

The enrichment and public exposure of the City of Paris museum collections is a key priority of the policy of Paris Musées. The collections site launched in 2016 and constantly improved since then by Paris Musées puts digital reproductions of the works online and distributes them nationally and internationally.

The CC0 licence?

The Creative Commons Zero (CC0) licence allows the work to be copied, modified, distributed and represented, even for commercial purposes, without the need to request permission.

Paris Musées thus indicates that there are no copyright restrictions on the digital file representing works already in the public domain. This licence guarantees everyone unrestricted access and re-use of the digital files with no technical, legal or financial restrictions on the commercial or private use thereof.

This corpus thus includes the reproductions of a work the author(s) of which died more than 70 years ago, after which time his/her works have fallen into the public domain, and which is the reproduction of a two-dimensional cultural asset the author of which died more than 70 years ago, a reproduction created by a photographer who has permitted Paris Musées to place the photograph under a CC0 licence or by a photographer employed by Paris Musées.

What can I do with an image under CC0 licence?

- Download it in high definition (jpeg format/definition: 3000x3000 pixels/resolution: 300 dpi), without limitation.
- Process it for any purpose (non-commercial and commercial).

Paris Musées encourages users to send it any commercial or non-commercial products created with works under CC0 licence or inform it for the record of any re-use of its files:

What are my obligations in exchange for this provision?

- The photograph is assigned on a non-exclusive basis, i.e. it can be processed by any other third party.
- The photograph thus provided must remain under CC0 licence, so it is prohibited to sell the file,
- I alone am responsible for the re-use of the image and in that respect, I must duly observe the author's moral right to the work, and more particularly the latter's right to claim authorship. Paris Musées invites users to mention the title of the work and at least the name of its author as represented in the photograph, as well as Paris Musées and the name of the museum. This information is provided in a .txt file supplied with each downloaded work under CC0 licence.

How to access images under CC0 licence?

You can download images under CC0 licence directly on the sheet. If the "Download" button and the CC0 pictogram are not displayed, the image is not under CC0 licence.

The good-quality digital file is accompanied by a text file with the label of the work and a reminder of the applicable terms of use.
