own name, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

XXXVIII.—The Committee shall be invested with the power of imposing a fine upon any Subscriber, who shall have been discovered to have written any thing which they may deem improper in the Order Book; the amount of the fine to be fixed by the Committee, which shall not, however, exceed the sum of two shillings and sixpence for one offence. The Order Book shall be kept in the custody of the Librarian, except when wanted by a Subscriber; who, when he has made the entry he wishes, shall return it to the Librarian.

XXXIX.—The Committee shall possess a discretionary power of imposing such fine as they may think proper upon, or suspending from the use of the Library until the subsequent General Meeting, any Member who may have disfigured, or otherwise injured any of the books, or other property belonging to the Library; and the General Meeting shall have the power of expelling any Member who may have been so suspended.

XL.—If any case occur that is not expressly provided for in these laws, it shall be determined by the Committee; and their transactions and determinations shall be recorded in a book kept by the Secretary.

XLI.—No motion, having for its object the Dissolution of this Society, shall be entertained except it be signed by at least fifty of the Subscribers, and hung up in the Library, according to law eighth; and in case of such notice being given, a printed copy thereof shall be sent to each Member, and the consent of at least five-sixths of the Members present at its discussion, shall be required to give it effect.

XLII.—The laws of the Society having been fairly engrossed on a stamped sheet of £1, every person possessing, or hereafter purchasing a share in the Institution, shall be required to sign his name to the following declaration at the foot thereof: and no person shall be considered a Member of the Society, or have any part or share in the Lyceum, or in the management thereof, who has not testified his consent to be governed by the Laws therein contained; and by such other laws as may from time to time be made, agreeably to the provisions of the eighth law.

#### FORM OF DECLARATION.

*We, the undersigned Proprietors of shares in the Lyceum, at Kingston-upon-Hull, do hereby testify our consent to the Laws herein contained, and our consent to be governed by them, and by such Laws as shall be hereafter made, agreeably to the forms provided in the eighth law, as witness our hands,*

XLIII.—The Society shall not consist of more than 300 Members.

#### ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

Each Subscriber may take out a volume for reference, not being of the same work as may at the time be entered to him in the Librarian's Books. One day shall be allowed for such volume; if not returned on the day after that on which it is taken out, he shall incur a fine of two-pence per day, if in the first year of its

circulation, and a penny per day afterwards, for as long as it may be kept, and such volume shall remain in the Library at least one day, before it can be re-entered to the same Person.

No Subscriber (either by himself, or his agent) shall be permitted to bring in any book or periodical for another Subscriber, and at the same time to take it out for himself, nor to bring in such book or periodical, on his own account, and to take it out for another Subscriber.

Any Volume of Reviews or Magazines may circulate for the same time, and on the same conditions as a single number of either.
