SUBJECT: Requirements for Additional Refrigeration Construction

In compliance with letter, file AGMGEM 673, Subject: "Requirements for Additional Refrigeration Construction", Hqs Eighth Army, dated 27 September 1948, the following report is submitted.

1. Recommend the construction of a cold storage unit at Ogaki City, Gifu Prefecture, by the Ogaki Fish, Shell and Vegetable Receiving Company. Estimated cost of construction ¥4,000,000, freezing capacity 12.5 metric tons, and storage capacity 16.5 metric tons.
2. If approved, this cold storage unit will furnish fish freezing facilities for Ogaki City and the five surrounding guns. Although there are two cold storage plants with a total capacity of 120 metric tons in Ogaki City, there is no plant with facilities for freezing fish.
3. The fresh fish allocation for Ogaki City and surrounding territory is 21,000 kan per month. This amount was exceeded in September 1948. On an average fish is received ten times per month, and during the summer months it was necessary to ship about three tons of ice daily from Gifu City to re-ice fresh fish before distribution to the retailers. If fresh fish were frozen upon arrival and prior to being shipped to retailers, spoilage would be cut considerably and consumers would get a better grade of fish.
4. The above-mentioned company has funds available to cover the cost of construction of this proposed cold storage plant.

SUBJECT: Maintenance and Minor Construction for Isolated Units

TO : Military Government Officer, I Corps, APO 301

1. During a recent joint inspection by the addressee and the undersigned of Military Government Team installations and by the undersigned of CIC installations, it became apparent that some responsible personnel were not clear as to the procedures and authorities with respect to securing repairs and minor construction. This communication is intended to clarify and codify the applicable provisions of existing official directives.

2. Memorandum No. 45, Hqs I Corps, 3 June 1947, and Annex No 4 to Administrative Order No 25, Hqs I Corps, 25 Aug 47, assign the responsibilities for repair and construction.

3. Repairs:

a. Each Regional Post Engineer is responsible for repairs and maintenance for all Ground Force units within his region. All requests for repair should consequently be directed to the proper Regional Post Engineer.

b. Repairs include all work necessary to keep an installation or facility up to the standard it was in when originally constructed or procured including repainting (subject to restrictions listed in paragraph 7a below) and replacement of otherwise unrepairable items.

c. There is no cost limit on repairs, provided only that the repair is necessary to bring an existing installation or item up to its original standard. Post Engineers have repair budgets for their regions, but have orders from higher headquarters to continue necessary maintenance and repairs even though the budget is necessarily exceeded. As a guide, but not as a cost limit, repairs should not exceed 3% per year of the original cost of the installation.

d. Any new work or new construction which costs less than \$200 is charged against repair funds and not against construction funds. Thus all requests for small jobs involving alterations, additions, changes, improvements, etc, should be directed to the Post Engineer and the work performed out of repair funds.

4. Minor Construction:

a. Minor construction consists of all projects estimated to cost more than \$200 but less than \$5,000 involving either original construction, reconstruction of an existing facility, or any additions, alterations, improvements, betterments, or changes to an existing facility.

b. Post Engineers hold the necessary procurement demands to perform minor construction but are not adequately staffed at present to exercise supervision at locations distant from their offices. The responsibility for minor construction for all non-divisional units in Kyushu has therefore been assigned to the 1st Engr Cons Gp and for all non-divisional units within the I Corps zone on Honshu to the 4th Engr Cons Gp. All requests for minor construction should be directed to these units.

5. Major Construction:

Major construction is any construction, otherwise defined identically to minor construction in the preceding paragraph, whose estimated cost is greater than \$5,000. All such construction projects must be submitted to GHQ FEC for approval as prescribed by Cir 9, GHQ FEC, 10 Mar 48. The 1st and 4th Engr Cons Gp have the same responsibility for major construction as for minor construction. Rehabilitation of procured Japanese housing for use as dependent housing is processed as major construction.

6. The minor construction budget has been progressively reduced by higher headquarters until it has become extremely limited. As a result, all items which are properly chargeable to repair funds are being eliminated from all project requests for minor construction still awaiting authorization. Request should be made by the unit to the Post Engineer for performance of repair items so eliminated and future requests for minor construction should not include items which are properly considered as repairs. Units should make immediate requests on the Post Engineers for repairs as soon as the need therefor becomes evident.

7. Certain very rigid restrictions have been placed by GHQ on all construction. The majority of these are covered by GHQ Cir 9 referred

to above. Others are contained in various messageforms. Some of the commonest restrictions will be mentioned herein for your ready information.

a. Oil base paints will be used on troop housing interiors only for hospitals, dispensaries, prophylactic stations, kitchens, and mess halls; on dependent housing interiors only for bathrooms, kitchens, baseboards, windows and window frames, and door frames. For exteriors it may be used only to protect exposed metal surfaces or to protect exposed wood trim, such as window and door frames.

b. Central steam heating plants will not be installed or rehabilitated, except for dependent housing communities, south of the 38° parallel of latitude or south of the 36° parallel of latitude in the section of Honshu west of the crest of the central mountain range.

c. Hardwood flooring is authorized for use only in dependent housing and in recreational facilities such as gymnasiums and dance and stage floors in approved clubs. Its use is excluded in troop housing and operational buildings.

d. Linoleum:

Linoleum is authorized only for hospitals, dispensaries, public buildings, and dependent housing kitchens.

e. Minor construction funds cannot be used to accomplish modifications, additions, or betterments to permanent dependent housing facilities without prior approval of Headquarters Eighth Army. The effect of this is to limit changes to dependent housing to \$200 per house, chargeable to repair funds, as a normal procedure.

1. Reference is Operational Directive 55 for 1947, Headquarters Eighth Army, 13 August 1947, subject: "Building Policies of the Japanese Government."

2. The following information is forwarded for distribution to all military government units in your area:

a. Inclosure 1 - Allocation of sheet glass by prefecture for the fourth quarter of the Japanese Fiscal Year 1947.

b. Inclosure 2 - Sheet glass allocation instructions to local agencies from the Board of Reconstruction.

3. Sheet glass, which is in a critically short supply, is often diverted to black market channels or hoarded locally. Home builders is particular occasionally report that they do not receive sheet glass allocation from the local office of the Board of Construction. The inclosed information may be of value to the military government teams in exercising surveillance over the building programs in their respective areas.

BOARD OF RECONSTRUCTION
INSTRUCTION TO LOCAL AGENCIES**

Changes in allocations can be made only when quantities allocated are larger than requirements for any particular category.

Redistribution of such excess must be done according to the following priorities:

1. Educational and Welfare Institutions. (new construction and repair)
2. Residences. (new construction)
3. Residences (repair) and all other buildings.

A report must be made of the final, actual, allocation and reasons for changes certified by responsible official.

No ticket shall be issued for a new building until it is ready to have glass installed. Tickets for a particular building may be reserved by the local agency.

Definitions of categories

Educational Institutions

Primary schools, high schools, colleges, universities, academies, research laboratories, vocational guidance agencies, museums, libraries, art galleries, churches, temples, etc.

Welfare Institutions

Ordinary hospitals, maternity hospitals and child welfare centers, isolation hospitals, sanitariums, hygienic laboratories, orphanages, poor houses, homeless and repatriation centers, public bathhouses, crematoriums.

Residences

Small dwellings and dwellings combined with small stores and home factories and offices.

Transportation and Telecommunication

Station buildings for railway, bus and boat. Service stations on platforms, factories and repair shops, dockyards, warehouses, post, telephone and broadcasting offices.

Mining and Oil Refining

Power and watch houses, factories, laboratories, welfare and recreation buildings (dining halls, bathhouses).

Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing

Factories, offices, laboratories and warehouses, for handling and processing of agricultural, fishing and forestry products.

Industry

For all other industries including electric power, gas, tobacco, etc.

Factories, powerhouses, offices, watchhouses, laboratories, warehouses, welfare and recreation buildings.

Government offices

National, prefectural and local, including Diet buildings, police stations, fire brigade nations, prisons, reformatories, weather bureaus, lighthouses, etc.

Private Offices

Banks, insurance companies, commercial offices, water, gas and electric supply bureaus, etc.

Others

Theatres, music halls, restaurants, stores, barbershops, etc.

Message Form, Headquarters Eighth Army, AG 600.1 26 November 1947,
subject: "Construction and Rehabilitation in Japan."

2. The primary purpose of the above reference was to limit construction activities in Japanese Fiscal Year 1948 to a small program. To implement this it was directed in paragraph 5a of inclosure to the reference that authorities for construction which had not been translated into procurement demands by a specified series of dates would expire as specified.

3. Because of the flexibility of construction and real estate procurement demands, it is possible by interpretation of such demands to continue work after the original purpose has been met. For example, a procurement demand for the rehabilitation of a building has been used as a basis for rehabilitating it two or three times in accordance with new uses.

4. To eliminate such practices, it is desired that the following procedures be inaugurated:

a. Outstanding procurement demands for construction and rehabilitation to be phased out on the following schedule:

- (1) All outstanding construction and rehabilitation procurement demands issued prior to 30 June 1947 to be terminated 31 March 1948.
- (2) All outstanding construction and rehabilitation procurement demands issued prior to 30 September 1947 to be terminated 30 June 1948.

- (3) All outstanding construction and rehabilitation procurement demands issued prior to 31 December 1947 to be terminated 30 September 1948.
- (4) All outstanding construction and rehabilitation procurement demands issued prior to 1 March 1948 to be terminated 31 December 1948.

b. Procurement demands for construction and rehabilitation issued on or about 1 March 1948 to have a limiting date written into the procurement demand, beyond which date no work may be done. The Receiving Officer must submit timely request for renewal if desired work has not been completed by the limiting date.

c. No obligations to be made by any Japanese contractor against a Japanese Government to be directed on each procurement demand and the Payment for expenditures for any obligations incurred subsequent to the designated termination date of a procurement demand. In the event it appears that the authorized work and obligation necessary thereto cannot be consummated prior to the date set for termination of a procurement demand, application to be made by the Receiving Officers to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, in adequate time to permit the issuance of an extension of the termination date of the procurement demand.

5. In all cases of violations of the provisions of this message form, inquiry is to be made into the circumstances with a view to fixing the responsibility for such violations.

6. Continuing procurement demands, written in conformity with current instructions for the issuance of continuing procurement demands, such as for utilities services, are not affected by this directive.

7. Request for renewal where desired work has not been completed will be forwarded to this headquarters so as to arrive prior to the following dates:

- a. 20 March 1948 for procurement demands described in paragraph 4 a (1) above. Radio requests will be acceptable for this group only.
- b. 15 May 1948 for procurement demands described in paragraph 4 a (2) above.
- c. 15 August 1948 for procurement demands described in paragraph 4 a (3) above.
- d. 15 November 1948 for procurement demands described in paragraph 4 a (4) above.

1. Reference: Operational Directive Number 55, Headquarters Eighth Army, subject: "Building Policies of the Japanese Government", dated 13 August 1947.

2. The following, which is to clarify paragraphs 2 and 3 of referenced Operational Directive, is furnished for your information:

a. Reference paragraph 3.a. and 3.(2) of O.D. 55: The Japanese Government Urban Construction Law of 1919 and Imperial Ordinance No. 288, dated 29 May 1946, which placed responsibility of issuance of building permits upon the governor, were superseded by Cabinet Ordinance Number 6. In any instance, whether a building is approved by the prefectural governor or not, a permit must be secured from the local Board of Reconstruction Office (Art. 2) which is not under the jurisdiction of the prefectural governor but is responsible only to the Board of Reconstruction of the Central Japanese Government.

b. Reference paragraph 2.d. of O.D. 55: According to the policy of the Board of Reconstruction, building construction authorized under permits issued prior to 8 February 1947 may be completed, regardless of the nature of the intended use if construction was fifty percent (50%) or more completed as of 8 February 1947. Buildings that were less than fifty percent (50%) completed as of that date or those for which permits were issued but whose actual construction had not commenced were subject to review by the local Board of Reconstruction under criteria set up by Cabinet Ordinance Number 6. The old permits were cancelled or renewed accordingly.

c. Reference paragraph 3.e.(3) of O.D. 55: Subsequent changes in the use of a structure by the owner after completion require the approval of the Board of Reconstruction as follows:


- (1) If the contemplated change is from one essential use to another, the local Board of Reconstruction renders the decision.
- (2) If the contemplated change is from an essential use to a non-essential one the central Board of Reconstruction renders the final decision.

d. Reference paragraph 3.b. of O.D. 55: Contrary to the belief of some Japanese local officials the construction of small shops is not recognized by the Japanese government as being legal, and requires building permits like any other building.

e. According to the present policy of the Board there is no objection to the construction of small combined houses and shops, but such permission should be included in the original permit.

3. SCAP has instructed the central Board of Reconstruction to once again clarify policies with the local branches. Reports received by this headquarters indicate that local offices are aware of the regulations, but in some cases purposely disregard them. It is expected that continued surveillance by military government units as directed in paragraph 6 of referenced Operational Directive will minimize the malpractices on the part of Japanese officials.

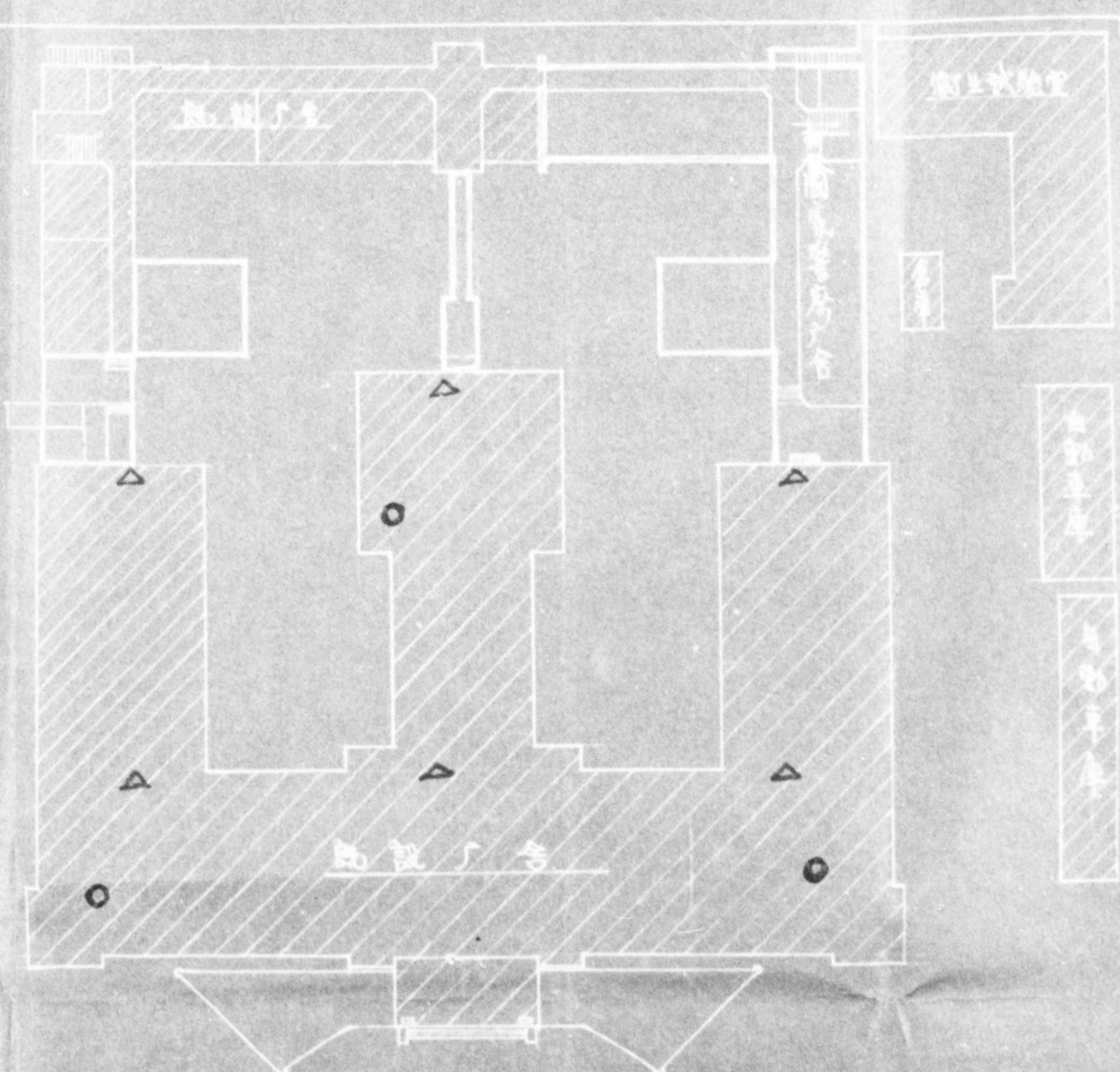

In response to your request which you made concerning the subject matter with "Sho" No. 22 Extra, we should like to submit you the report as follows.

Accounts:

Matters demanded such as fire fighting facilities, etc.

1. Wells in and outside the Prefectural Office provided for emergencies:

- (1) It is desired that the garage will be removed for the well which is to the south-east of the entrance, i.e., in the garage itself.
- (2) It is desired that the well at the corner to the south-west of the entrance will be kept as it is of service for the purpose.
- (3) Two wells at the back of the old pref. office building:
- (4) One to the north-east of the new building of the pref. office:
- (5) One to the north-west of the new building, that is, in the Inaba Local Office:

These four mentioned above in (3), (4) and (5) can be made use of according to the extent of fires, so they are desired to be kept as reserve ones.

(6) It is desired that two wells will be newly installed, one at the corner to the north-east, and the other at the corner to the north-west, of the prefectural office, i.e., the corners on the street of Ibuki-cho at the back of the "Kencho"

2. Revival or new-establishment of private fire-plugs:

(1) It is desired that there will be new further installation of two water-tanks on the top of the prefectural office building to strengthen the power of fighting as the head-waters for fire-plugs.

(2) It is desired that in the old building, 6 water-plugs on the 1st floor and the same number both on the 2nd and 3rd floors will be newly installed.

(3) In the new building (wooden-one), new fire-plugs are desired to be installed respectively at eight places both on the first and third floors.

3. Places of garbage burning and water boiling to be newly installed in the Kencho.

(1) It is desired that the garbage dump capable of burning at a time all garbage and rubbish lumped together in the pref. office will be installed.

(2) It is desirable to remove the existing "Water-Boiling Room" situated in the gov't. building to other building in order to ensure the prudential measures for protection of fire.

4. Installation of fire-alarms, etc. in the gov't. building.

(1) It is desirable to install an emergency siren and bell, etc.

(2) It is desirable to clearly show the entrances to the gov't. building for fire-men, providing against an occurrence of fire after the closing hour or at night.

5. Responsible person and inspection of fire protection.

(1) It is desirable to appoint responsible persons for prevention of fire and to make him take precaution against fire.

(2) It is desirable to increase the number of persons on duty and make them strictly inspect the hazard of fire.

6. Providing fire-walls.

It is desirable to install fire-walls on the boundary between the existing government building and newly-built wooden gov't. building.

7. Construction of the warehouse for the gasoline, etc. for automobiles and providing of fire-fighting equipments against the dangerous objects.

Now drum cans containing gasoline are piled up, not being covered at all. Therefore, it is desirable to construct a warehouse for them and furnish the perfect fire-fighting equipments for them.

8. Furnishing refuging equipments.

It is desirable to furnish refuging equipments for the buildings of above 2 stories.

1. (1) Remodel the garage so that a
fire-engine may approach.

(5) As it was formerly the well for

5. 1. In each section the responsible person for fire prevention has respectively been designated to take the prudential measures for prevention of fire.

2. We are planning to add three persons to the present fixed number of the guards to make the inspection in the gov't. building more strict., .

6. Fire-walls.

6. Now the iron-doors are installed in the corridors so as to separates each part in the gov't building.

As to installation of fire-walls all over the gov't. building we will include a budget, estimate to carry out such works.

7. Construction of the warehouse for the gasoline, etc, for automobiles and providing of the fire-fighting equipments for the dangerous objects.

7. Selecting the fittable place, we will construct the facilities to store all gasolines now kept in the gov't. building.

The authority which this headquarters has had, and which has been delegated to you, to approve construction projects under \$5,000 in cost is being withdrawn effective 1 April 1949. After that date all such projects between \$500 and \$5,000 in estimated cost must be sent to General Headquarters for approval.

As indicated in my letter of 19 January, General Headquarters considers that the essential needs of the Occupation Forces have been met and that such additional construction requirements which may arise will be mainly because of changing strategic conditions. For this reason, the number of so called minor construction projects (those below \$5,000) should be very drastically reduced from what has been approved during the past year. Projects will not be approved unless they can be undeniably justified and no other alternative is available to you.

In order that this headquarters will not be burdened with many requests which cannot be favorably considered for recommendation to General Headquarters, I request that you personally review and sign all projects submitted for approval. In your absence, a designated officer may sign for you.

The austere basis on which we are now operating must be brought to the attention of all of your subordinate commanders so that only those projects which are absolutely essential will be processed. I am sure that this will save much time on the part of many personnel.

1. The following information regarding possible violation of Section IV, Circular 81, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 5 November 1948, is forwarded for your information and any action deemed necessary.

2. Surveillance conducted by this headquarters of the Japanese government's enforcement of construction regulations disclosed a western style house located at 8-chome, Kanazono-cho, Gifu City and constructed by Terajima Gumi K.K. without a building permit. This constitutes a violation of Japanese law by the contractor.

3. Interview with Mr. Terajima, the president of the company, disclosed the following information:

a. The house was built, admittedly without proper permit, for a civilian employee of the 24th Infantry Regiment named John Travis. Mr. Terajima states the understanding was that the land and house would be sold to Travis on an easy payment plan. No payment has been made as yet, since the cost of the building has not been determined. Negotiations are carried out thru Michiko Minami, Travis' Japanese wife.

b. The house was completed 5 January 1949 and occupied by Travis on that date.

3. Other contractors in the Gifu area have reported efforts by occupation force personnel to have homes constructed for them. It is recommended that the provisions of Section IV, Circular No. 81, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 5 November 1948, be brought to the attention of all members of your command.

1. Attached hereto are plans and bills of materials for the proposed construction of a BOQ at the Enlisted Mens compound Kano Camp Gifu City, Gifu Prefecture.

2. These plans were made by the regional engineer on request of the undersigned. During the process of completing these plans the procurement system has changed necessitating the return of them to this Hqs for resubmission to a proper Headquarters.

3. During this same period the situation which motivated the original idea of moving the location of the BOQ has also changed. The history of this contemplated change is as follows:

a. About the 15th November 47, Col Devine stated that I was to take over the Gifu Team and that he was desirous that I make plans to get out of the present BOQ, the present MG Offices in the Kencho and the Cormorant Fishing business. These first two installations to be moved to the EM compound.

b. From the 15th November 47 to the Corps Commanders visit on the 18th March 48 necessary steps had been taken to (1) transfer the receiving office on cormorant boats from MG to the 24th Inf. Regt. (2) make arrangements for all non official guest to stay at the 24th Inf hotel. (3) Submitted a request for a PD for additional office space in the Kencho. (4) Submitted tentative sketch to regional engineer for conversion of vacant buildings at Kano Camp to a BOQ.

c. The Corp Commander on his visit approved the plan to stay in the Kencho but desired the plans, for a new BOQ, be submitted for further consideration as to cost.



- d. Formal work requests were submitted to regional engineer on the 30th March 48.
- e. On 21 May 48 received blue prints on BOQ from Regional Engineer for final check and approval. Several changes were recommended.
- f. On the 26 August 48 the Corps Commander again visited the team and inquired about the status of the BOQ.
- g. About the 2 September 48 I made inquire from Regional Engineer as to whereabouts of the plans.
- h. On the 5th September 48 received completed plans and bills of material with attached instructions.
4. It is believed that the main reason for vacating the BOQ was to get away from the probability of having to billet and entertain many guest during the cormorant fishing season to the detriment of MG activities. This was apparently based on experiences of the summer of 1947.
5. All necessary steps were taken so that a repetition of deficiencies experienced during the previous summer did not occur: A minimum of guest were accomodated this summer and no time or effort was expended on arrangements for boats etc.
6. It is felt that the key reason for the change has definately passed and that proper action has, and will continue to be taken to occupy the BOQ as a billet and not as a hotel. In my opinion the expenditure of funds, estimated at \$8,500 to reconvert present buildings into a BOQ would not be justified.
7. In veiw of the above it is recommended that the present BOQ be retained and that the buildings contemplated for conversion into a new BOQ be allowed to remain as they are at present, a EM Club.


