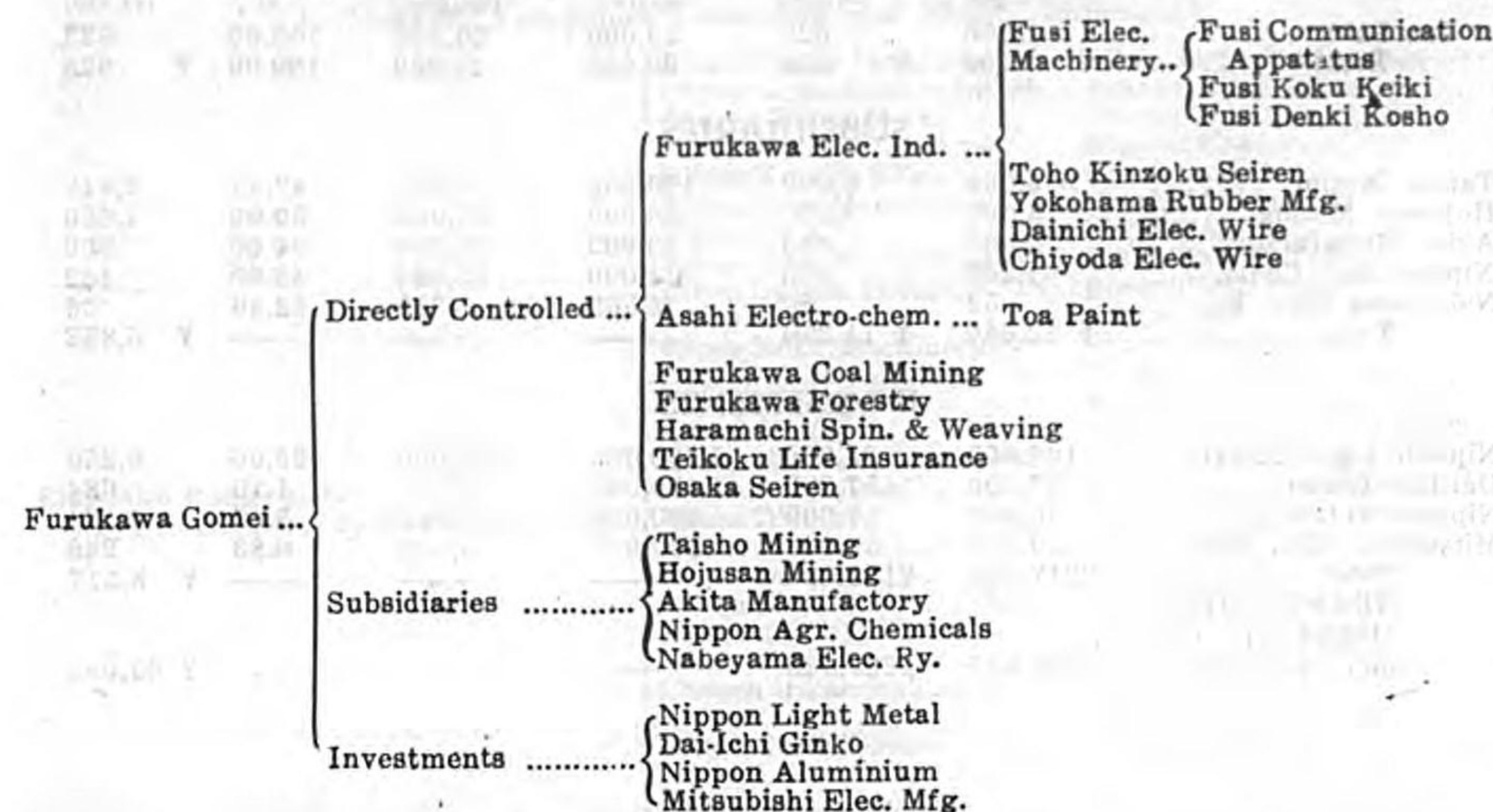

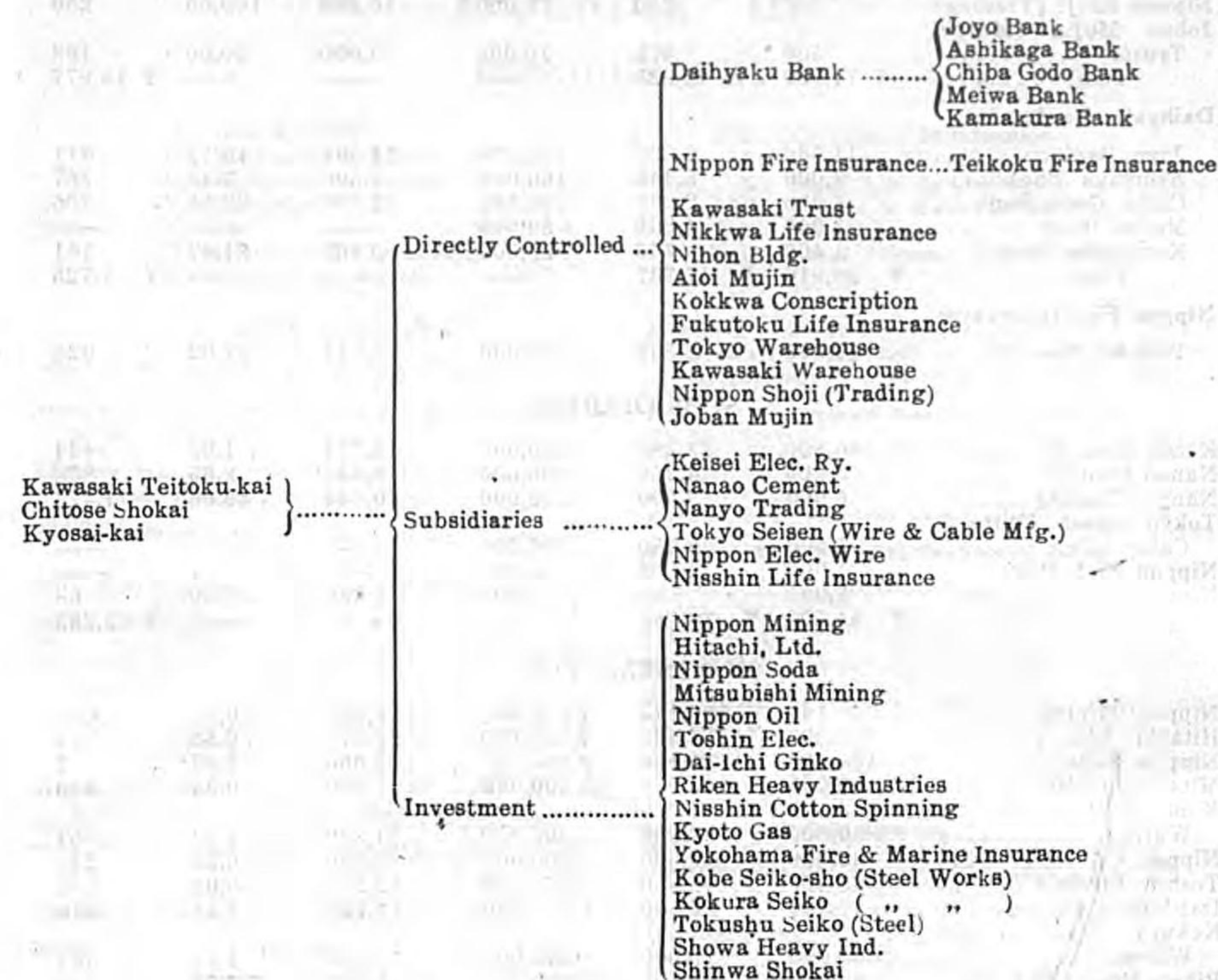

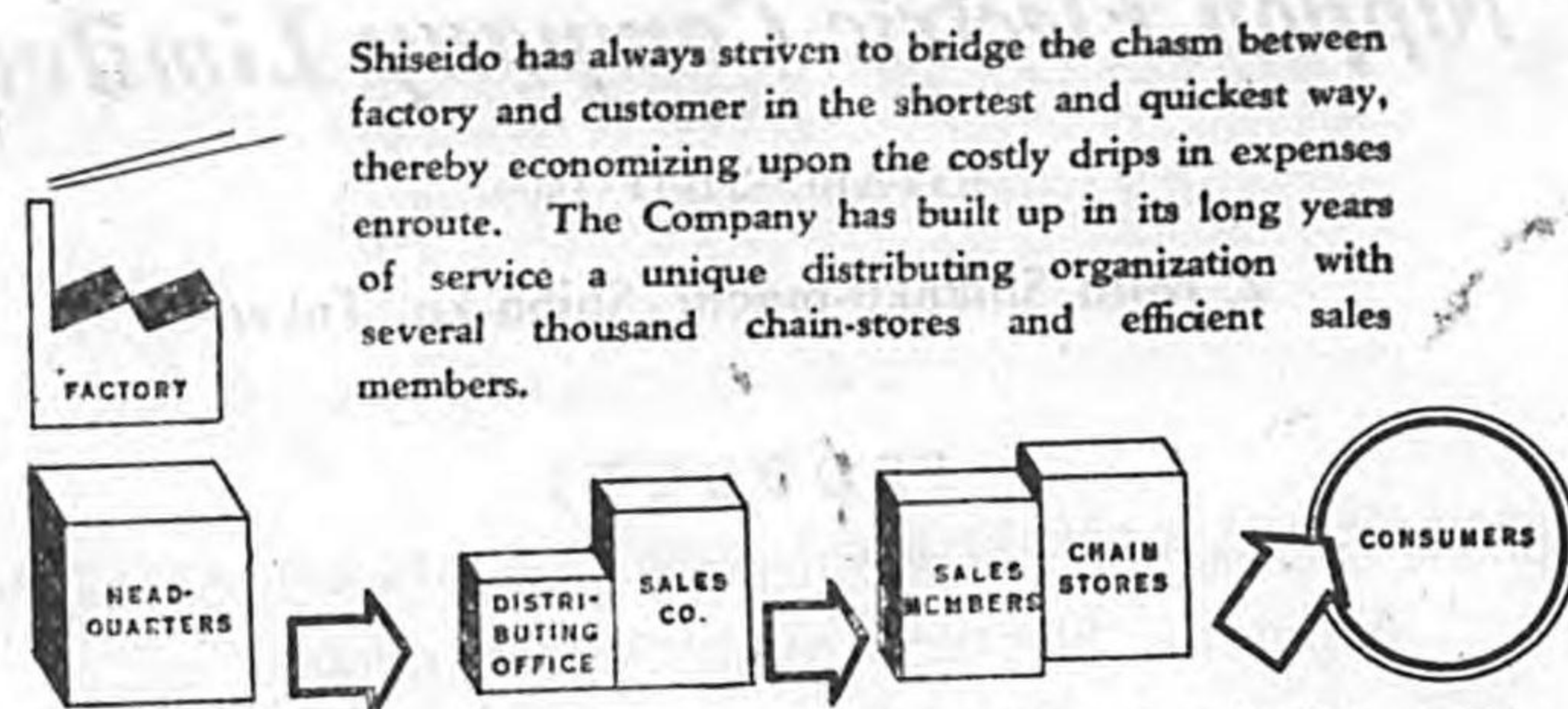


Diagram illustrates Shiseido's modern, cost-saving distributing system.

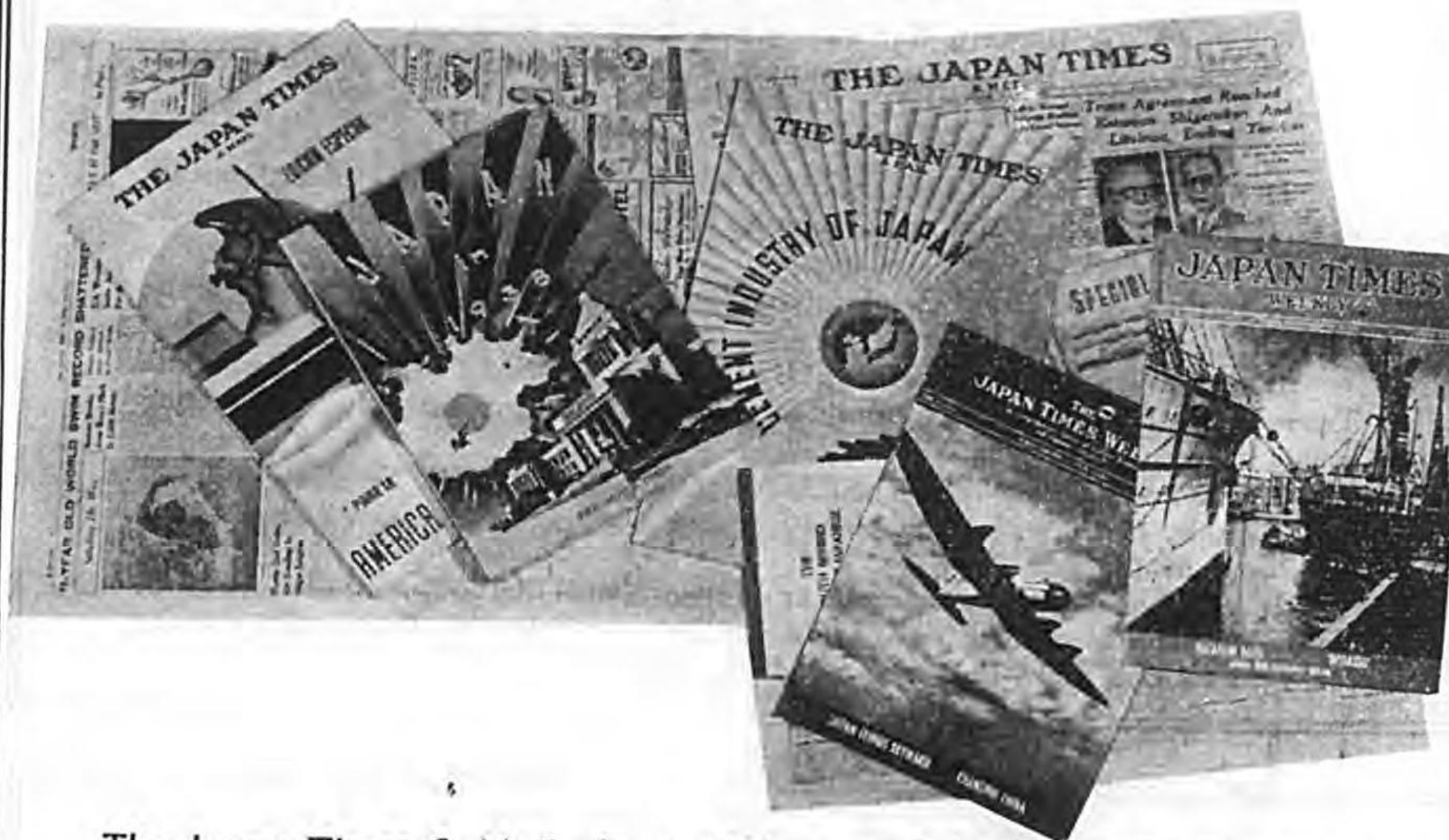
